India's Army Forced To Act as Policemen

By MYLON BELKIND

NEW DELHI (AP) — The Indian army, aloof from politics since independence 23 years ago, has become a second party in a controversy that could have serious repercussions on the world's largest democracy.

Traditionally, the army's one objective is to crush political violence and guard against external attack.

Increasingly, however, it has been given new and important tasks. It has been used to help maintain law and order, to suppress political disturbances, according to an official report to Parliament.

Its most notable domestic intervention occurred last September when police forces in Bihar were unable to control rioting between Hindus and Moslems. Normal conditions were restored only after the troops arrived.

Similarly, the army was called out to help maintain law and order in the northern state of Jammu and Kashmir following Prime Minister Indira Gandhi's announcement that the state would lose control of the disputed city of Chandernagore, which was given exclusively to the Punjab.

The army chief of staff, Gen. S.H.P.J. Manekshaw, says the police have the duty to suppress civil disturbances and that they should be fully utilized for this purpose, with the army to be called out only rarely.

One of India's most distinguished editors, Frank Moraes, says the Indian army is a threat to the fabric of civil government.

"Delegation of authority, however temporary, by a civilian government to the army is calculated to create a dangerous habit of mind and action," he wrote. "If resorted to often, it degrades the notion of civilian government and may finally erode it."

The spurring of army involvement in domestic affairs coincides with the gradual disintegration of the Congress party, which on the national and state levels without any serious challenge until 1967. Since then, opposition parties have gained power in several states and Mrs. Gandhi has lost her majority in Parliament.

The result has been increasing political instability, especially on the state level, which has contributed to public discontent with politicians and an erosion of respect for civil authority.

New Norwich Hospital Program Unorthodox Help for Area Drug Addicts

By JUNE LINTON (Herald Reporter)

The need for an effective program to treat drug addicts was underscored in a particularly depressing session in Tolland County Superior Court last Friday. An 18-year-old boy had pleaded guilty to breaking and entering and his counsel requested that he be sent for treatment to Norwich State Hospital because he had been found to be a drug dependent.

He said the drug addict had been considered as being outside the usual governing ordinary human behavior, and commented, "We didn't believe that was true. It's a one-to-one basis, adding up to just a few hours a week. Now under the program, it's continuous, a part of every hour and he added, 'They have free time in a day to assimilate what's happened, 'to get their heads back together.'"

Withdrawal 10 Days Valance House takes up part of the alcoholic unit in Mitchell Hall and includes two separate programs. Alan Taylor, social worker on the program, explained that the detoxification ward is downstairs and is the first stop for drug addicts, some sent by the court, others admitted voluntarily or in an emergency.

Here the addict is withdrawn from his habit, a process which, according to Taylor, takes about 10 days. It is a locked ward. "We're pretty much security conscious down there," Taylor said, because at this stage the addicts are sick. He said it is not too difficult to get them physically withdrawn; not pleasant but with medication, it's not too drastic." He said it was "similar to a case of the flu. The problem is the withdrawal, starts when withdrawal ends. Changing attitudes takes a long time."

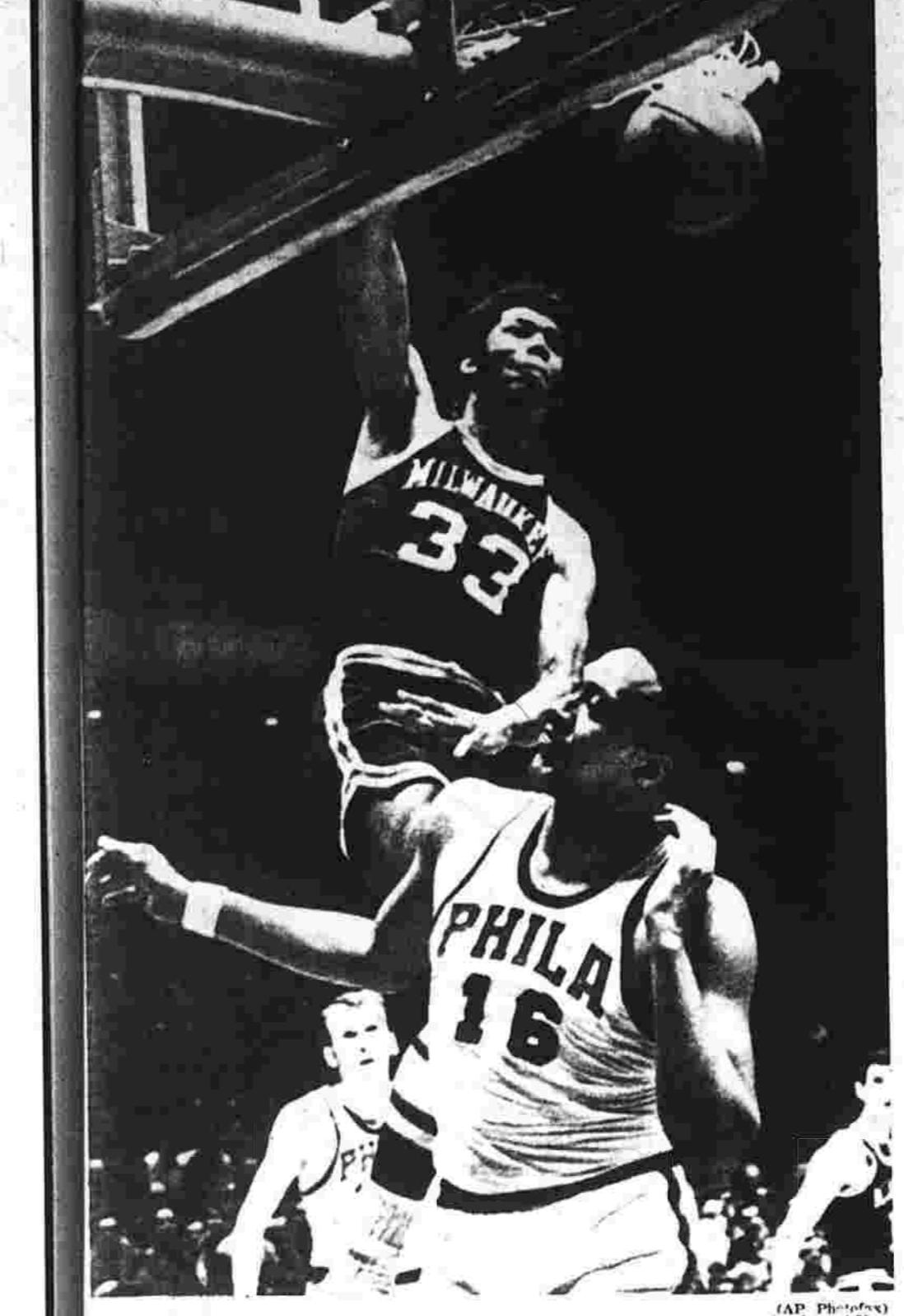
