Motion to Suspend Yale Classes Vetoed

The first resolution was defeated on a vote of 150 to 117. However, Law School Dean Louis Folsom indicated there would be no penalties imposed on students who cut classes this week.

"I think our sense of professional responsibility will lead us to continue to offer classes to those students who see some professional accommodations attending classes," Folsom said.

"At the same time, we would hope that students who feel there are more important things to do professionally than attend our classes would do so."

The law school is thus in much the same position as Yale College Monday about how "selective" the school should be during the decision to attend or not to attend classes this week.

The resolution that was approved by the law students Monday called for the suspension of the right of the New Haven Panther defendants to receive a fair trial.

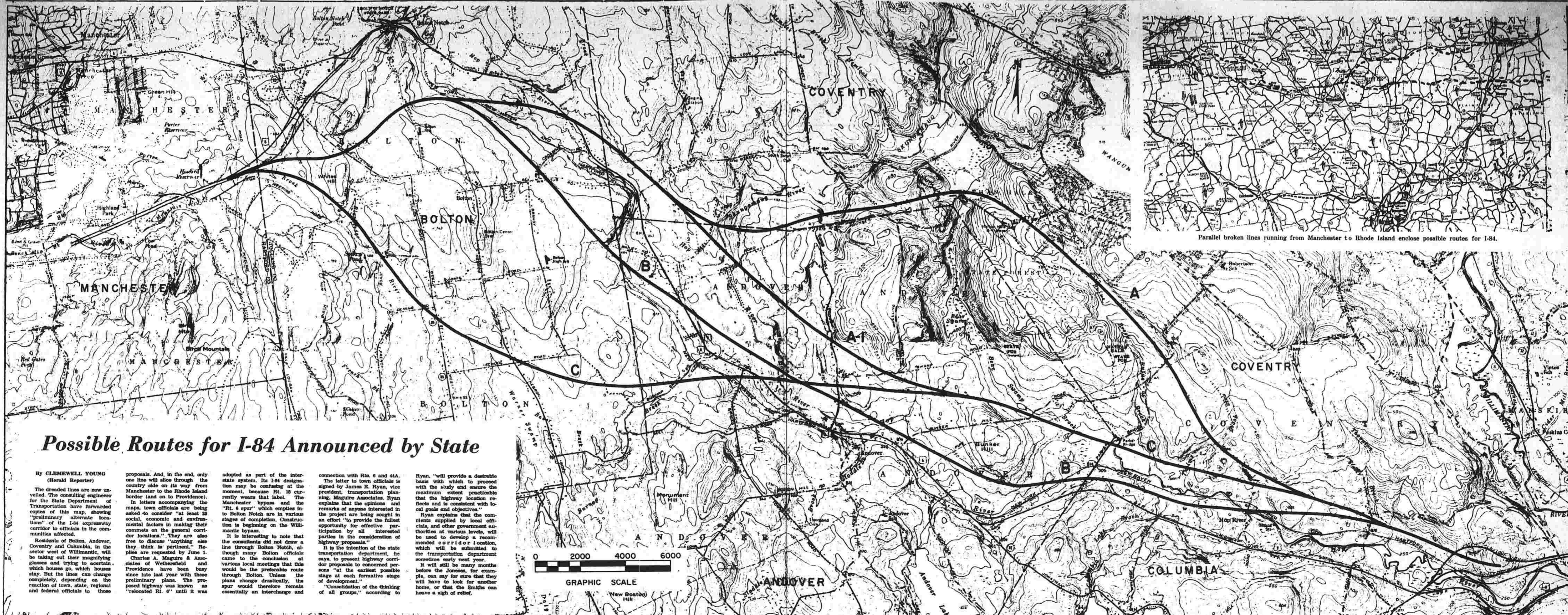

The dashed lines are now unveiled. The consulting engineer for the State Department of Transportation has forwarded copies of this map, showing preliminary alternate locations of the 1-84 bypass route to officials in the communities affected.

Residents of Bolton, Andover, Coventry and Columbia, in the sector west of Williamsfield, are taking out their magnifying glasses and trying to ascertain which houses are within the proposed route. The lines are completely opening, the reaction of town, state, regional and federal officials to those

proposals. And, in the end, only one line will slice through the country side on its way from Manchester to the Rhode Island border (and on to Providence).

In letters accompanying the maps, town officials are being asked to indicate the preferred route. The lines are being drawn in stages of completion. Construction is beginning on the Williamsfield bypass.

It is interesting to note that the consultants did not draw a line through Bolton Notch, although many Bolton officials came to the conclusion at various local meetings that this would be the preferable route through Bolton. Unless the spur would therefore remain essentially an interchange and connection with Rte. 8 and 44A.

The letter to town officials is by James R. Ryan, vice president, transportation planning, Maguire Associates. Ryan explains that the optimum route of the bypass is being sought in an effort "to provide the fullest opportunity for effective participation by all interested parties in the consideration of highway proposals."

It is the intention of the state transportation department, Ryan says, to present highway corridor proposals to concerned parties in the form of a "study" at each formative stage of development. "Consolidation of the thinking of all groups," according to Ryan, "will provide a desirable basis with which to proceed with the study and ensure the maximum extent practicable that the highway location reflects and is consistent with local goals and objectives."

It will still be many months before the routes are available, Ryan says, but he is confident that the study will be completed by the end of the year.
