"THE WAY I HEARD IT" by John Gruber

I received a letter the other day asking me about the composer Berlioz. Just how he rates, how he fits into the scheme of things. This I can understand. His name pops up regularly on concert programs, and you get all sorts of reports as to his greatness or lack of it as a composer.

Personally, I think Berlioz far more important for his influence on other composers than for his own work. Although they can be very impressive if you listen to them bearing in mind the period in which they were written, he is definitely one of France's great composers in his own right, yet only enough to make his most important work not a piece of music at all, but a legacy to other composers.

Hector Berlioz was born near Lyons in 1803, the son of a physician who expected him to follow that profession. He was musical and didn't get out of medicine, so his father practically disowned him, and Berlioz, who had been sent to Paris to study medicine, wound up in an opera chorus to support himself at age 18.

While most French composers have made their mark in opera, and Berlioz got some experience at first hand, he is best known for his symphonies. He wrote a two-volume book of "Memories" which has wonderful bits of French. It is often compared to the Autobiography of Franz Liszt. Berlioz never seen a translation of it, and I suspect it is long since out of print, but it gives you some insight into the workings of a musician's mind, and it also contains some excellent analyses of the music of Berlioz, Gluck, and Weber. Mostly, the "Memories" are in the form of letters to musically sophisticated correspondents.

Economic Mythology Of the 60's Exploded

By JOHN CUNIFF AP Business Analyst NEW YORK (AP) — From this chronological viewpoint, less than five months steps into the 1970s, some widely held notions of the Soaring Sixties seem very worn and aged, as if they belonged farther back in history.

Great economic strides were made in the '60s, so large that there often was little time for reflection. Now the economy is taking baby steps, if it is moving at all.

The economy slowed. Profits slipped, investors wavered if the system was fact or myth. They sold. The shares of conglomerates dropped in price. No longer did they have the funds to buy other companies.

Unable to continue expanding geometrically, the conglomerates were forced to concede that, for the time being, two and two didn't equal five after all.

This year one of the premier conglomerates, James Long of Ling-Temco-Vought, reported that his company was running a deficit. The stock, which had been as high as \$135 1/2 in the past couple of years, is now down to \$14.37.

Mutual Fund Miracles—When the stock market was booming, some mutual funds, particularly new ones, showed tremendous gains. There was euphoric feeling in the market place for several years, and the funds rode this soaring optimism.

Investing in so-called glamor stocks, some of the funds reported asset gains of better than 50 per cent in one year. Money poured into their coffers, and the funds grew to enormous, sometimes billion-dollar size.

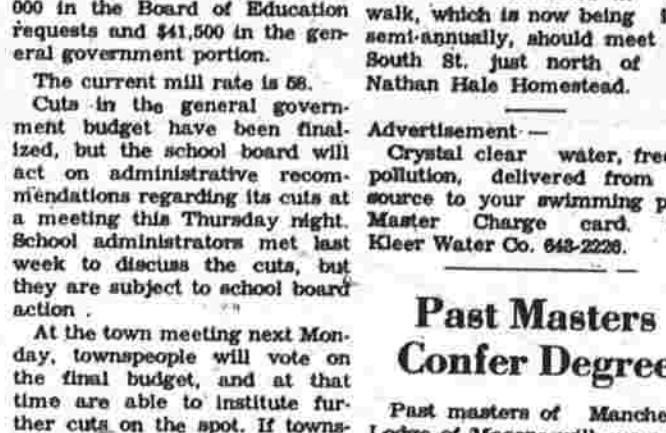

New England Panel Asks Funds to Expand Economy

WASHINGTON (AP) — The New England Regional Commission has asked for an additional \$4.5 million in federal funds to encourage expansion of the state area's economy.

A five-year program, to cost about \$120 million, is aimed at improving the economy of outlying areas while dealing with economic costs of congestion and environmental strain in metropolitan portions, according to House Appropriations Subcommittee testimony made public today.

For the upcoming fiscal year, Stewart Lamproy of Montpelier, N.H., federal co-chairman of the commission in the commerce department, asked Congress to approve a \$9.7 million budget request.

That would be a \$4.5 million boost over current spending. Specific project recommendations total \$9.1 million, with administrative expenses comprising the remaining portion. The federal government would pay half the cost of the commission staff, with the rest contributed by the six states.

Lamproy told a House panel that the New England projects concentrate on attacking the region's most severe economic problems of unequal distribution of job skills and income, and of pollution.

He said that since New England has a predominantly rural and underdeveloped north and an economically advanced south, the region offers a chance to combine the two and strengthen in a strategy for development.
