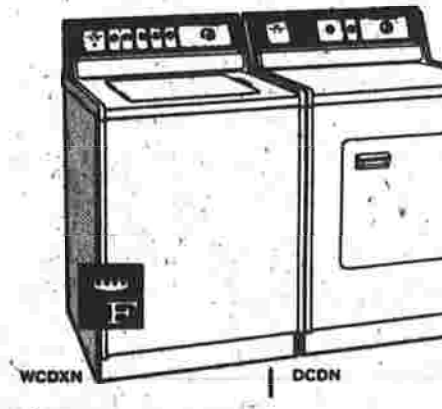

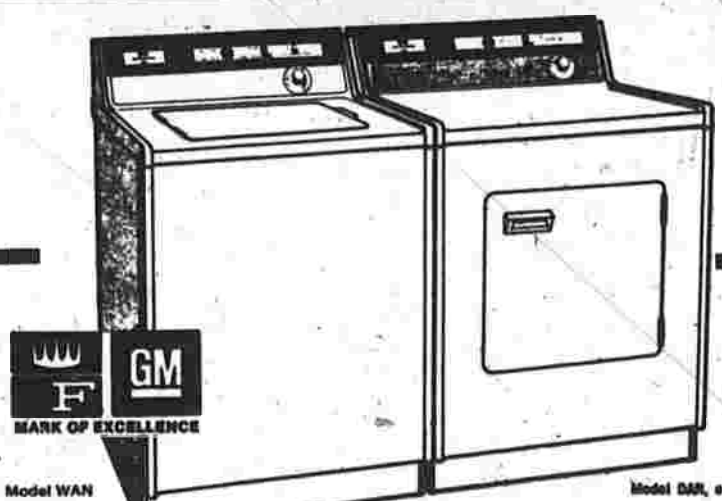

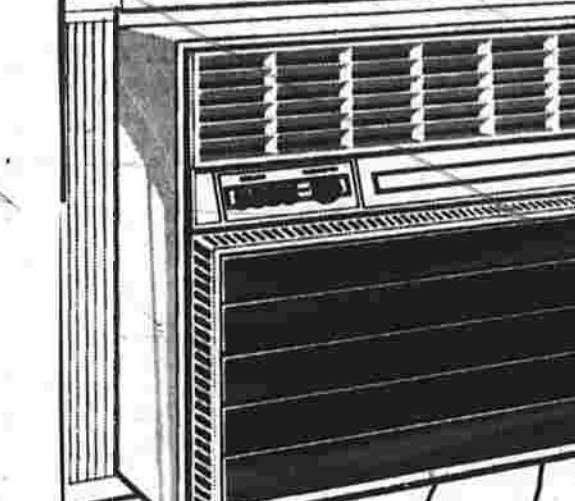

'My Job Is to Keep UConn Open,' Dr. Babbidge Tells Rotarians

"I regret that in the pursuit of my job, I cannot say 'body's hero... my job is to keep the university doors open,' Dr. Homer Babbidge, president of the University of Connecticut, told the Rockville Rotary Club yesterday.

Dr. Babbidge, speaking in a somber tone, explained the happenings of the past few weeks at the university and asked for public support to improve and strengthen the system of government.

Standing firm on the judgment he has made concerning operation of the school, the president told the Rotarians, "Some believe in my exercise of protecting public property I should have suspended hundreds of lives."

He said within a month after he made that speech, "we did have serious difficulties with the interruption of placement interviews and we had to call in the state police to restore law and order."

Stating there was sufficient public concern over the situation of these interruptions, Dr. Babbidge said that he appeared on television and repeated his observations of the month that these were difficult days ahead for all of us.

Standing on his conviction that there is no better way to operate the university than the one devised, Dr. Babbidge said yesterday there are means to improve and strengthen it. The system must be responsive, he said.

Defending the students who are at the institutions to learn, Dr. Babbidge said that the small group of dissidents who are trying to prove the system exact work, and there is also a group who are saying the system is not working, not that it can't work.

Dr. Babbidge said he has been working hard to make the government more responsive. But noting that underlying tensions are still there, Dr. Babbidge cited the recent announcement of President Nixon on Cambodia and the shooting incident at Kent University for causing what he termed "an outpouring of youthful anger" and the national strike call.

Appropriations on Agenda Of Special Board Meeting

The Board of Directors will conduct public hearings next Tuesday on a \$3,600,000 current appropriation to the current Capital Improvement Fund, to establish a wash-out account for townwide sewer improvements, and on a \$700,000 additional appropriation to next year's budget, to pay for short term loans in the same amount.

The \$3.6 million will be financed by federal and state grants and by contributions from the 8th Utilities District and benefiting industry.

The town's \$1.1 million share of the sewage improvements, estimated to cost \$5.6 million, were authorized on an April 23, 1968 referendum.

Federal and state grants will total \$1,700,000. The balance of \$1,900,000 is needed to date, and the rest to be received in installments by the fall of 1971, when the entire project is due for completion.

Also received to date are \$78,100 from Lynde Inc., \$18,500 from Case Bros., and \$8,200 from the Hartford Electric Light Co. All payments in full. The Municipal Building has made a \$39,281 contribution.

Next Tuesday's meeting, a special session will be at 8 p.m. in the Municipal Building Hearing Room.

GOP Aims at Senate Seats Of Three Western Democrats

WASHINGTON (AP)—Republicans trying to wrest control of the Senate after 16 years as the minority are taking careful aim at a trio of liberal Democrats: Frank E. Moss of Utah, Gale McGee of Wyoming and Quentin I. Burdick of North Dakota.

"If we can win in these races the GOP will be strong enough to ward gaining the seven seats it needs to control the Senate," says a top GOP aide.

On paper all three Democrats appear to be vulnerable. Their states are generally conservative. Lyndon B. Johnson has broken in the past 20 years.

Two of them, Moss and McGee, were elected to their first terms in 1968, a recession year that found a Republican in the White House, and all three were re-elected in 1964, the year of Johnson's landslide victory over Republican Barry Goldwater.

This time, Moss, McGee and Burdick are on their own as they start campaigns for a third term. Nonetheless, interviews with key political figures of both parties disclosed the extent of the three, for varying reasons, is in a strong position.

Each emphasizes his seniority, each cites a record of accomplishment attuned to state interests and each hopes to capitalize on the Nixon administration's growing problems, especially in the economy.

While most of the interviews were before the Cambodian crisis erupted, the three were well aware of its potential impact. "If he (Nixon) gets bogged down in Cambodia, we're all in deep trouble," said Rep. Lawrence J. Burdick.

Utah Democratic leaders are counting heavily on a Republican scandal in Moss' Salt Lake City stronghold. McGee's Democratic registration majority in Burton's home city of Ogden is another factor.

"In Wyoming, the livestock McGees is under pressure from a small but vocal group of anti-war Democrats. But his position against the oil depletion allowance appear to have balanced a liberal record in his congressional career."

Sen. Burdick's health has been a family matter with a Republican scandal in Moss' Salt Lake City stronghold. McGee's Democratic registration majority in Burton's home city of Ogden is another factor.

Helping each of the incumbents is a growing trend in Washington to have a Democratic senator, one Republican, McGee, noting that the land half the land in Wyoming is owned by the federal government.

McGee claims to have shaken 114,000 hands—Wyoming only has a population of 200,000—and he spends his time when traveling to and from the state signing personal messages to honor graduates, golden wedding anniversary celebrations and other action assignments.

Utah: The key to the Moss-Burdick race is Salt Lake County, which casts close to 40 percent of the total vote and where key aides to the county's Republican commissioners have been indicted for misappropriating funds.

Banker Admits Embarrassment; Term Suspended

HARTFORD, Conn. (AP)—A suspended three year prison term was handed down Monday to a banker who admitted embezzling \$54,750 from his bank to satisfy a "compulsive urge to trade on the market."

He later paid the bank back. Daniel J. Kerwick, 38, will still have to serve 30 days in prison before the suspension goes into effect, however.

Justice T. Eminent Charles had presided over the embezzlement charge.

Kerwick's lawyer, Irving Ribicoff, said the judge that Kerwick, a former broker, had a "compulsive urge to trade on the market" while he worked for five years for the Hartford National Bank and Trust Company's main office as securities manager.

In addition, Ribicoff said, his client had other problems, including big financial losses on the market while he worked as a handi-capped child and a wife in poor health.

He also asked—and Judge Kerwick granted—a delay in executing the shortened prison term until June 1, so Kerwick can straighten out his family and financial affairs.

The parents of four young children, Kerwick and his wife moved to Windsor Locks to pay off debt.

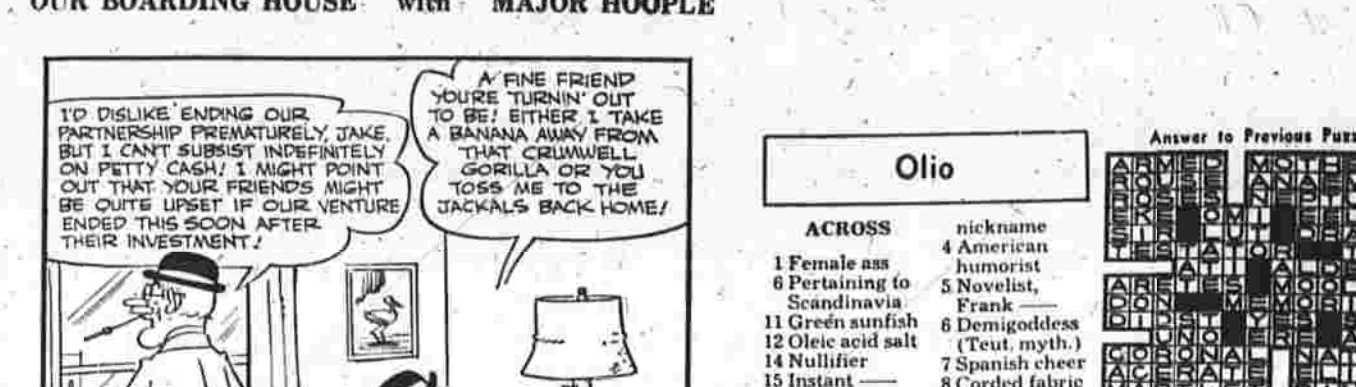

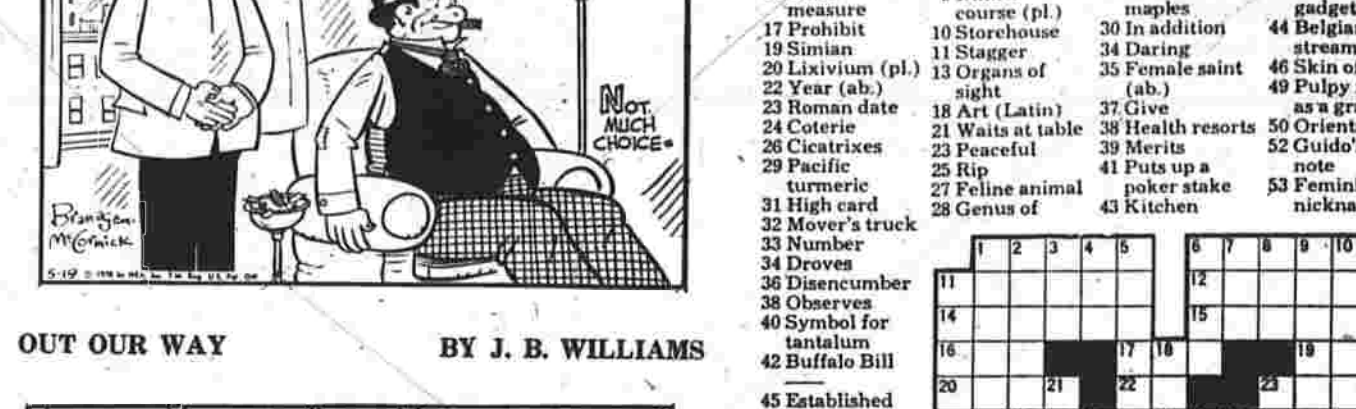
