"I love my country and have ought for her and would fight gain," said Bates in his letter of resignation, "but not in a war which I consider morally and intellectually indefensible." Bates had been medical adiser to Selective Service Board s for 20 years. He is a veteran of service with the Marines dur-ing World War II. The war in Vietnam "saps ou

"My definition of patriotism is to do your best to help your country be the finest expression of the mind and spirit of its citizens," he said.

Senator Smith As Prophet In what is certain to prove the speech which draws the most sustained and voluminous editorial praise of the year, Senator Margaret Chase Smith of Maine made plain her own distaste for both the radical anarchy being preached on the ampuses and the counter-criticism that has gone beyond the bounds of reasonableness and propriety and fanned, instead of drenching, the fires of

In other words, she buys neither campus revolution nor Vice President Agnew's attack upon it.

She wants something like a traditional American strength to rise from the

"It is time," she said, "that the greater center of our people, those who reject the violence and unreasonableness of both the extreme right and extreme left, searched their consciences, mustered their moral and physical courage, shed their intimidated silence and de-

But it is perhaps in her prophecy of what will happen if the middle does not rise to retrieve the nation's spiritual and ideological health that Senator Smith

creasingly forcing upon the American people the narrow choice between anarchy and repression. And make no mistake about it, if that narrow choice has to be made, the American people, even if with reluctance and misgiving, will choose repression.

"Ironically," she continued, "the excesses of dissent in the extreme left can result in repression of dissent. For repression is preferable to anarchy and "To most Americans" the Senator

said, and that was the basis of her prophecy of what will happen, not because it may be theoretically right or wrong, but because it will be "preferable" to "most Americans." Senator Smith, in such a statement,

At least one computer dating service charges nine different prices, depending on the age and sex of the customer. Older women are charged hundreds of dollars more than older men. Desperation might have everything to do with older women's willingness to pay more than \$800 for dates with eligible men. Reliable estimates of a computer dating company's fixed costs per person rur between \$60 and \$80.

"The pricing works according to the principles of supply and demand," said the president o one expensive dating service There are more young women than young men.
