Rescue Effort In the Andes

LIMA, Peru (AP) — Bad weather and blocked roads today hampered efforts to rescue 11 Peruvian mountaineers who were stranded in a snow-capped mountain range in the Andes.

The towns of Yungay, Caraz and Huancayo in the canyon were almost totally destroyed in the earthquake which rumbled through half of Peru Sunday.

Government officials feared as many as 30,000 people were killed, but broken communications still prevented anything like an accurate tally of casualties.

Israel planes bombed Egyptian military targets in the Suez Canal area today with intermittent strikes lasting about an hour.

The military command said all planes returned safely. In five similar attacks Tuesday, Israeli missiles pounded Egyptian canal positions for 11 hours.

In Cairo, a missile spokesman claimed that one Israeli Skyhawk was downed in the Suez. He said five Egyptian tanks were killed and five wounded.

The Israelis have intensified their attacks against Egyptian positions on the canal, trying to block placement of Soviet and United States missiles there. Air missions into Egypt this week were hampered from sale.

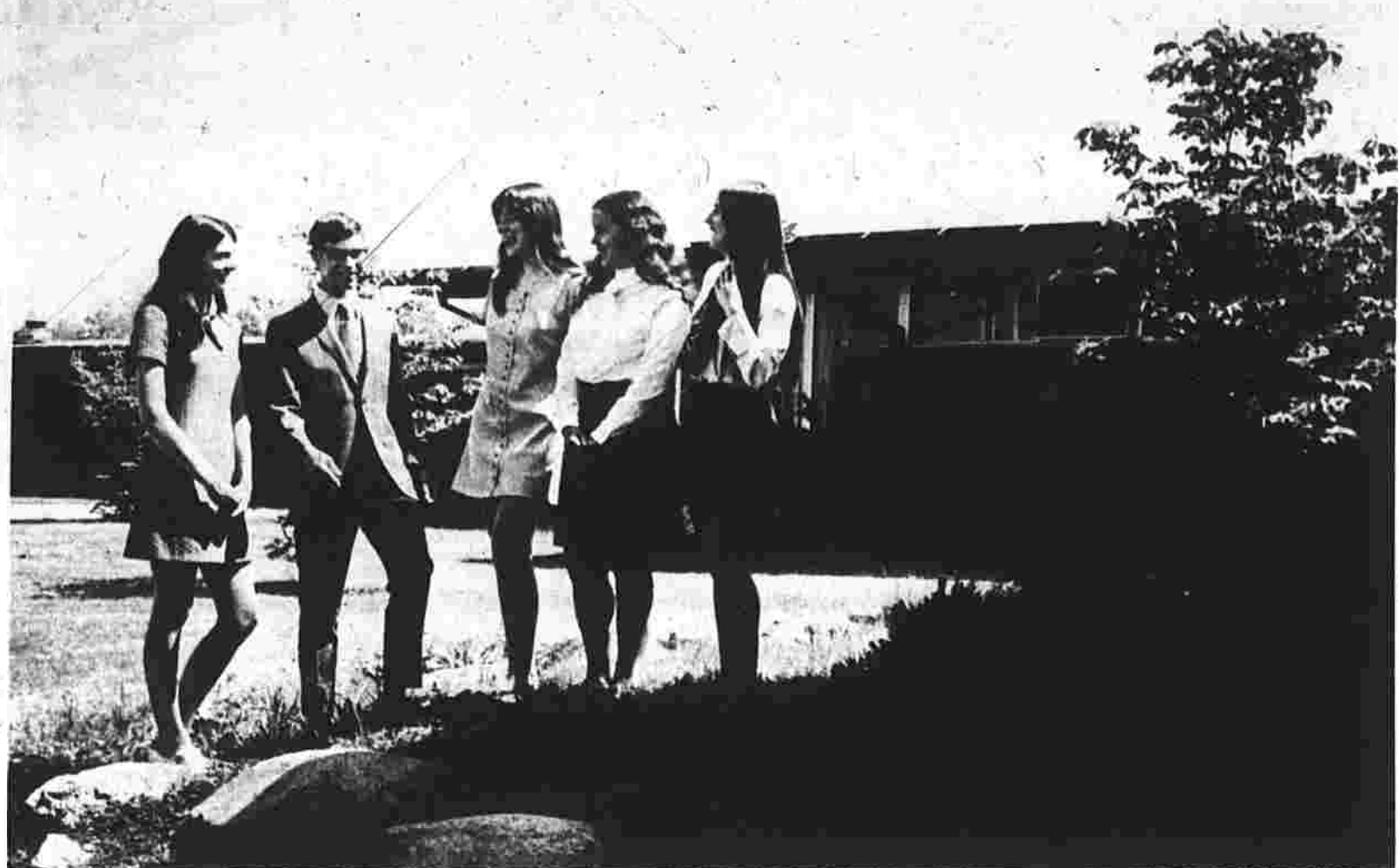

As Others See Us

LONDON (AP) — President Nixon's handling of the American economy was the subject of a considerable foreign comment this week.

Britain's independent weekly Economist said: "One of Mr. Nixon's most unfortunate economic traits has turned out to be his habit of scaring all sensible people by making Hooverist noises which he thinks will be reassuring to ignorant people."

To reassure confidence, the Economist continued, Nixon should tell the nation that "in the fiscal year 1970-71 he will be aiming to re-expand the American economy towards the 4 per cent real growth rate that is within its annual increase in capacity."

It is a high time that the intelligent President of the most important and sophisticated country on earth stopped talking in meaningless financial archaisms, and started to show that he has a modern quantitative grip on at least what he thinks his administration is doing.

The French weekly L'Express, commenting on the U.S. economic slowdown, said: "Business circles are all the more bitter because Nixon was their man. They are indignant that in the name of an ineffective economic policy a Republican office holder has done what, perhaps a fatal one to the veritable engine of the American economic machine: Profits."

"Financial observers in America speak with genuine alarm, as if they were talking about a plague or a major earthquake," said the Soviet Communist party newspaper Pravda.

"Economic difficulties have been worsening for many months. The army of jobless, who by now account for 4.8 per cent of the country's entire labor force, is growing," Pravda said.

The Sydney, Australia Daily Telegraph's Robert Feldman reported from New York that Nixon was persuaded to "join the silent majority" after he said he had some extra cash.

Thursday, the leftist New Statesman said of the precarious Wall Street situation: "It is no longer true that when America man relations board didn't speak catches pneumonia; but clearly if America catches pneumonia the rest of the world may get a very bad cold."

"Deep in his heart the average American—oppressed with ever higher living costs, frustrated by ever-tougher labor demands for which the public always pays, and depressed at developments overseas and on campuses at home—seemed bitterly resigned to an unpredictable era of an impatient American brand of grin-and-bear-it."

Lea Fitzgerald wrote in the Australian Financial Review.

The leftist Sonntags Journal of Zurich opined: "The United States today is shaken by economic, sociological and political fever. The United States is sick. The President is a puppet of forces behind the scenes, just like the oft-ridiculed heads of state in South American banana republics. And on this country, which respected political observers believe is ripe for a military takeover or a revolution, all of the world's economies and stock exchanges depend."

When President and Mrs. Nixon got through redecorating the White House, there may be fewer and fewer reminders of the former Mrs. John F. Kennedy's historic restoration.

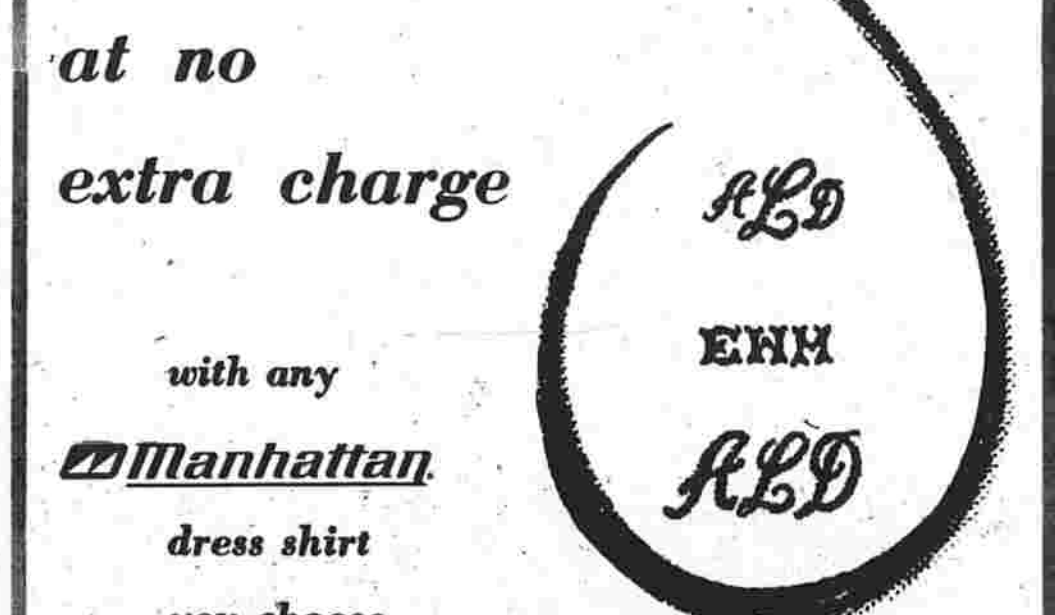

Discrimination Charged Against Spanish Citizens

WATERBURY, Conn. (AP) — The State Commission on Human Rights and Opportunities was accused of discriminating against Connecticut's Spanish-speaking citizens Tuesday night.

In one of its first votes, a newly-formed group set up to advance the interests of Connecticut's Spanish-speaking residents voted to institute legal action against the state board.

The group, which calls itself the Spanish-Speaking Council for Human Rights and Opportunities, said the state board has left Connecticut's citizens of Latin descent behind in "neglect and discrimination."

Some of the members pointed to the scheduled opening of a new regional office of blacks in the state board's programs.

The Spanish-speaking group met with 12 representatives attending from Hartford, Waterbury and New Haven. Delegates from Bridgeport and Meriden had promised their attendance but didn't show up.

Thursday, the group maintained, the vote against the state human relations board didn't specify what legal steps the group will take in court. It did authorize the group's lawyer to take whatever actions are necessary to bring about change in the commission's policies.

The vote was seen as a reflection of resentment of what many Puerto Ricans feel is an inordinate amount of influence and employment — of blacks in the state board's programs.

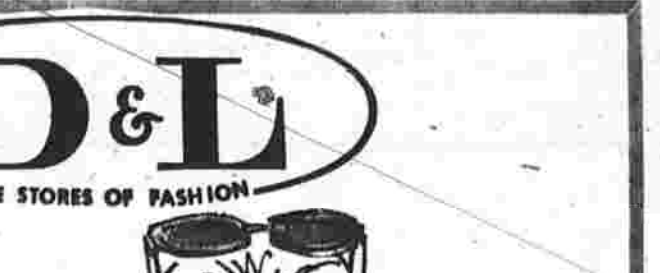

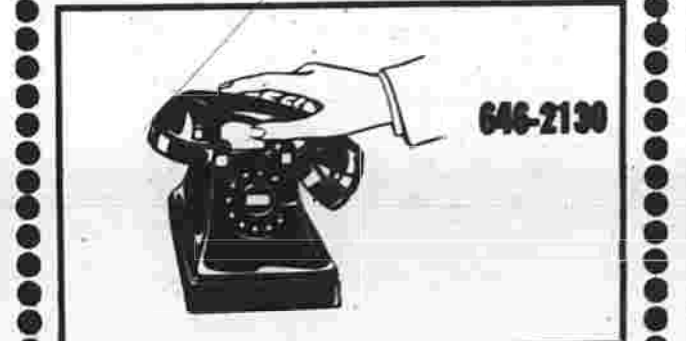

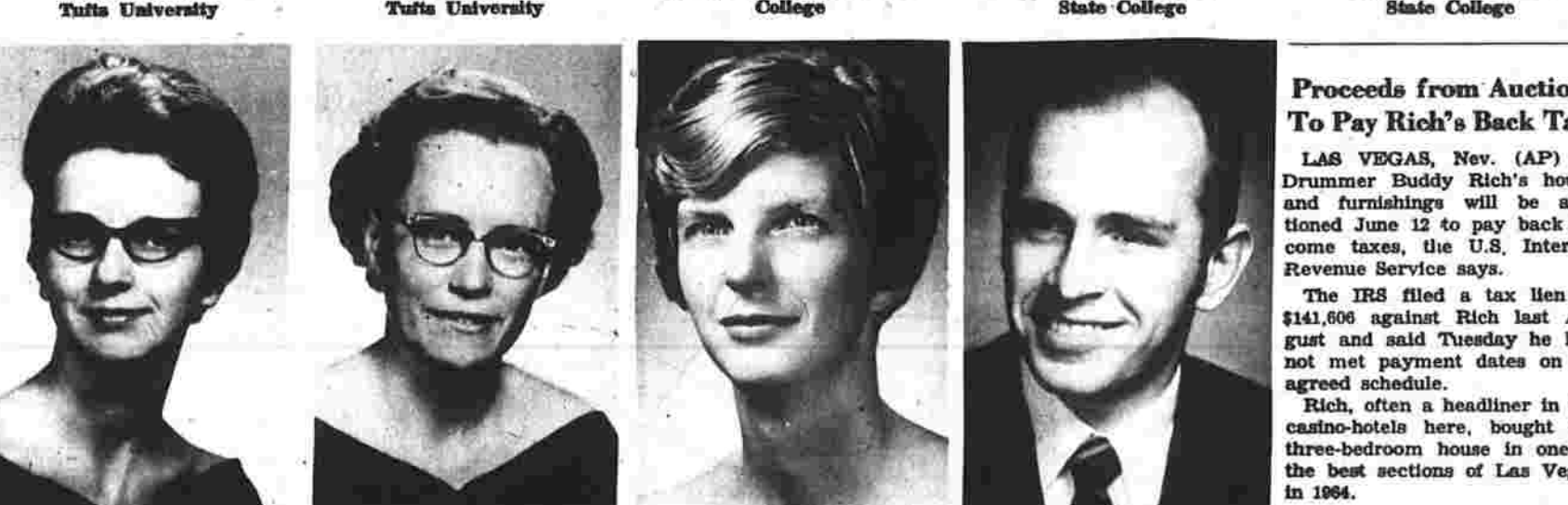

Japanese Liberals Fear Ultrationalism Returning

By JOHN RODERICK, Associated Press Writer. TOKYO (AP) — A thin little book which arouses nostalgia in the Japanese middle-aged is enjoying a quiet boom in the nation's bookstores. It is the prewar primary school textbook, its simple characters for flowers, doves, beans — hana, halo, manna — and a hundred others evoke the joys of childhood.

There are others who stir less pleasant memories, beginning with the names of the legendary Emperors Jimmu, Suizei, and others. The prewar and wartime Ministry of Education placed great emphasis on the descent of these rulers from the sun goddess Amaterasu. This link made it possible to insist on the god-like quality of the emperor. From there to total acceptance of the emperor as a deity, those who ran Japan in his name, was a small step.

The militarists who precipitated World War II played on this kind of fanaticism; nationalism of the mature worship cult called Shinto strengthened their hand. The U.S. occupation moved to eradicate the influence of a too-strong Japanese nationalism and a too-assertive communism. It moved educational authority to local school boards.

The emperor disavowed any claim to divinity. The martial arts — kendo, judo, karate — and the classic Kabuki stage form, which drew inspiration from Japan's samurai past, were banned. Kabuki and the arts quickly revived after the occupation ended. So did "Chambers," the sword-play movies and television programs now as popular as American Westerns.

Many intellectuals, liberals and leftists have been aroused by developments they fear will lead to a return to the old ultrationalist school boards. The thin little textbook is at the center of the new controversy. An advisory committee of the educational Ministry reviewing primary school education for the 1970s has recommended textbooks which restore the old national legends and emphasize the spirit of loyalty and patriotism.

The new textbooks are to be exhibited in various prefectures July 1-10 and adopted at 400 areas by end of July. Though theoretically the school boards have free choice, they will be influenced by the Education Ministry's imprimatur. The influential newspaper, Mainichi and Asahi Shimbun praise the new tendency. A feeling of nationalism is good, they say, but there is a danger that Japan will move away from its present era of internationalism, democracy and liberalism.

There was the older generation, too, including the father, Henry S. Drinker, a mining engineer and lawyer who became president of Loblaw University, and Aunt Cecilia, a portrait painter who won many awards. "The Tattered Flag" is an excellent guide to review the principal events of that unhappy era.

Book Review

FAMILY PORTRAIT. By Catherine Drinker Bowen. Atlantic-Little, Brown, \$10.95. Here is the story of a remarkable family of brilliant, competent, talented and industrious and accomplished people. Their names are Drinker, and they came from Philadelphia to New England.

Not the least talented of the Drinker's six children is the author, who was a member of a number of major biographies. She was the youngest, 16 years the junior of the firstborn, Harry, who grew up to be a famous corporation lawyer and an outstanding sociologist of major standing.

There is an unusual combination of an eloquent writer and an engaging story.

THEIR TATTERED FLAG. By FRANK E. VANHUYER. Harper, \$6.95. It is hard to imagine a fresh approach to the Civil War. Yet Frank E. Vanhuyer, a well-known author of Southern historical fiction, has done it.

He calls his book "The Epic of the Confederacy," which makes it sound serious and a bit dull. It is anything but that. Actually, it is an impressive work of Southern orientation, of the tragic fratricidal conflict. Imagine a fresco of the war's highlights painted, not by Michelangelo but by Renoir.

THE WRITING IS BRILLIANT. In fact, at times it seems too good. When conserving time by drawing on his great knowledge of Southern history, he describes how this or that central figure fit into a given problem. We almost believe we are within the mind of that personality until we suddenly realize that what we are getting is Vandiver's own thinking.

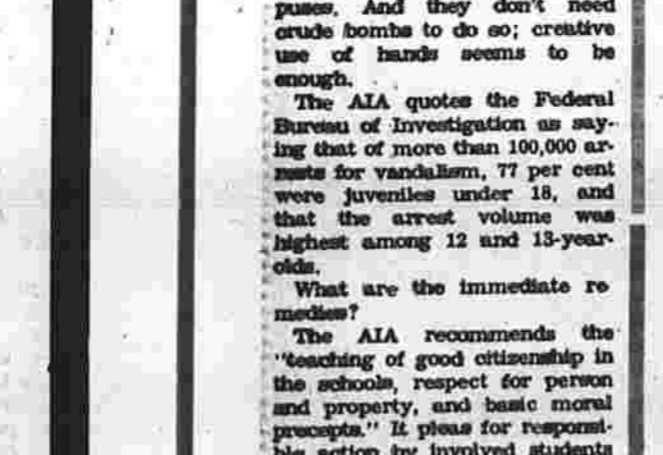

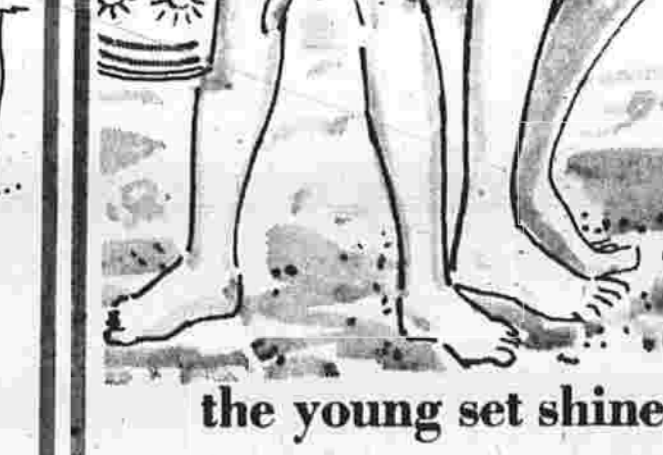

ACCRA, Ghana (AP) — If a Black American haberdasher is correct, the dashiki is going to unstrangle the button-bound checked American male. "We're making clothes for we're coming out with dashiki shirts with buttons, like the Africans," says pokamas, dashiki-making Howard Davis, 32, a founding vice president of New Breed, which he says brought African fashions across the ocean. "Now Afro-Americans, the company's confinement. Blood Tests and Paternity

To hear the girl's story, told tearfully on the witness stand, there could be no doubt that the defendant was the father of her baby. But the results of the blood tests shed a different light on the matter. The tests showed the following results:

The girl had one type of blood, the defendant had another type of blood, and the baby had still another type of blood.

Since a baby's blood must match either his mother's or his father's, some other man—some one with the baby's blood type—must have been the real father. The upshot was that the father, charged with the care of the child, was discredited and the defendant cleared of responsibility.

In this fashion, blood tests have saved hundreds of men from a false charge of paternity. These tests, if properly conducted, are now accepted almost everywhere as positive proof of or at least strong evidence of non-paternity. However, they have one major drawback. While they are useful in showing who is *not* the father, they are seldom useful in showing who *is* the father.

For example, suppose that in the case above, the baby and the defendant did have the same blood type. That would mean the defendant could indeed be the father. But so could any other man with that same type of blood. Thus, mere similarity of blood cannot ordinarily be relied on to pin paternity on a specific defendant.

This means that in a typical paternity suit, the woman has little to gain and much to lose from blood tests. If she refuses to agree to the tests, either for herself or for the baby, may a court order them anyhow?

Courts usually do have that power. In one case, the woman objected that the tests were not impartial, because they could only help the defendant's side of the case, not hers. Nevertheless, the court ordered her to submit to the testing procedure.

"A lawsuit is a search for truth," said the court, "and not a sporting proposition on gaming tables which rules should afford each side an equal chance of winning."

Horse Gets High on Hay

His owner, Paul Gallyly, said the 4-year-old gelding apparently was so hungry he had to get his absolute fill of hay—"he's always eating."

In due course, Gallyly missed Sonny and went looking for him. He was mildly astonished to find his horse gazing down at him from a second floor window of the barn.

Gallyly tried to lead Sonny down the stairs, but the horse, weighing 1,400 pounds, refused to come along.

His owner recruited a dozen helpers but Sonny stood pat.

Gallyly tried blindfolding Sonny, but the horse balked whenever he came to the steps.

A veterinarian gave Sonny a sedative, but woozy as he was the horse still wouldn't go down the stairs.

A motorist on a road which runs past the barn was so startled by the sight of a horse looking out of a second floor window that he drove into a ditch.

All else having failed, Gallyly bought 200 bales of hay. He built these Monday into an outside stairway leading from the ground to the hayloft's outside door.

The vet gave Sonny another sedative. Ropes were tied around the horse's neck, legs and body. Then they dragged him through the doors and down the hay steps, bumpily-bumpily, bumpily-bump, all the way to terra firma.

When the ropes were removed, Sonny, angry but uninjured, got to his feet and began munching on the grass.

City Problem

Computer Dating--Fairy Tale Or a Saga of Frustration?

LOS ANGELES — To the uninitiated, naïve or lonely unmarried person, the theory of computer dating recalls childhood fairy tales of Prince Charmings and Cinderellas. It captures the imagination of an ever-growing number of singles — old, young, divorced, widowed — across the United States.

The question is whether meeting and dating by computer is better or worse than traditional methods, whether the business within this electronic industry are legitimately performing the service they sell.

As a Cinderella in the world of computer dating, I believed that the space-age machine knew the names of countless eligible men.

I tried computer dating with great expectations and found the reality a dismal nightmare. In theory, computer technology has a place in helping people find people in an urban environment. In practice, it seems to fail.

The reason could be that the computer does only what it's told to do. Humans give the orders — some of them conscientious, some not; some honest, some not.

Two types of computer dating services are springing up. One is cheap, charging between \$10 and \$20. The other is expensive — fees run from a few hundred dollars to more than a thousand.

At least one computer dating service charges nine different prices, depending on the age and sex of the customer. Older women are charged hundreds of dollars more than older men.

Desperation might have everything to do with women's willingness to pay more than \$800 for dates with eligible men. Reliable estimates of a computer dating company's fixed costs per person run between \$60 and \$80.

"The pricing works according to the principles of supply and demand," said the president of one expensive dating service. "There are more young women than young men. There are more older women than older men."

I was "very matchable" according to the computer dating service. I was given 9 points of attractiveness on a 10-point scale. I am single and in my early 20s. I never have been married. Most important, I was willing to spend money on a computer dating service.

"You're just the kind of girl we're looking for," said one salesman of an expensive dating service. "You know, we don't accept everybody into our service. Other services would be very happy to accept the people we turn down." This is a standard line used on this company's potential customers.

The dropout rate is high among dating services. Some go bankrupt. Some simply fold up and leave town. One was closed down just as the Los Angeles District Attorney's office and the California Dept. of Corporations filed a criminal suit because the management had not gotten a permit to sell stock in California. It also failed to perform on franchise agreements.

"We didn't publicize it because we didn't want to hurt the legitimate services," said Dewey Smith, investigator for the D.A.'s office. "But at the same time go on the less legitimate they seem."

With the expensive services, the phone is usually answered by a secretary or receptionist who will hedge all your questions about price and program. Instead she will take your name, address and phone number and then try to line up time when you can make an appointment. Or a "convenient time" when one of their salesmen can come to your home.

If uncomfortable at the thought of a strange receptionist will assure you that each of their salesmen is bonded, or insured, or for your protection. They also say that their salesmen are "carefully screened — we looked into their moral backgrounds so there are no undesirable," said one secretary.

All dating services' sales pitches have much in common. None of them tell the price until they are almost at the end of their presentation.

Highlights in the presentations I heard are:

"If you are considering joining our service, then men like you (men that you would like) would do the same."

"We have your kind of person in our service."

"Are you willing to invest the monetary equivalent of approximately one dinner a week, over a year's time, to attain the above objectives?"

"You're in our service until you get married. It's not our bag but it might be yours."

"You know what the divorce rate is... It's very important not to make the wrong choice in marriage. We'll stack it in your favor."

"A rich girl is not going to be matched up with a boot-black."

"We've had more than 800 marriages and only 4 divorces. They talk in generalities, use statistics that may or may not be their own and suggest to the customer that he or she will be

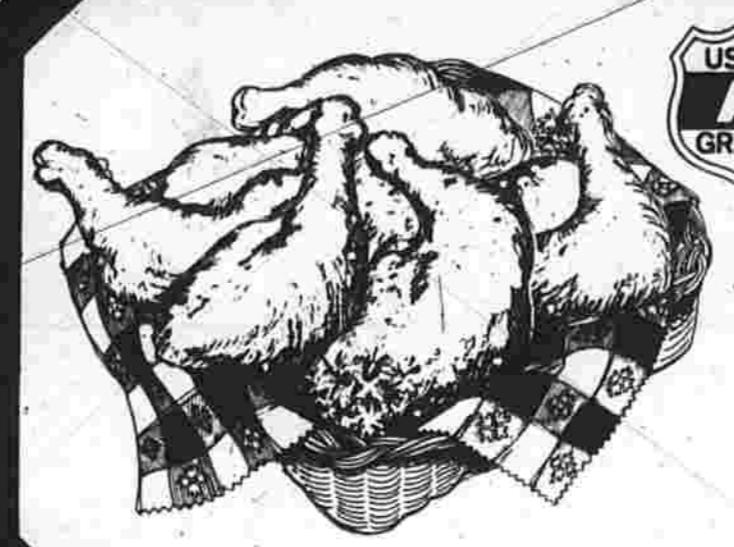

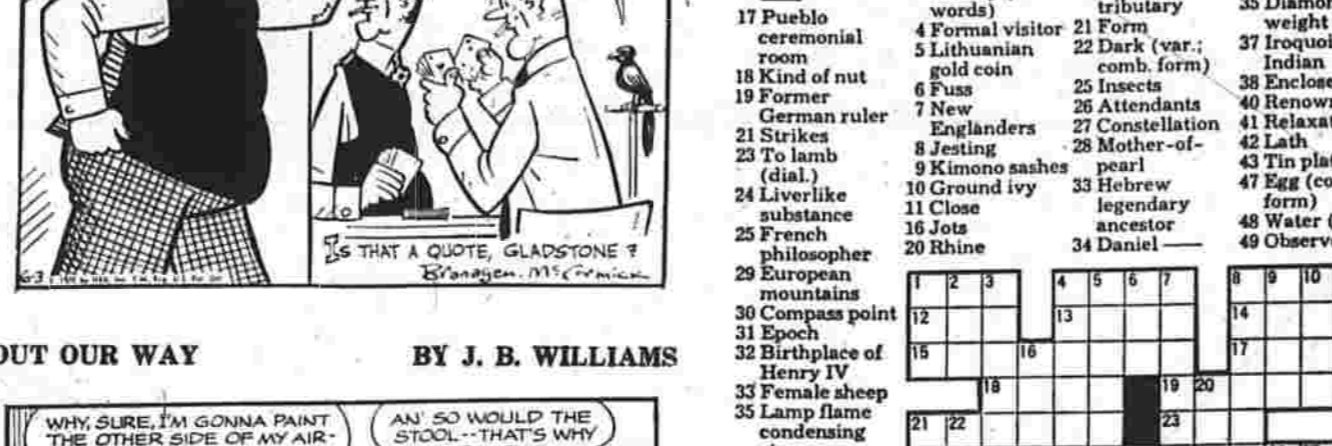
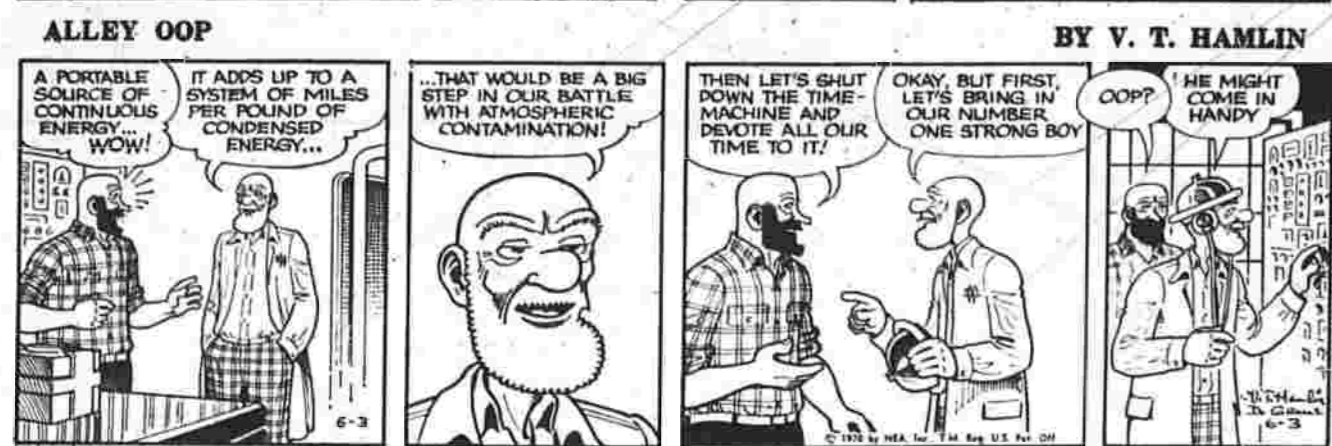
