Town Frees Sewer Bond, Recoups Cost

The Manchester Board of Directors, on a recommendation by Town Counsel John Shea, has released a \$4,000 bid bond from Frank Kapala, 8 Son of Glastonbury, low bidder on the Lydall Brook sanitary sewer project.

The release is on the condition that Kapala, which backed out of accepting the contract, will pay all town costs for time and material spent preparing the proposal. The cost is estimated at just under \$1,000.

Kapala, one of three bidders for the job, had submitted a \$77,886 price, half that of the next low bidder, and one-third that of the third.

Shea, in recommending release of the bond, said that it was obvious that Kapala had made a mistake in his bid, that it was the first time Kapala had bid on a sewer job, and that calling in the bond might jeopardize Kapala's chances for ever obtaining another bond.

Shea said, "A municipality, many times, should take a good look at the humanistic side of the problem. In this instance, when the town can prevent a man from being hurt, and still get back its costs."

The Lydall Brook project, Shea explained, is at an 82 percent cost to Green Manor, to service its condominium project off Lydall St., and 18 percent to the town, to which the Northeast Interceptor.

Dodd Won't Seek Nod of Democrats

HARTFORD, Conn. (AP) — Sen. Thomas J. Dodd said today he will not seek or accept the Democratic nomination to the U.S. Senate. His withdrawal from the five-way race for the seat Dodd has held since 1964, apparently gives the way for him to run for re-election as an independent.

A spokesman for the senator, his press aide Joseph Barbarett, said today that Dodd has decided not to seek nor will he accept the Democratic nomination at the Democratic State Convention June 28 and 29.

Dodd had stated earlier this week that he was seriously considering running as an independent, but he denied at that time a report he would pull out of the Democratic race. He has been apparent the Senator's election campaign had satisfied him for to force a Democratic primary for the nomination.

The party leadership in Connecticut reportedly opposed the nomination of Dodd but the Democratic "Chairman John Bailey, a former national business man of the party, has not made a preference public. He is believed to favor Stamford businessman Alphonse Donahue.

Among the recent blows to Dodd's renomination hopes was the endorsement of another candidate, the Rev. Joseph Duffy, by Dodd's Democratic Senate colleague Abraham Ribicoff.

Ice Chests Will Get Safety Lids

WASHINGTON (AP) — Ice chest manufacturers whose products are designed for beer, sandwiches and other picnic items will build emergency escape devices into their new models in an effort to prevent additional deaths among toddlers who have been trapped inside.

At least 16 children have suffocated in picnic coolers since 1961, according to the Consumer Department. Officials think many other cases may not have made it into the department's records.

Asst. Secretary of Commerce Myron E. Tribus said manufacturers "have very understandably refused to set up a voluntary safety program until we got into the models since most of the coolers had not been made until after the deaths had already been manufactured.

Some of the coolers have automatic catches that lock when the door closes. In other cases, officials said, one child might playfully lock another child inside, then be diverted and leave the door open to suffocate.

Malcolm W. Jensen, acting director of the National Bureau of Standards' Institute for Consumer Technology, said engineers came up with three possible ways to make the coolers safer.

The methods are to put in a permanent cap on the lid, making the spaces too small for a child to install a snap-off lid or build in a snap-off section.

Sources Say Cambodia Ready To Cede Half of Nation to Foe

PHNOM PENH, Cambodia (AP) — The Cambodian government, faced with sharply mounting pressure from the Viet Cong and North Vietnamese, has decided reluctantly to cede almost half the country to enemy control, well informed diplomatic sources said today.

The disclosure came in military sources reported that enemy troops seized nearly half of the province capital of Kompong Speu, 30 miles south of Phnom Penh in heavy fighting.

Refugees from the town, which lies on the only highway open to Cambodia's major port of Kompong Som, formerly Sihanoukville, said the enemy held the central market and virtually all of that part of the town which lies south of a river bisecting it.

Western military experts termed the decision to cede territory to the enemy realistic, and said that even by concentrating its forces around Phnom Penh and northwest of the capital, the government will have only a 50-50 chance of surviving the next four or five months of monsoon rains.

The threat to the town of Kompong Speu, through which all of Phnom Penh's fuel and other vital supplies must pass could have critical consequences. Enemy troops also made a strong attack 80 miles northeast of Phnom Penh in what could be a prelude to new assaults on the key Mekong River town of Kompong Cham.

Spokesmen said the fighting at Slem Reap, near the Angkor temple ruins, had subsided, but the government was still in a precarious position.

Allen Cites No Support From Nixon

WASHINGTON (AP) — Deposed U.S. commissioner of Education James E. Allen says his job was hampered by politics and lack of White House direction.

Calling his dismissal Wednesday "surprising," Allen said he does not blame outgoing Secretary of Health, Education and Welfare Robert H. Finch for his ouster, but indicated the decision was made at the White House.

In a statement and press conference Thursday Allen said one will "regret that I shall no longer be directly involved in the many excellent projects and programs that are under way in the Office of Education and the Department of Health, Education and Welfare."

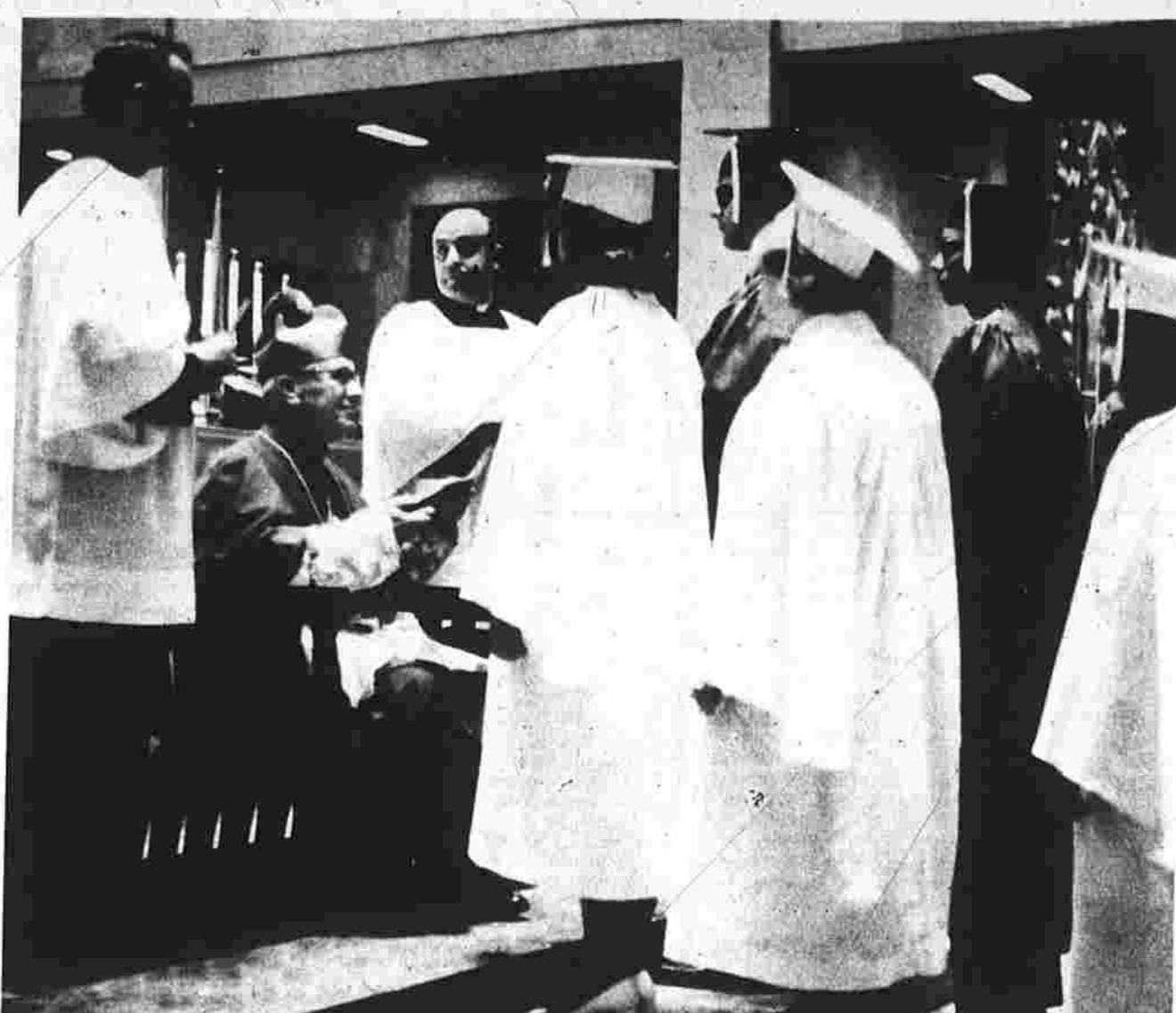
But the 59-year-old former New York State education commissioner said he had not received White House support during his service. He said nearly a dozen key jobs had gone unfilled because he had heard unofficially that his name had been rejected at higher levels of the administration.

Regarding his recent criticism of the President's education policy, Allen said: "Since this issue has so profoundly affected the education community and the youth of the nation, I believed that I could not refrain from publicly expressing my views."

At the White House Thursday Nixon's press secretary Ronald L. Ziegler acknowledged that the President had not given Allen the "general direction" he had given other cabinet members.

A Paper Work Rebellion

We are not prepared to discuss in detail the particular reasons why the doctors of Britain, any more than doctors anywhere, or anybody anywhere, have felt impelled to rebel against doing the paper work expected of them.

All we really know is that the British doctors are refusing to sign forms, and that as a result of their refusal to sign forms all kinds of slowdowns and road blocks are developing in the normal course of life in Britain.

Perhaps, as rumored and reported, the doctors of Britain are staging their paper strike in an effort to gain themselves higher pay.

But there is at least a possibility that they have begun refusing to fill out papers and sign forms because they find themselves sick, sick, sick, of the business of filling out papers and signing forms.

And rather than comment on the possibility that they are seeking more of this world's income, which would, in its turn, involve them in still more paper work, we prefer to salute their conduct as a timely blow for human freedom against the most invidious form of slavery yet devised, the slavery to form, file and futality that is represented by the paper work syndrome.

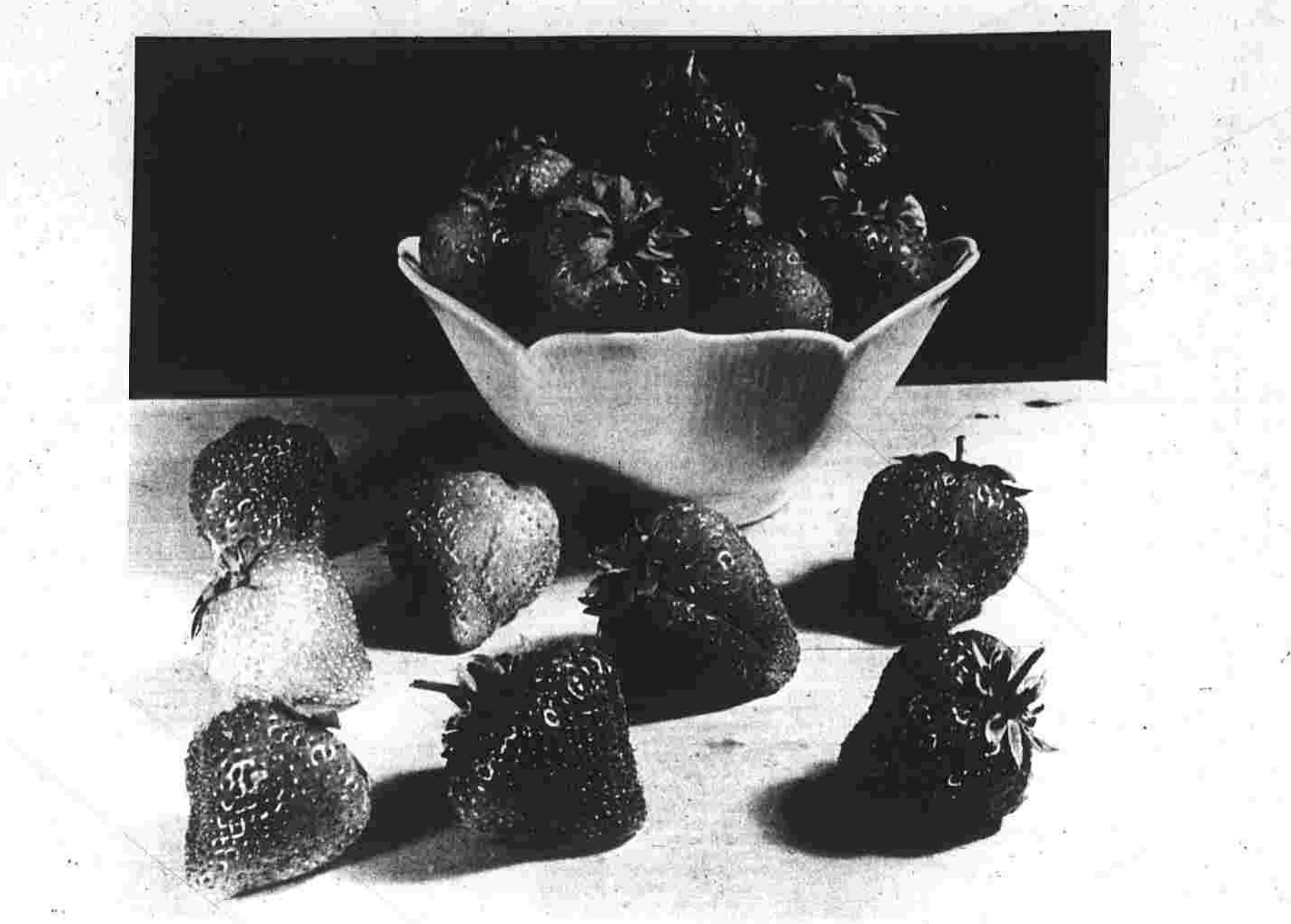
There will have to come a day, we predict and hope, when our human wretches will turn on our own contentions, open, formal war between Israel and its Arab neighbor states, with the potential climax of the nightmare coming with the eventual involvement, on opposite sides, of the United States and Russia.

This would, we all assume, be the worst that could happen. It might, on the other hand, have the fatal attraction of making loyalties and alignments simple and clear at least. All the tortuous uncertainties and confusions would be over; we would all be united. In our separate alignments, in one pattern of doom.

That big nightmare never really lifts from the situation in the Near East. In fact, it seems always to be drawing a little nearer.

Meanwhile, however, there is another, a subsidiary nightmare, which threatens and which, if it comes, will have special qualities all its own. It may not, for a time, involve outside forces quite so clearly, but the anxieties it will spread through its own uncertainties might prove almost as great as the anxieties of full world war.

This lesser nightmare would be one in which, as has just been threatening to happen in Jordan, eastern Arab governments would dissolve and disappear, leaving their territories to an anarchy in which the only remaining concerted activity would be that of the Palestinian guerrillas. The FBI's Future

WASHINGTON — Politicians deeply worried about the future of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) in the dim beyond after J. Edgar Hoover's departure of Cartha D. DeLoach as a close aide that dramatized the need for basic FBI reform.

There were signs of relief in Washington when DeLoach, No. 3 official in the bureau, bowed to intense pressure and suddenly announced his retirement at age 49, thus eliminating himself from consideration as Hoover's successor. Had DeLoach ever succeeded Hoover (as seemed quite probable a few years ago), the charges against him of right-wing bias and blatant opportunism would have rocked with it.

With DeLoach gone and Hoover, at age 74, determined to stay in power until forced out by death or physical disability, politicians of both parties close to the FBI are now looking hopefully toward the following reforms:

Reform No. 1: They want Hoover's successor from outside the ranks of the FBI—preferably a moderate liberal who would avoid the strident tone that often dominated Hoover's rhetoric. Supreme Court Justice Byron White may come closest to filling this prescription.

Reform No. 2: A specific time limit, perhaps one eight-year term, is regarded as essential for Hoover's successor. Although Hoover has become a legend, the man with all the government's investigative dossier, Mr. Nixon's rise to the adverse (5-to-1 negative) public reaction to the campus strike protesting his removal has, in effect, ended his tenure.

Reform No. 3: Experts on the FBI want it split into two separate bureaus—operations and intelligence. This would ease the problem of the FBI agent skill set, which is the most obvious case in point. It is astonishing to see the President's popularity increase during a period when war casualties and war consciousness have been on the rise, when prices and unemployment are both at the highest levels in years, when the stock market is down, and when the campuses, the congress and parts of the national administration are in rebellion against his leadership.

You can believe, if you wish, that most voters think Mr. Nixon has done a dandy job to date, or that they believe all will be well in the end, as he keeps saying.

But there is no good reason to think your fellow-countrymen are as glib or foolish as all that. They can tell good lines from bad without a lot of coaching, and few people think of this as a vintage year.

If they are, as Doctor Gallup says, increasingly proud that they credit the President with trying his best to solve the tough problems he inherited and that they are put off by the sources of most of the criticism recently heaped on him.

In other words, a reasonable hypothesis is that if they do not exactly love him for the fighting symbol he gives them, they like him because of those who have declared themselves his critics. State's Foliage Falling Victim To Canker Worm

DANBURY, Conn. (AP)—The trees in several Connecticut communities are turning from green to gray as millions of canker worms chop their way through the leaves.

Four or five other leaf-eating worms are wreaking similar devastation on a smaller scale in other sections of the state—through the lower Neversuck River Valley and in eastern Connecticut.

"This has been going on for hundreds of years," Dr. Stephen Hitchcock of the Connecticut Agricultural Experiment Station in New Haven said Thursday. "We've had hundreds of calls from throughout the state when people see their leaves disappearing. People don't realize how many canker worms there are to carry out this kind of stripping," he said.

Most of the worms will fall off of the defoliated trees in the next week or so, Hitchcock said. They'll incubate and return next spring as moths.

In the Danbury area, the canker worm with a black and red head has been chewing up the leaves of ash, maple, sassafras and oak trees. A field County Extension Service spokesman said the defoliation extends as far south as the Connecticut shoreline.

"One professional tree sprayer in Danbury has been out seven days a week, and turning away customers. One spraying firm said it has such a backlog it is forced to turn away 50 to 60 customers a day.

For some reason, because of the abundant rainfall in the past month, the usual one-week hatching period for canker worms in the Danbury area was prolonged for about three weeks, and a unusually high number of eggs," he said. "They're running ahead of schedule and are eaten by parasites. The species builds up again over a number of years."

17-Year Locust Emerges, Mates, Feeds, Annoys

The so-called 17-year locusts have emerged from their underground burrows in various parts of the nation's Midwest and familiar mating song through an outdoor summer.

A survey showed today the outbreak of the insects, which are actually misnamed periodic cicadas, has primarily occurred in wooded areas of the East and Middle West.

Particularly heavy concentrations were reported only in certain areas of Indiana. Along Fall Creek in northern Indiana, the insects were almost as thick as swarming bees and the noise of their incessant chirping was deafening.

Although the cicadas generally cause little damage to plants, they have cut through the branches of many maple, mulberry and fruit trees in the Fall Creek area.

The cicadas caused slight damage to fruit trees in northeastern West Virginia.

In Minneapolis, entomologists said the outbreak was not severe and they were not recommending anything for controlling the insects.

Columbus, Ohio, and many other areas in the Midwest had outbreaks of the bugs, but none of the outbreaks were reported to be troublesome.

A spokesman for the New York State Conservation Department said the state has escaped a major infestation this year. He said the insects have not generally been causing problems.

"They don't detestible like the Biblical locusts who ate the grasshoppers," he said. "Most damage by cicadas is done by females who sit branch on fruit trees to lay eggs. The young hatch in the tree and then fall to the ground and bury themselves for 17 years."

Dr. Ray James, entomologist at Michigan State University, said the cicada outbreak in the Detroit area has been "very mild." He said Michigan is not as susceptible as some other states to the insects because a lot of forest land has been cut since 1953.

There were outbreaks in North Carolina and some damage reported to apple orchards.

utely and leave the field to their antagonists. It would be senseless to suggest that the way to beat George Wallace is for Negroes to stay at home on election day or that liberal candidates this fall would be better off if the students were locked in their dormitories throughout the campaign.

Liberals can work and talk and write and vote for their own candidates. If the course of events demonstrates the validity of some of their criticisms of the administration, as it likely will, the time may come when majority sentiment swings to their side.

But there should be no dilution about the risks liberals run with their activities in the meantime. The country may be short of heroes at the moment, but it has an abundant supply of liberal candidates who are simply by making him their enemy.

Neutral Swiss Probing \$20 Million Arms Export

BERN, Switzerland (AP)—The federal prosecutor's office, completing a probe of neutral Switzerland's largest arms manufacturer, announced today several persons have been charged in connection with the allegedly illegal export of \$20 million worth of war materiel to South Africa, Israel, Nigeria and three Arab countries.

The announcement came almost 20 months after government investigators began looking into sales by Oerlikon-Buehler A.G. of Zurich, the country's biggest weapons manufacturer. Switzerland has an official embargo on arms exports to countries at war or threatened by conflict.

South Africa, according to previous announcements, received the bulk of the shipments, \$12.3 million worth of arms. Israel received \$4.4 million worth, with Egypt, Saudi Arabia, Lebanon and Nigeria sharing the rest.

The equipment included anti-air rockets, cannon and ammunition.

An official of the federal justice and police department said the names of the three officers, including the director, Dieter Buehler, head of the family-owned company, and three associates, were not disclosed. Gabriel Ledebinsky, vice director, Alexandre Gelbert and Max Buehler, were named.

The four had been identified in earlier announcements of the probe. The names of the three others will be announced after a ten-day period in which they can submit objections on procedural matters, the official said.

The arms scandal created a stir in the nation, particularly after newspapers raised the question whether Red Cross relief planes which crashed en route to Biafra in 1968 may have been shot down by Swiss cannon sold to Nigeria.

The government promised a "relentless" probe, posted in high altitudes.

Kompung Speu is 30 miles southwest of Phnom Penh on Route 4, the only highway still considered open between the capital and the port of Kompung Som.

Several government battalions were reported defending Kompung Speu. Some observers speculated that the Viet Cong and North Vietnamese might be trying to draw more government forces out of Phnom Penh, further depleting the capital's strategic reserves.
The Cambodian military spokesman reported fighting had died down in the northwest around the provincial capital of Siem Reap and he said the government had declared nearby Angkor and its historic temple area an "open city."

A strong attack also was reported at Tonle Sap, 80 miles northeast of Phnom Penh, and this was considered possibly the prelude to new assaults on Kompung Cham, the provincial capital and regional military headquarters near the Mekong River.

SAN JUAN, Puerto Rico (AP) — Eight terrorist bombs exploded today in four hotels and a drug store on San Juan's Condado tourist strip.

Police alerted all hotels and stores in the area to search their premises for possibly further bombs.

Miguel Rivera, chief of the criminal investigation corps, said the bombs exploded within a 20-minute period beginning at 2:40 a.m.

The first bomb went off in the Condado Hotel drug store and the second in the gift shop of the same hotel, according to Rivera.

The third bomb exploded in the Corner drug store on Ashford avenue.

Two bombs each went off in the San Jeronimo Hotel and La Concha Hotel in the drug store and the gift shop of each.

The other bombs exploded in the Sheraton Hotel gift shop.

Damages have not been estimated, but police said the greatest damage was done in the Corner drug store. It is believed that more than one bomb was ignited in the drug store.
