Senate Votes To Repeal Tonkin Act

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate voted today to repeal the 1964 Gulf of Tonkin resolution, amid sharp debate over tactics being followed by Republican supporters of President Nixon's South Asia policy.

This is the resolution which President Lyndon B. Johnson used as authority to escalate the war against North Vietnam...

Nixon administration spokesmen have said the resolution is not relevant to present politics.

The Tonkin repeal move, long urged by war critics, came on an amendment by Sen. Robert J. Dole, R-Kan., who brought up the issue Monday as part of an emerging strategy to dispose of all matters dealing with South Asia now—rather than on later bills.

But outspoken war critics made clear in the debate they plan to bring up restrictive amendments on various authorization and appropriations bills due for consideration later this year...

The exchange was set off by Republican plans to call up for action a sweeping amendment designed to force an end to U.S. involvement in Southeast Asia...

Sen. George S. McGovern, D-S.D., chief sponsor of the so-called "amendment to end the war," charged such procedure would be "contemptuous of the normal Senate courtesy extended to the author of an amendment."

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Freshly polluted air drives rats down on their growth and makes them less active, a scientist reports...

Dr. Robert S. Fogard said results of his two-month study could not be directly related to humans because rats were exposed to constant pollution equal to constant auto exhaust during bumper-to-bumper traffic.

Ten rats exposed to 200 parts per million of carbon monoxide and other pollutants had a curtailed growth rate, decreased their spontaneous activity and chose alcohol over a three-hour liquid. Fogard said Tuesday.

Barnes To Fight in Primary For GOP gubernatorial nod

State Sen. Wallace Barnes of Farmington announced today that he will primary for the Republican nomination for governor.

He pledged to wage a "full-scale campaign" against Cong. Thomas Meskill of New Britain, the GOP State Convention's nominee for the post.

After a review of last week's events, Barnes said this morning in a State Capitol news conference, "It is clear that we must have a primary right now, if the Republican Party is going to re-establish even a semblance of credibility with the voters of this state."

Barnes qualified Saturday for an Aug. 12 primary by getting more than the required 50 per cent of the convention vote. The convention endorsed Meskill by a 79-25 vote.

Also expected to primary on Aug. 12 in State Sen. John Lupton, of West Hartford, filed a petition yesterday to primary against Gov. Lowell Walker of Greenwich for the U.S. senator nomination. Walker won the endorsement of the convention, but Lupton received the required 20 per cent of the vote.

Barnes said today that he is a Republican and that he has no plans to run as an independent. "I want to see the Republican Party in Connecticut in the Seventies lead the way back from extremes, both right and left, to a moderate center," he said.

He said he believes the ticket chosen Sunday morning for the five state offices below governor is "a competent ticket," and that he will have no difficulty in accepting it and in running with it.

He said there will be no effort to establish a coalition or liaison with Lupton. The two have had many ideological differences.

Barnes, without mentioning GOP State Chairman Howard Hansman by name, recommended a change in party leadership. "A more dynamic leadership is necessary to revitalize the Connecticut Republican Party," he insisted. He made no recommendation on a successor to Hansman.

The State Senate minority leader declined to estimate the cost of the primary campaign he will conduct. "The \$1,700 filing fee is our minimum, and we can go as high as we wish," he said. His campaign committee, he said, "will attempt to raise as much funds as possible."

He said that, although he was the underdog at the state convention, he doesn't consider himself an underdog in the primary. "It's an entirely new contest," he explained. "We both start even."

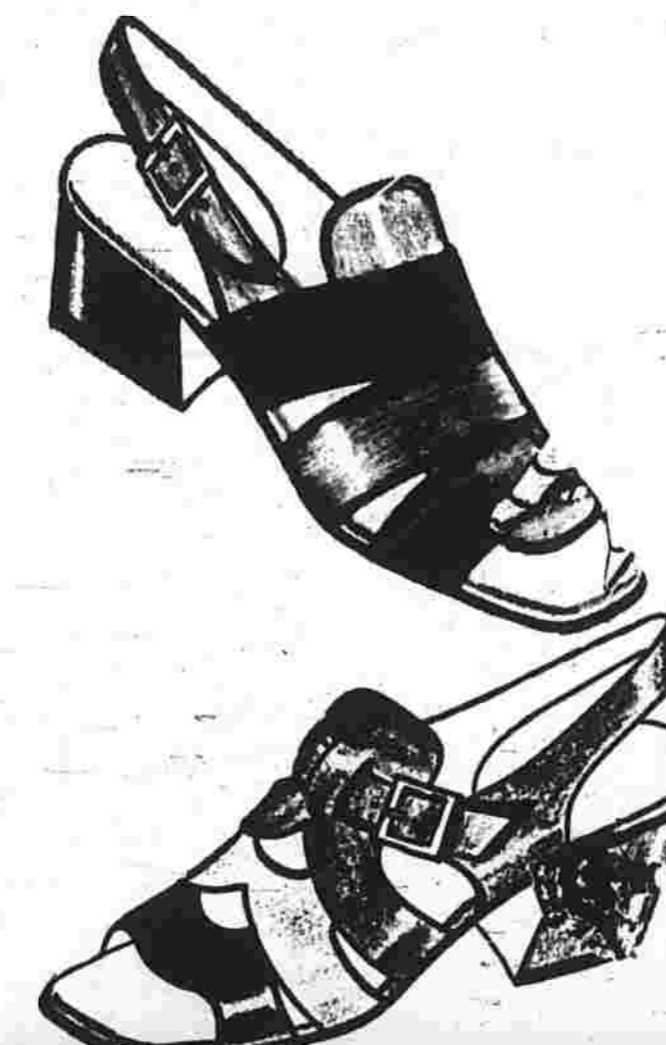

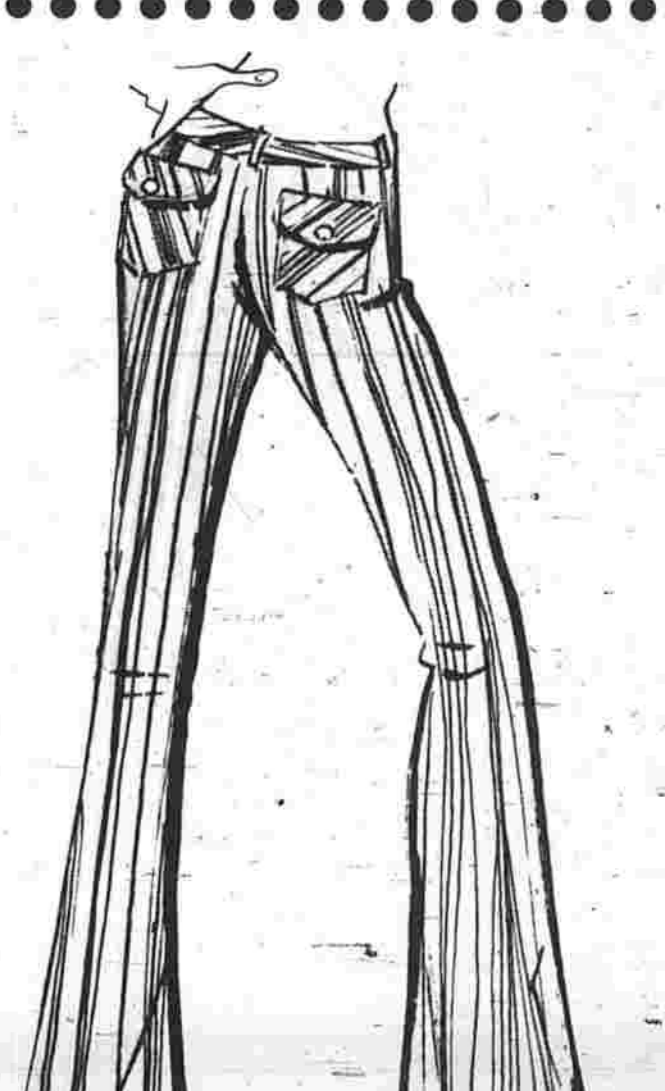

AMA Vows Long War Over Pill

CHICAGO (AP) — The American Medical Association has promised a broad legal and legislative battle against a plan by the Food and Drug Administration to include a health warning in packages of contraceptive pills.

But FDA Commissioner Charles C. Edwards defended the use of a key language warning about oral contraceptives as a "communications insurance policy" in the best interests of the patient.

The AMA's House of Delegates, meeting Tuesday at the organization's 119th annual convention, approved a resolution attacking the FDA plan as "a dangerous departure from present practice."

Dr. Edwards announced on June 10 that the health warning should be included with packages of the pill within 90 days.

The warning would point out possible dangerous side effects, such as an increased risk of blood clotting.

The AMA resolution asserted the proposal "intrudes on the patient-physician relationship" and would "interfere with the physician's decision to prescribe drugs by exerting undue influence."

Edwards, speaking to the Midwest Pharmaceutical Advertising Club, told the drug industry it would be "enlightened self interest" to supply more useful information about drugs in its medical communications to doctors.

"I think," the FDA chief said, "we tend to lose track of the fact that you are not selling new cars or new TVs, but rather you are selling products to professionals whose only reason for being is the health and well-being of the people."

As for the required warning on contraceptive pills, he said: "Our action was intended to supplement rather than intrude upon the normal doctor-patient relationship, and indeed in our judgment need not intrude. The physician has the same opportunity he has always had—to communicate with the patient at the time the prescription is written."

The provision for the language insert is rather a kind of single "communications insurance policy" in the patients' interest. The essential consideration in this case—for a physician, a manufacturer, and for FDA—had to be the protection of the patients' interest."

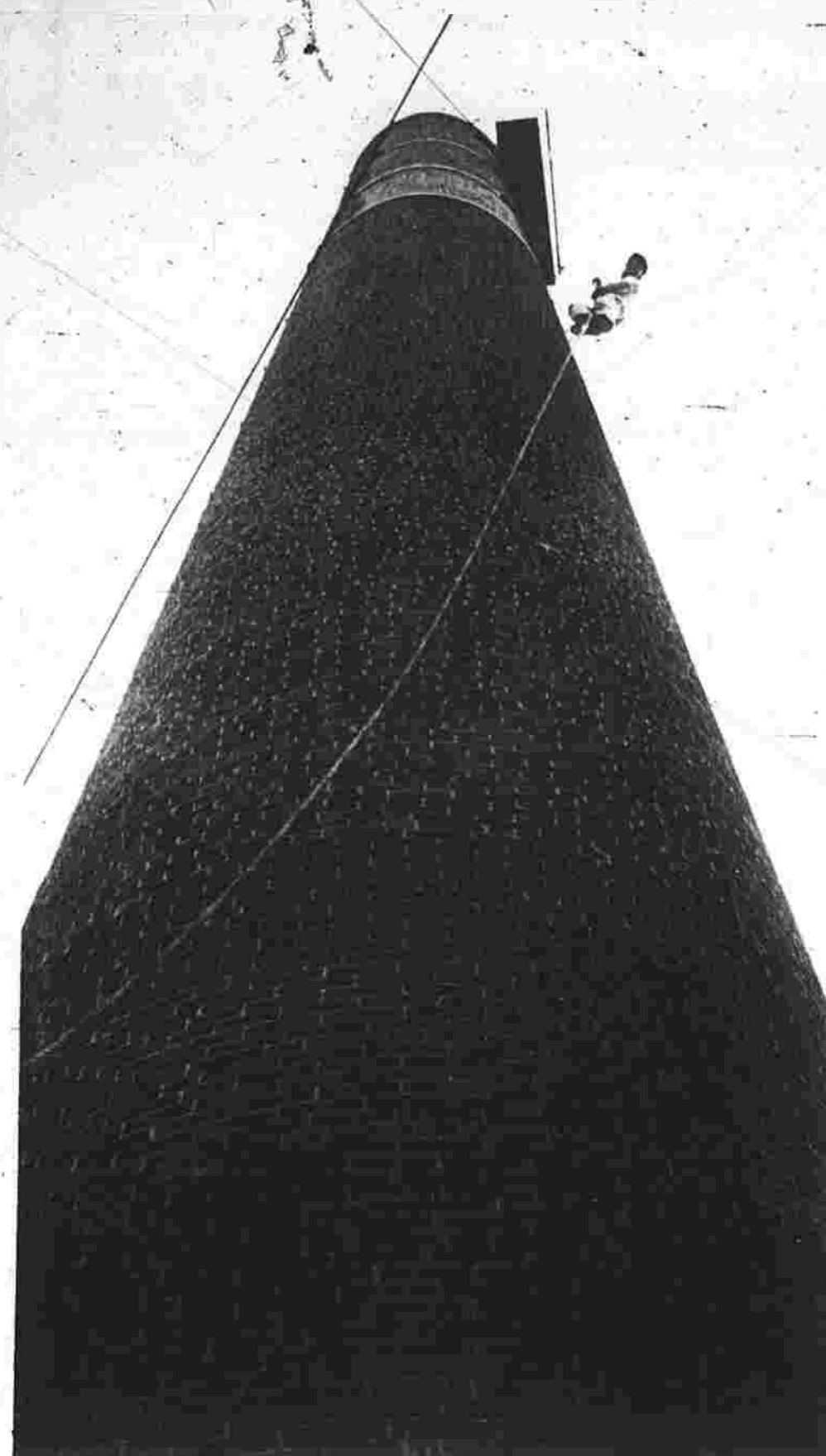

Three police cars were overturned, at least 100 demonstrators arrested and seven policemen and a number of demonstrators injured in that outbreak.

The 1968 riot came on the eve of the election of a new House of Commons.

Nader Seeks To Nail ITT On Contempt

HARTFORD, Conn. (AP) — Lawyers for consumer advocate Ralph Nader and for International Telephone and Telegraph clashed Tuesday in Superior Court over how to interpret a state law designed to prevent the takeover of this city's thriving insurance firms by out-of-state corporations.

Nader is trying to have ITT declared in contempt of court for violating the law.

His lawyers say the law should have prevented ITT from going through with its acquisition of the Hartford Fire Insurance Company as long as Nader was appealing the merger—but that ITT went ahead with the merger anyway.

—The merger was declared in effect last week by an ITT spokesman, who said that Hartford Fire stockholders had already offered to exchange their shares for 80 per cent of the insurance company's outstanding stock.

Under terms of an agreement approved by state insurance Commissioner William R. Corder on May 28, ITT was allowed to acquire Hartford Fire if 80 per cent or more of the insurance company's outstanding stock was offered voluntarily for exchange by the current holders.

The transaction involves about 1.5 billion dollars in stock value, and is one of the country's largest mergers.

Stamps In the News

The small villages of Oberammergau in the Bavarian Alps has become world famous as the home site of the religious Passion Plays. Every 10 years the local townspeople present this play with the individual parts handed down from family to family.

To honor the 100th performance marking the 80th time the Passion Play has been given in Oberammergau, the West German government has issued a special 20-pfennig stamp which reports the World Wide Philatelic Agency.

The origin of the Passion Play has its roots in the year 1380 when the Alpine village was threatened by the black plague then rampaging through Europe. The villagers prayed to be spared, pledging they would present this religious story every 10th year thereafter.

The new stamp depicting Oberammergau with its cuckoo-clock houses and Alpine scenery, is available at your local stamp dealer or stamp department.

The U.S. Bureau of Engraving and Printing is placing on sale a special 1-cent, glossy print of the "U.S. Flag and the Pledge of Allegiance." The full color reproduction is available at 75 cents each, including handling charges and postage.

Orders must be accompanied by the proper remittance in the form of a check or money order made to the Bureau of Engraving and Printing, Office Service Branch, 14th and C Streets, S.W., Washington, D.C. 20540.

The 1970 National Postage Stamp Show, largest of all annual philatelic events, has been scheduled for Nov. 20, 21 and 22 in New York's Madison Square Garden Center. The big show is sponsored by the American Stamp Dealers Association.

The A.S.D.A. reports that the 1970 event will be slightly modified to assist visitors in their quest of dealers' booths, browsing in the lounges of the philatelic societies, attending stamp displays and lecture hall programs.

To commemorate the 25th anniversary of the signing of the United Nations Charter, the U.N. will issue three stamps and a souvenir sheet with first-day covers postmarked at U.N. Headquarters in New York and at San Francisco on June 26.

The U.S. government has agreed to allow its own postal set up to issue first day cancellations at New York and at San Francisco. Usually only United Nations stamps can be issued within the confines of its headquarters in New York, but an exception was made five years ago to postmark stamps honoring the 50th anniversary.

The 6-cent and 12-cent stamps bear the same design of the olive branch while the 25-cent stamp shows the UN emblem inside a gold border. Both have inscriptions "Peace and Progress 1970." The souvenir sheet containing all three stamps is 44 cents.

Remittance to cover the cost of the stamps to be affixed, plus a 5-cent service charge for each stamp, must be enclosed in either money order or certified check. The outside envelope must be clearly marked "FDC-25th N.Y." or "San Francisco." All orders should be sent to United Nations Headquarters, New York, N.Y. 10017, prior to June 26.

Voters Free School Board From Old Deficit Shackles

As a result of town meeting action, the Board of Education for the first time in two years, will start operations on their 1970-71 budget without having to carry over a deficit from the previous year.

At that time, funds were requested in the amount of \$5,000 for an additional kindergarten bus in order that round-trip transportation could be provided.

However, the board decided to operate on the basis that according to state law, transportation round-trip must be provided since kindergarten is now required by the state.

Residents also approved a \$1,000 appropriation from surplus to the Cafeteria Fund to cover a deficit incurred this year.

Also, the Board of Education is forming a special committee to study the program and present recommendations which might enable the program to be self-supporting as was originally planned.

Residents also accepted a gift from London Park, Inc. of three parcels of land, totaling approximately 30 acres, in the Forest Park subdivision.

John Hibbard, chairman of the Conservation Commission, explained how the commission has had an "interest" in this property since 1968.

Hibbard stated that upon learning the entire section was available, he and Thornton, senior state conservation commission agent, checked the proposition and both felt that it would be "in the interest of the town to own it."

Under the new ordinance, any person, firm, partnership or corporation wishing to peddle, sell or solicit goods or merchandise would first have to apply to the town clerk for a license.

The fee for each application will be \$2 a day or \$10 a year, in advance, except for residents of Hebron who have resided in town for six months or more who will be exempt from payment of a fee.

Both are middle aged. Tuesday's selections were the first from a new pool of 37 prospective jurors ordered summoned last week by Judge Har-

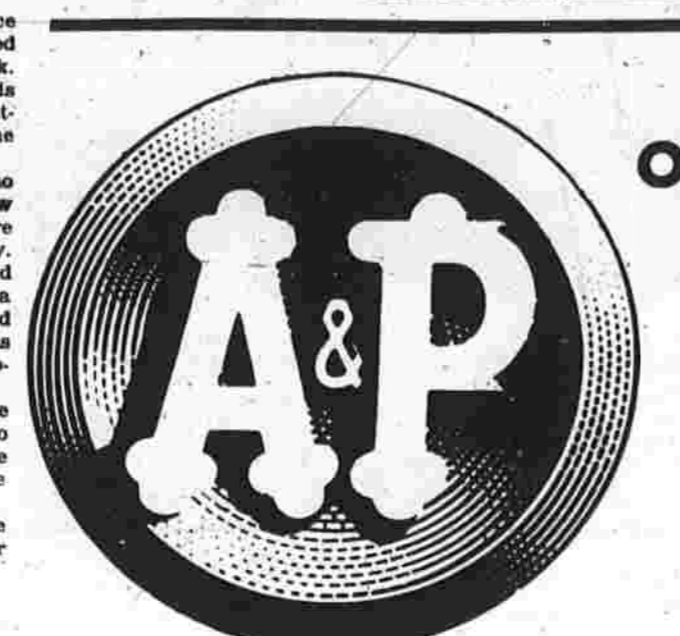
Proposed Amendments 'Need Clearer Labels'

Mrs. Grasso said Tuesday she is ordering explanatory phrases inserted after the titles of the proposed amendments to make clear just what their effect would be.

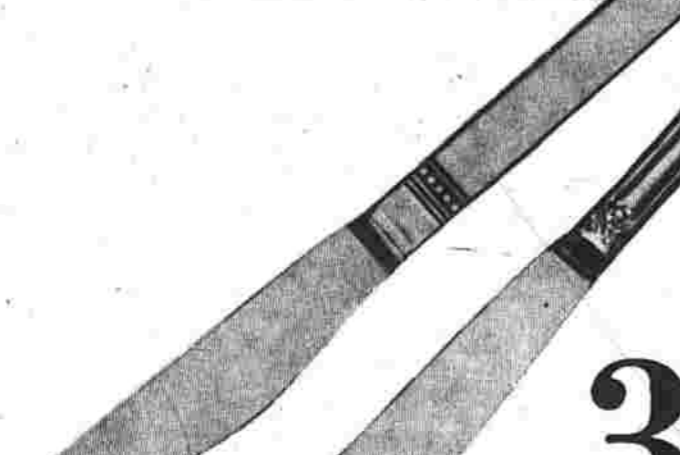
The League of Women Voters had pointed out that the title of one amendment, "Concerning the qualifications of electors" does not give people a very good idea of what they are voting on.

Andover Highway Earns a 'No' In Concerned Town

It would seem that the people of Andover do not want a major highway going through their town. That is, if it can be considered that the 130 people who attended an open hearing on I-84 Monday night, as representing the feeling of the town.

The meeting was called by the Andover League of Women Voters, to provide information regarding the path of I-84 which might affect the town.

A study has been made by the Planning & Zoning Commission, the Conservation Commission and the Andover Volunteer Fire Dept. The report has been submitted to the state.

The selectmen have also submitted a report to the state and this was presented at the meeting Monday.

The Andover League of Women Voters has endorsed the combined report. It became increasingly obvious as the meeting progressed that many people approved of the report because as each action was read and explained, it received applause.

River Valley

A summary of the combined report states: "The positive and negative effects of proposed I-84 in general, and corridors A, A-1, B and C in particular, have been considered. Corridor A is the preferred route, and is the most desirable, and is the most important, asset to this area, and being irreplaceable, must remain intact. The proper development of the town around the Hop River Valley requires that the proposed highway not encroach on the central core area of the town. All aspects of the highway being in Andover, compared with access thereto only in Columbia and Bolton, are negative. There are no positive aspects which are not equally fulfilled by the highway passing Andover entirely within Coventry."

The combined report also offered proposed alternate corridors, C-1, A-2 and A-3. Corridor A-2 illustrates the potential for lowering the impact on the Skingamog River and the Times Farm Camp. Corridor A-3 illustrates the junction with existing construction at Bolton. It also enhances potential development of suitable areas of Coventry. Corridor C-1 is offered as a less offensive entry into Andover from the southern route in Bolton.

Disruption

Regarding fast, safe and efficient transportation, the report stresses that inasmuch as corridors A-1, B and C could not be provided with an interchange centrally located within the town of Andover without excessive disruption of the development of the town, the use of any of these corridors for limited town travel terminating directly in Andover is believed to be impossible.

The report states: "Thus, as far as intertown travel along proposed I-84 is concerned, the further north the road goes, the better it will be for the population density of the area in general, including Coventry and Borden. It also states, regarding economic activity, "All significant or critical transportation activity relative to economic activity of the town would be as served by accesses to the highway in Bolton and Columbia, with the highway not even passing through the town."

Open Space

The major emphasis of questioning was based on concern as to how the possible corridors might affect the recreational open space areas and water resources within the town. It is evident that if I-84 is built along any of the corridors, A, A-1, B or C, without modifications to some of the town's nature areas will be adversely affected.

In the report, it states: "The most significant recreational and open space area is the Hop River Valley itself. The Hop River is considered to be one of the few remaining 'clean' rivers within the state; the Capitol Region Planning Agency Land Use and Open Space plans. It is indicated as an important water course for recreation and ecological purposes. This area is used by residents of all the surrounding towns for fishing, canoeing and swimming, and is stocked by the state Board of Fisheries and Game each year."

It also states, "The town of Andover has purchased eight acres including the town garage and yard which is adjacent to the Hop River at Long Hill Road. This acreage includes clean and water rights to a significant pond area can be developed along three tenths to a half mile of the Hop River."

Public Park

"One of the considerations in the purchase of this land was the ultimate goal of a public and office."
