

Apartment Major Subject Of Planning Board Tonight

Proposed new density regulations for apartments will be the subject of a public hearing at 7:30 in the Municipal Building tonight.

The amendments set a ratio of living area to site area and state that the amount of living area in an apartment complex must not exceed 15 per cent of the total site.

The living area has been defined as "the total private floor space contained within the walls of a unit."

The effect of the regulations would be to limit the amount of floor space in buildings, thus limiting the number of bedrooms that could be constructed in any given project.

The 15 per cent regulation would not attempt to control the design or the number of bedrooms per unit, but because of the ratio, if more bedrooms were constructed, more living area would be used.

For example, the new regulations would allow only seven units in a two-bedroom project.

The existing regulations allow 17 units per acre, except in areas where they are 2 to 4 and 630 to 8 p.m.

PARIS (AP) — Several thousand American students found themselves momentarily stranded in Europe today after their airlines were grounded.

"Nobody has been stranded," asserted T. Budge Hyde, acting president of the World Academy, the ill-fated tour group.

"They are all safely housed in their accommodations and they have their plane reservations home." Hyde said.

"We are no longer financially able to meet commitments for transportation and accommodation," a statement from the organization said. An attorney said the firm had assets of about \$200,000 and debts of \$4 million.

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South Windsor Post-Mortem on Blackout: All of Town on One System

The squirrel who was responsible for a town wide blackout last Tuesday was a subject of a post-mortem held at a meeting last night. Mayor Howard Pitts inquired as to why the whole town was affected by the blackout as it had not been in previous years the Avery St. substation was affected by a squirrel who had gnawed its way through a main line of the town.

A Connecticut Light and Power official explained that up until about a year and a half ago, the Avery area was tied in with the Rockville system, thus maintaining the convenience of darkness. However, due to the growth of Rockville it became impossible for that town to supply power to the Avery section.

This area is presently tied in with the main power station at the corner of Strong Rd. and John Fitch Blvd. (Rt. 9). The squirrel got into the station and between two towers and caused a short circuit and shutting the bushing.

A temporary system has been set up and transformers are being utilized until permanent repair can be made. The changeover will cause no further inconvenience to the town, the CL&P spokesman said.

The Town Council approved a resolution to extend the existing power line from the Rt. 9 to the Avery St. area, and to install a trunk line there, with the estimated cost of \$200,000.

The much larger region, the Avery Brook basin area, will provide service to property owners on various streets in the Birch Hill and Pine Knoll sections. Also included in this drainage area would be the Timothy Edwards School and the estimated cost would be \$2,270,000.

The crossover line that would tie in with the present sewer line terminates three miles away from the town. The sewer line will be laid July 20 in the Council Chambers of the Town Hall on Adams Backstreet and Clark St. The estimated cost is \$2,067,000.

Russians Like Americans, Until They Become Adults

By WILLIAM L. RYAN MOSCOW (AP) — Some thoughts on revisiting the Soviet Union... Maybe the big trouble in Soviet-American relations is that Russian kids grow up to be Russian adults.

It seems to an American, especially if he is with a group of his compatriots, that wherever he goes the kids love him. They have learned to ask for such things as balloons and chewing gum. They ask eager, innocent questions. They avidly swap Soviet coins—and even their fathers' assorted medals.

The kids are not above a dash of old-fashioned state capitalism. For example, Ubelok youngsters in Tashkent, the central Asian cotton capital, swiped flowers from the park, made them into bouquets and did a thrifty business selling them to tourists.

For one who has been in the Soviet Union on previous occasions, it quickly becomes apparent that the Communist party and Soviet government are still, as ever, plagued by old economic ills. The black market in goods and money remains rampant. The official value of the ruble, 1:1, is in terms of purchasing power far below that of the dollar.

In a Moscow restaurant an elegant waiter, finding an American tourist getting lost, asked him to guide him to the hotel. "Beep, beep, beep," he said, "I'll take you to the hotel. I'll take you to the hotel. I'll take you to the hotel."

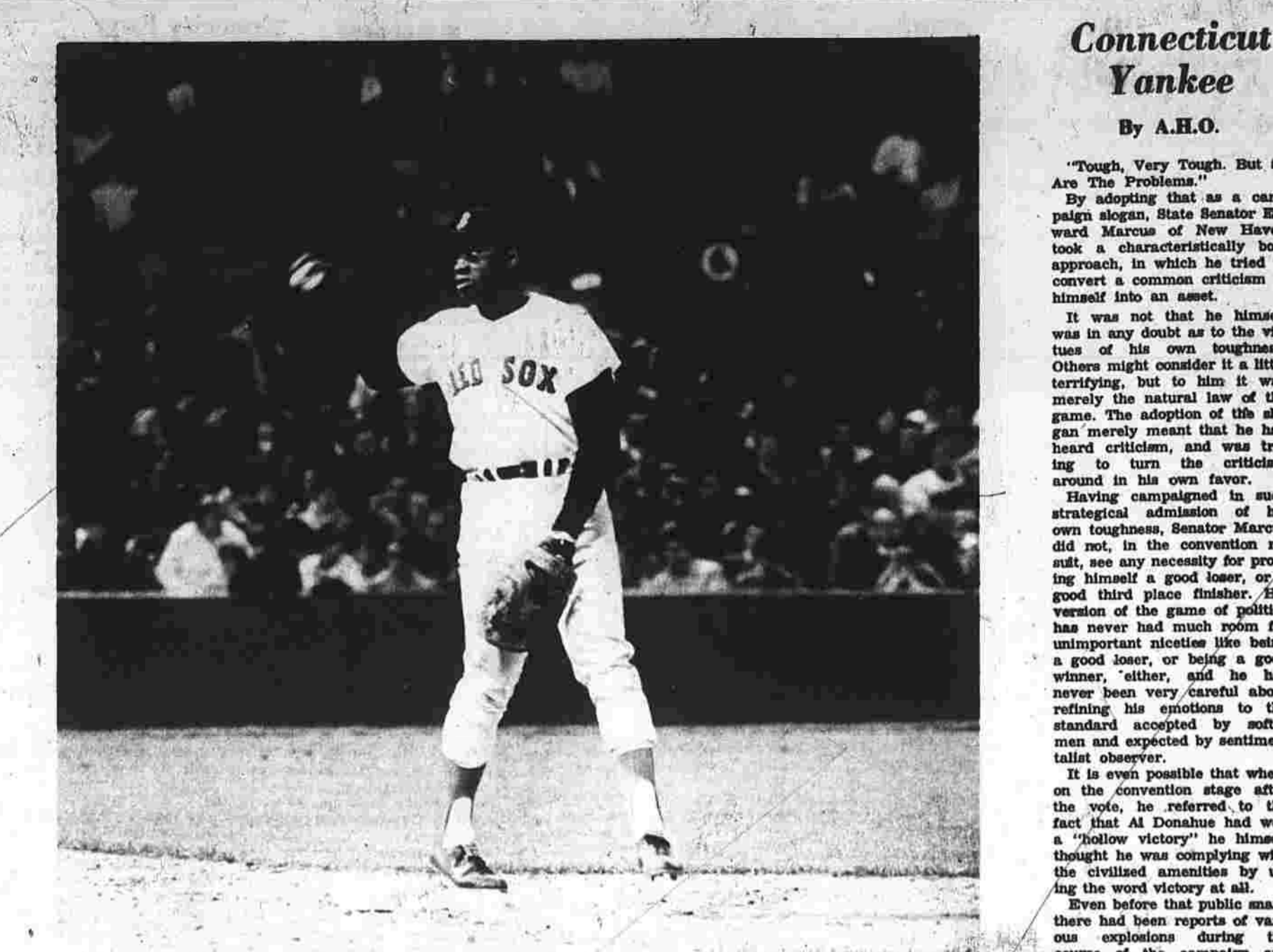
From the field in Cambodia, in a news story from Peter R. Kann of the Wall Street Journal, comes what would be the proper scenario for a light comic opera of the kind which was in Southeast Asia—if that is, anybody ever forgot the seriousness of the conflict and the lives being lost in it daily and thus have freedom to enjoy its comic aspects.

The South Vietnamese commander told Correspondent Kann how his troops had swept into town "killing 148 enemy troops and capturing 4,025 weapons. He proudly reports, had been turned over to the Cambodian Army in a ceremony the day before."
