Those Connecticut residents who turned 20 years of age on or after June 5 have been protected each day of their lives by the nation's only all-state free blood program.

In the first year of the program, the statewide total of donations was 63,733 pints, which was used mostly as whole blood. Last year, the total number of pints collected in Connecticut was 128,217.

The goal of the program is to keep on hand at all times enough blood to fulfill the needs of every hospital in the state.

WASHINGTON (AP) — Vice President Spiro T. Agnew is expected to lead a new flight with senators who favor a withdrawal from Vietnam, returning to Asia this weekend to reassess American allies in the Nixon administration.

Bill Collectors Prospering As Economy Grows Sluggish

NEW YORK (AP) — Bill collecting is one business that has prospered from the economic downturn, credit experts say.

The American Collectors Association—ACA—reports that last month delinquent accounts referred by businessmen to its 2,600 member agencies last month was 20 per cent higher than a year earlier and the third highest for any month in history.

The rising cost of living, tight money, layoffs and uncertainty about job security have caused credit authorities as reasons some consumers are either slower in paying their bills or failing to pay them altogether.

"People are being laid off and seasonal workers are finding it harder to get jobs. Where there's a lot of uncertainty about what's going to happen, the consumer holds onto money as long as he can," says an ACA spokesman.

"People have built up a tolerance for nonpayment," adds Morton Goldberg, a New York attorney specializing in bill collections. "Since the beginning of the year, there's been more and more of this. People have the money but won't part with it."

W. G. Hecker, general credit manager for J. C. Penney Co., says, "We see a moderate increase in the number of delinquents—people who haven't made payments on a first or second mortgage, or a car loan. We've noticed this increase over the last 18 months."

Again, the driver failed to take a hands-off policy. But when a girl was struck in the eye and injured, the bus company was held liable in court. The judge said the driver had an affirmative duty to halt this dangerous game.

Nevertheless, since he is not really a policeman, he does not have to go out of his way to search for trouble. Thus, an intoxicated passenger jabbed a large pin into another man's hip. The indignant victim later demanded damages from the bus company, pointing out that his attacker had been quite red-nosed and profane even before throwing the pin.

But it also appeared that the fellow had been sitting far back in the bus, and that the driver had simply not been aware of his misbehavior. Accordingly, the court found no grounds for placing blame upon the driver.

"His primary duty," said the judge, "is to give his full attention to the operation of the bus. If he concentrates upon this important duty, he cannot give attention to the actions of the passengers unless so unusual as to demand it."

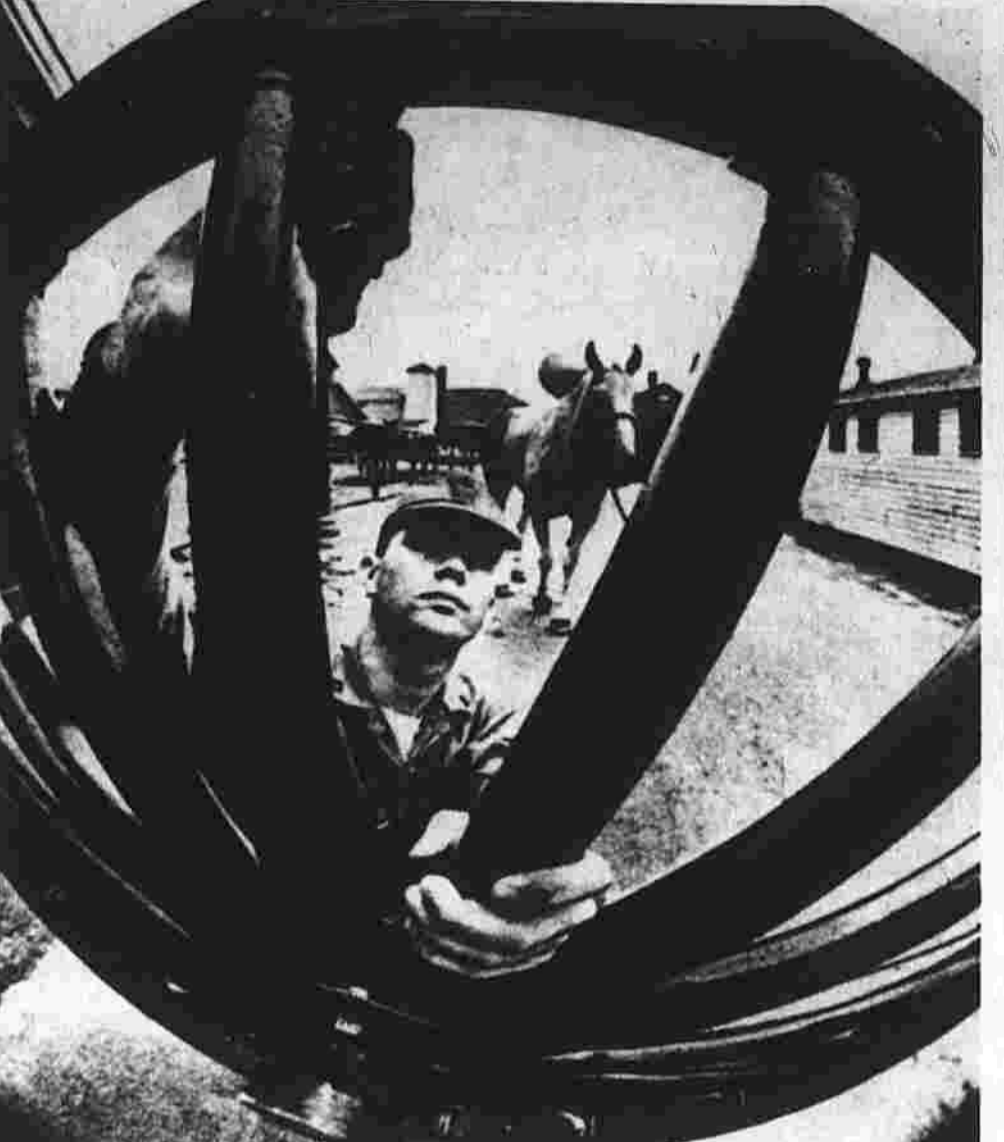

The Nixon-Agnew Campaign

By SPIRO T. AGNEW Vice President Of The United States Special To The Washington Post

WASHINGTON—I welcome the opportunity to make some observations about economic developments and policy that I believe have been getting through to the public in most recent newspaper commentary.

To understand what is now going on in our economy, it is important that we realize our economic system is having to make not one but two major adjustments simultaneously. It is having to adjust to a major decline in defense spending while it is also coping with a long inflationary overheat that had become increasingly dangerous.

The adjustment in defense spending is a far greater loss on the economy than many people realize. From 1968 to mid-1970 defense spending has been reduced over 12 billion (\$ billions in terms of this year's prices), and by mid-1971 the reductions will approach 30 billion (\$ billions).

Now this is a massive reduction, even in our large economy. It means that defense outlays in real terms by mid-1971 will be almost back to the 1965 level. Since the economy in 1971 will be larger than in 1965, this obviously means that defense will be receiving a substantially smaller share of our total output than in 1965 before the Vietnam conflict.

This is a massive re-ordering of priorities. While some have been busy creating jobs, the need for this, the President has been busy doing something about it.

These shifts, of course, cause some painful dislocations. They mean jobs and careers terminated in defense plants and defense laboratories. Such reductions tend to hit selected professions and skills and regions of the country far harder than reductions in general budget outlays, whose effects would be spread more evenly.

These problems were foreseen and would have been less painful if the Congress had acted more promptly on administrative proposals — in some cases made over a year ago — for expanding and strengthening the unemployment compensation system, for more extensive and effective manpower training programs, and for a revolutionary new approach to family assistance.

Early this year the President also sent to the Congress legislation to stimulate housing, and its earlier enactment would have augmented job opportunities in our lumber producing states, which have had to bear more than their share of reduced defense employment. The President recognized early that both rational economic policy and simple humane required programs to soften the transition problems of those who would be affected by reduced defense spending.

The economy has also had to face the transition from complex and tangled problems created by the inflationary overheat that ran unrestrained after 1963. Interest rates began to soar in 1968 as people, fearful of inflation, turned away from bonds and mortgages. The stock market and its institutions were whipsawed in a tragic way — forced to over-expand as the inflation caused a frenzy of buying, then forced into a painful contraction as the market inevitably receded from the stratosphere. This was all doubly tragic because many small savers were buried into stock purchases, and housing

declined as normal savings flows into savings and loan associations and other institutions dried up.

The problems posed for economic policy by this double-layered adjustment were formidable. A strategy of policy had to be devised that would cool off the economy but keep within tolerable limits the adverse effect on output, incomes, and employment.

How did we succeed? Far better than the prose often professed to us might imply. Suppose, for a change, we skip the rhetoric and simply examine the facts.

First, the myth that we are in a recession. The current adjustment is clearly far less severe than that of 1960-61, the mildest postwar adjustment that economists have had a recession. It is closer to, but slightly more severe than, the 1960-67 adjustment, which has not been deemed to be a recession.

It is now about 6 months since this adjustment began, and industrial production has declined 1.6 per cent in this 6-month period. In the comparable period during 1966-67 the decline was only slightly smaller, 1.2 per cent. For 1960-61, however, the corresponding decline was 4.1 per cent (and for 1967-68, 11.9 per cent).

The picture would be broadly similar for such other general monthly measures of the economy as personal income or employment. So we are hardly in a recession.

Next, the problem of inflation. There has of course been some pressure against inflation. The rates of increase in the wholesale price index and the consumer price index of the consumer price index are both slightly smaller. It has actually been slowing this year. On this the facts are clear.

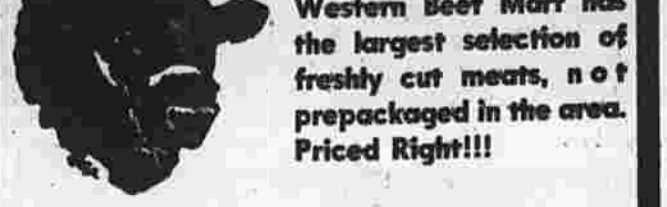

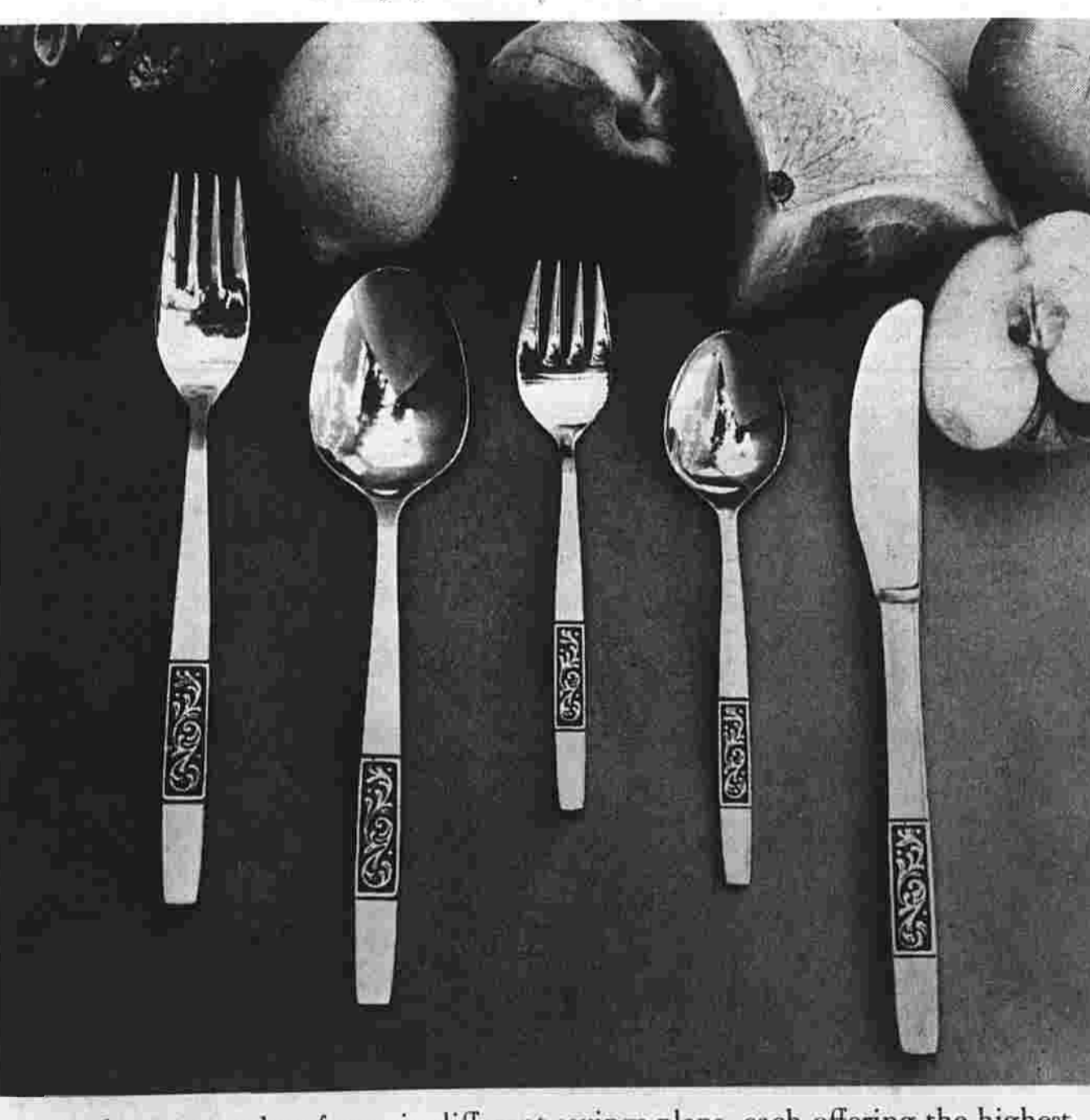

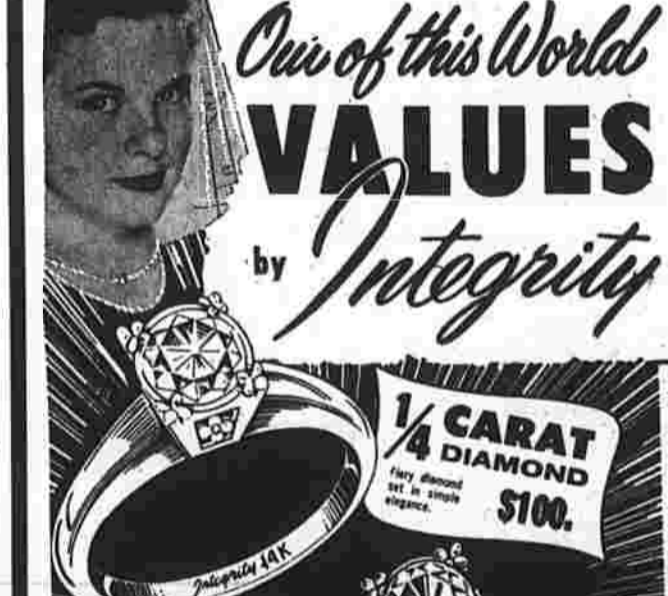

Bond Votes Authorized

The Board of Directors last night authorized for a Nov. 3 referendum four proposed bond issues totaling \$4,784,000. The four items that will be questions on the voting machines are: (1) a school program for additions and renovations to Robertson, Nathan Hale, and Keeney St. schools \$1,996,000; (2) a highway improvement program — \$3,700,000; (3) a sidewalk construction and improvement program — \$970,000; and (4) acquisition of properties by the Special Downtown Taxing District, for off-street parking — \$185,000.

Tie Vote Rejects Water Bond Plan

The Board of Directors last night rejected the proposed bond issue to finance a water department capital improvement program. The vote was four for, Deputy Mayor David Odagard voted with the Democratic minority to defeat the resolution to place the bond question before the voters.

Five votes are required to authorize the item for a referendum. Director Wayne Manz was not present to vote. Also rejected were proposed bonds for storm sewer improvement, and development of Robertson Park. The amount of the proposed water improvement program was on the agenda as \$2 million, but an alternate plan calling for \$1.1 million was discussed. The Republican directors, including Odagard, voted to support the \$1.1 million program, which would allow improvements in water supply, distribution, and quality, if passed.

The proposed amendment to the resolution by Pietranonio, which would put the bond issue on a referendum next April, was defeated. The \$1.1 million alternate was prepared by O'Neill to complement a revised schedule of proposed water rates requested by the Board of Directors Aug. 4. At a public hearing on that date, the board ordered the proposed water rate hike of about 30 per cent to be "excessive."

O'Neill then prepared the new rate schedule for consideration. Since the increase with the revised schedule is about 38 per cent, the capital improvement program also had to be scaled down. An amount that could be financed with a 38 per cent rate hike. On Aug. 4, the directors tabled action on the proposed rate increase until after a possible referendum on the improvement program Nov. 3. Since the improvement program was rejected, it is possible that water rates will remain the same, but the sewer department is facing a substantial deficit in the current fiscal year.

Life-Saver Medication May Aid Blood Pressure

WASHINGTON AP — A demonstrated beneficial effects of the daily dosages outweigh the undesirable ones.

Dr. Edward Fries reported the results of a study in which 25 other VA doctors collaborated. The study consisted of two types of treatment for high blood pressure. One was a combination of hydrochlorothiazide and reserpine. The other consisted of a highly beneficial in mild and moderate cases.

Specifically, evidence shows that such drugs can cut death rates sharply and reduce or essentially eliminate certain serious complications, said Fries who is with the Washington, D.C., VA Hospital.

The new evidence was obtained, he said, during a five-year cooperative study conducted among 300 male patients at 16 of VA's 160 hospitals throughout the country.

High blood pressure—technically known as hypertension—affects at least 20 million Americans, and is the second most common cause of death in the United States. Most suffer mild or moderate cases.

But he said that use of readily available drugs to treat them has been a subject of medical controversy, despite striking benefits demonstrated for more severe cases.

At least half of the mild and moderate cases fall in the potentially dangerous category, which could lead to death or serious complications such as congestive heart failure or cerebral strokes, Fries said.

The doctor said only about 15 percent are on effective drug treatment.

He listed two reasons: —Many doctors have been reluctant to use the drugs for mild or moderate cases for fear of adverse side-effects. But Fries said the new VA studies have

PZC Moves to Prevent Clusters of Gas Stations

The Planning and Zoning Commission (PZC) agreed Monday night to amend the present zoning regulations, adding a section which would place a 2,000-foot limit between gas stations.

The additional section is designed to prevent the growing clusters of gas stations on corners of busy intersections.

Also included in the proposed section is a requirement that no gas station be located within 1,000 feet of a lot used or reserved for any public or parochial school, hospital, church, public library, playground park or youth center.

An additional section would forbid a gasoline company from opening or building a new station in town if it has an existing empty one elsewhere in town.

The existing regulations regarding lot size, building requirements, etc., will continue to come under the present commercial regulations.

One station is not permitted in any zone except commercial.

The proposed regulations were modeled after the town of Enfield's and were the object of research by PZC member Douglas Prior following a discussion of the ratio of gas stations to population in town at present.

The ratio of one station for each 616 residents is out of proportion to the average throughout the state.

The PZC also reviewed building plans for the gas station proposed for the corner of Rt. 106 and Goose Lane, a location already approved by the Zoning Board of Appeals.

Several revisions will have to be made on the plans as submitted including increasing the lot size to meet the town's minimum 60,000 square feet.

The building setback line has to be moved back to meet the 75 feet from the property line requirement, and the wall must be moved further away from the septic tank to meet state requirements.

Landscaping plans will also be required. The company has provided contour maps of the property, and has indicated where it will install several catch basins and curbs to prevent water runoff from entering neighboring property.

The PZC also discussed the need for some type of planning for the town's growth, after noting U.S. Census Bureau statistics showing Tolland to be the second fastest-growing town in the state, during the past decade.

They referred to neighboring Coventry's full time governmental employees while the town is only slightly larger with about 4,200 residents compared to Tolland's 7,864.

Although it was generally agreed any plan to be successful will have to involve the general community, no agreements were reached on what actions to take.

The next meeting of the Planning and Zoning Commission will be held Aug. 31.
