Bitter Battle Jars Capital of Jordan

The central telephone and post office building in the capital of Jordan was battle-scarred but quiet today after a night of bitter fighting between Palestinian guerrillas and Jordanian army troops.

The government issued no communique on the incident, but the guerrillas reported two guerrillas killed. The commandos were in control of the building at one point but were edily withdrawn on orders from guerrilla chief Yasser Arafat.

The street outside the post office was littered with broken glass and plaster this morning. The walls of nearby buildings were pockmarked with bullet holes.

Hardly a window was left intact in the glass facade of the building, located on one of Amman's main streets.

Guerrillas in patrol cars cruised elsewhere in the capital today but avoided the post office.

Government troops also kept close guard of the post office.

The fighting began three hours after the closing session of the Palestinian National Council in the wake of the oil, Palestinian parliament meeting in Amman.

The council issued a firm resolution of the American peace initiative in the Middle East. It also urged such a force to guarantee peace between Israel and the Arabs.

U.S. Troops In Mideast No New Idea

Panther Case Deliberations Still Continue

NEW HAVEN, Conn. (AP)—Deliberations entered the fourth day today in the trial of Black Panther Lennie McClucas, charged with conspiracy and kidnaping in the death of a fellow Panther.

Young supporters of McClucas demonstrated on the New Haven courthouse for more than two hours today.

The two blacks and 10 whites on the jury were kept Friday a half hour past the 5 p.m. recess time of the previous two days since they received the case.

The six men and six women on the jury emerged once Friday to ask for a rereading of the judge's instructions regarding two conspiracy charges against McClucas.

McClucas, 24, is charged with kidnaping resulting in death, conspiracy to kidnap and to murder, and binding with criminal intent in the May 1969 death of Panther Alex Rackley.

The conspiracy instructions reread by the judge noted that a conspiracy existed "if the parties understood each other concerning their treatment of Rackley, even though they did not voice that understanding."

McClucas, former Panther organizer in Connecticut, testified that he did not know Rackley would be tortured at Panther headquarters here. He also denied knowing that Rackley would be shot 2 1/2 days later in a rural swamp.

The defendant claimed that the alternative would be a not guilty verdict.

Girl from India Calls Convent Life 'Slavery'

NEW DELHI (AP)—A girl from Kerala state says she worked "like a slave" from morning 'til evening washing wards and patients in a mental hospital near Rome' during nine months at an Italian convent, a New Delhi newspaper reported today.

Anna Thomas Elakkattu told the Statesman that the Rev. Cyril Puthapura promised her she would be trained in medicine at the convent, "not only to become a nurse but even a doctor."

But "there was no teaching, no education, only the slavery of washing floors and patients in the mental hospital throughout the day," the paper quoted her as saying in an interview.

The Indian government impounded Father Puthapura's passport Friday pending an investigation of charges that he and other Roman Catholic officials profited from sending 1,000 nuns to European convents. The Church has denied the allegations, saying the convents paid only travel expenses for the girls.

The newspaper interviewed Miss Elakkattu at her home, 10 miles from Father Puthapura's Nirmala Bhavan Secular Institute in Ettumaran, Kerala, in southwest India.

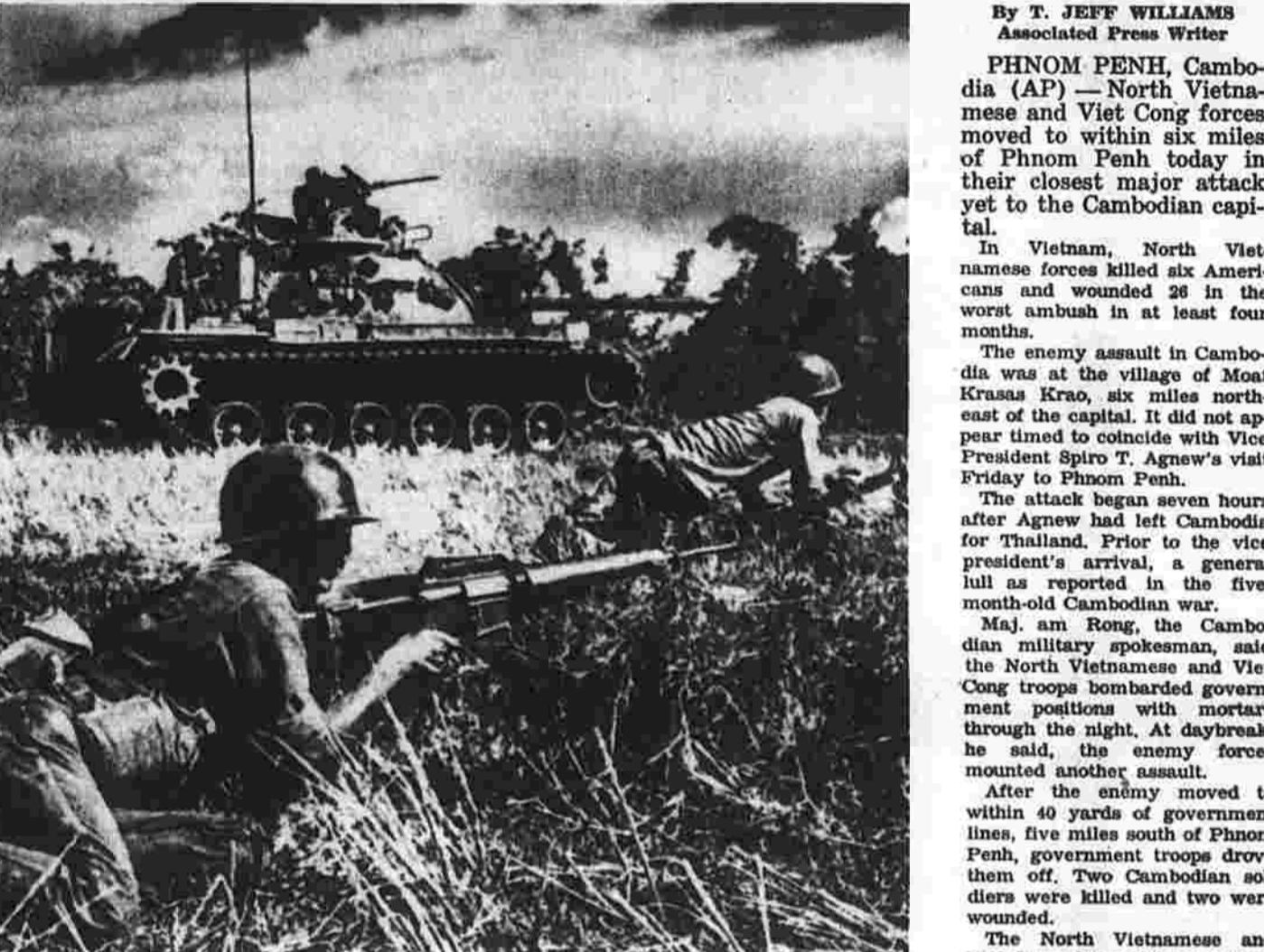

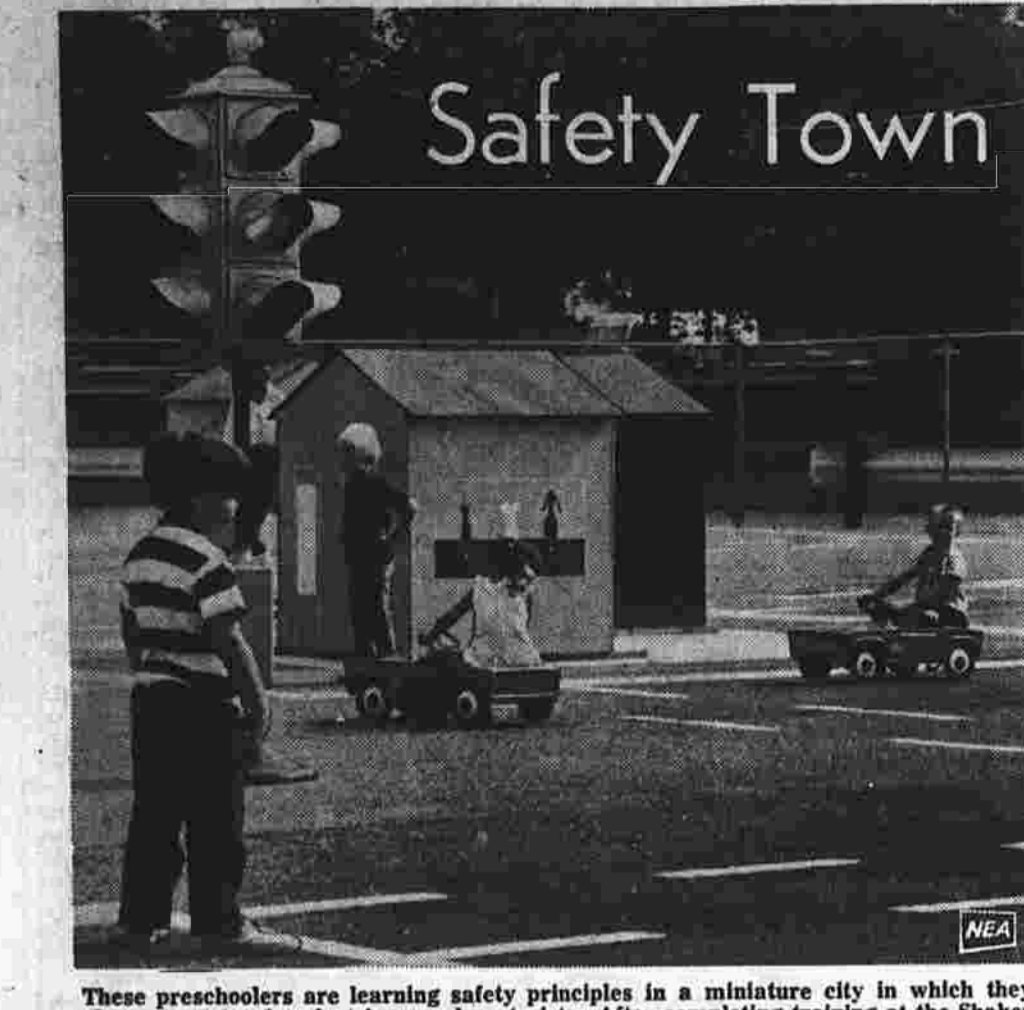

Ironsides Enters Select Group

She Prays...

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — If a television series can survive its third season, it is a going concern, an established hit. And nobody is going to do much tinkering with the machinery of success.

"Ironsides," the NBC cops-and-robbers series, is in that situation.

Raymond Burr, in the title role, will continue to grow lovably from his wheel chair.

A word has leaked out that Barbara Anderson will have new wardrobe of more colorful clothes this season—but that's okay because although she plays a low salaried policewoman aide, she is also supposed to be a rich socialite.

The two Dons—Galloway and Mitchell—who play Ironsides' devoted male helpers, will hit the same familiar notes: One earnest and dogged, the other short-fused and stiff-necked.

It is pleasant and profitable to be involved with such a series. The headache comes in sitting for pre-season interviews to talk about a show that by design will be unchanged from previous seasons.

Burr was pulled away from a scheduled interview for an emergency production meeting about his contribution to a Red Skelton show, postponed because Skelton had wrenched his back a few days earlier. Galloway and Mitchell, both on short vacations and busy with private concerns, jumped loyally if not enthusiastically into the breach.

"I think you will find this season that the relationships are more solid," began Galloway, almost diffidently.

"What does that mean?" asked the reporter.

There was a longish pause and Galloway said: "There's one show in which Sgt. Brown—that's me—has a confrontation with Ironsides. There's another in which there's a fight between Brown and Mark Sanger, that's Don Mitchell here."

Another pause, until Mitchell cautiously picked up another thread.

"When you're in your fourth year, you have to keep acting," he observed.

Very long pause this time, followed by conversation unrelated to Ironsides' cases: Children, home repairs, a Sammy Davis party.

Just as the off-camera Burr bears no resemblance to Ironsides (or Perry Mason), the buttoned-down Sgt. Brown and the dark-skinned Sanger are completely unlike the actors who play them.

Galloway is a casual, light-hearted fellow who ambles around in well-worn shirts and faded jeans. He was nursing an ugly gouge on the hand suffered putting up a wooden bookcase on his wall and kept glancing at his watch so he wouldn't be late for a circus matinee with his daughters, 5 and 3 years old.

Mitchell, who comes off a bit hostile on screen is agreeable and—until mid-afternoon—sleepy. He's one of the night people, in love with stage acting and most interested in producing.

Burr, who learned through nine years of "Perry Mason" to really lead two distinct lives, has far-flung interests that range from a copra plantation in the Fijis to modern art.

Lawyers Pop Up Here and There

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — CBS, on Sept. 16, will drop a new series into its channels, "Storefront

Lawyers." This should not be confused—although it almost certainly will be—with "The Young Lawyers," a new series which ABC will launch less than a week later.

ABC spun its series off a two-hour made-for-TV feature, and will wrap the plots around some young law students in Boston who, working out of a neighborhood law office, provide free assistance to the poor and get courtroom experience. The series is more or less restricted to Massachusetts since it is one of a few states which permit student-lawyers to function before passing bar examinations.

CBS's project has three young full-fledged but fledgling lawyers, providing free legal help to the needy in a Los Angeles slum setting.

Both have real-life counterparts. Harold Gast, producer of "Storefront," said some scripts have been based on real cases handled by organizations includ-

ing public defenders' offices and privately funded legal aid organizations.

"We like the format because it permits us to handle civil cases as well as criminal," explained the producer, something of a specialist since he was a writer for the old "Defenders" and most recently produced "Jud for the Defense."

"The idea is to get an exciting mix which will include social themes," Gast said. "We'll explore the matter of integration in labor unions, black militancy, police raids, the problems of Mexican-Americans. And there will be a murder trial, the story of a woman with an insane husband, and another about a swindle."

Gast insists that "Storefront" is not a legal switch on the popular "Mod Squad" format—the coming season's most popular basic recipe for new dramatic series.

"We don't have an older father-figure around," Gast said. "The regulars are just three
