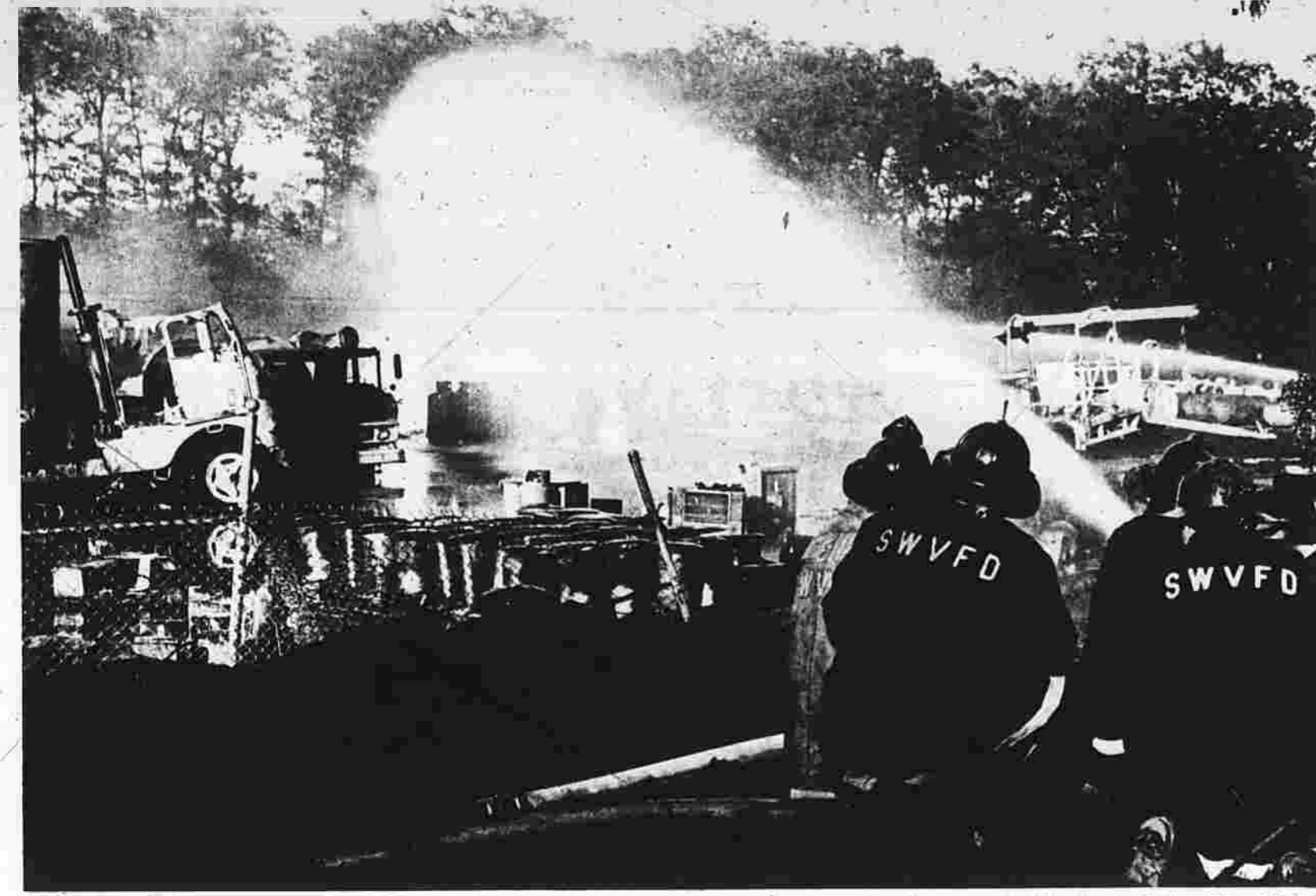

50th Year Of Pageant On Tonight

The Miss America Pageant, which will celebrate its 50th anniversary this year, will be colorcast live from Atlantic City, N.J., on the NBC Television Network Saturday. The announcement of NBC-TV's fifth consecutive year of color coverage of this event was made jointly by Albert A. Marks Jr., chairman, Executive Committee, Miss America Pageant, and Don Durgin, president, NBC Television Network.

"On its birthday, it continues to retain its youth, freshness and wide appeal to millions who participate annually in the beautiful guessing game—the selection of the next Miss America."

The Miss America Pageant, a non-profit organization whose officers serve without remuneration, takes pride in the more than \$7,515,000 in scholarship funds awarded entrants to date as a result of the pageants held on local, state and national levels.

The pageant had its premiere telecast in 1954, during which Lee Meriwether was chosen Miss America. It had its initial colorcast in 1966, the pageant's first year on NBC-TV. It is estimated that approximately one billion viewers have watched Miss America since the first telecast.

The two-hour program will climax a week of festive activities known as Pageant Week in Atlantic City. For the 50th anniversary celebration, all living Miss America titleholders have been invited and more than 20 of them have already indicated they will be present during Pageant Week.

"The pageant is dedicated to extolling the distinctive qualities of the American woman—the world's most active participant in community and professional life—while retaining her femininity and individuality," Marks said.

"Though the pageant will be celebrating its golden anniversary in 1970, we intend to look ahead to the next 50 years, rather than dwell nostalgically on the past. Today's program will salute our golden age while being aware that this is the age of Aquarius."

Durgin said: "The Miss America Pageant has become an American institution, but it refuses to be institutionalized."

Former Winners To Join Program

Lee Meriwether, Miss America of 1955, and Debbie Bryant, Miss America of 1966, will co-host the NBC Television Network's live color coverage of the annual Miss America Pageant, this year celebrating its 50th anniversary, Saturday, (10 p.m. to midnight).

Bert Parks will be the master of ceremonies of the national finals of the Miss America Pageant in Atlantic City, N.J., for the 16th consecutive year.

Now a versatile actress, Lee Meriwether was the initial Miss America to be chosen before a national audience on the first network telecast of the Pageant in 1954.

Miss Meriwether has had leading roles in motion pictures including "The Undefeated," "Angel in My Pocket" and "Namu, the Killer Whale." She has done both drama and comedy on television including Bob Hope and Jack Benny specials and as guest star on NBC-TV's "The Name of the Game" and "Star Trek" as well as the leading panel shows. Lee is married to actor Frank Aletter and they are parents of two children.

Debbie Bryant, who will be making her second consecutive appearance as the pageant's on-air hostess, also has the distinction of being the first Kansas finalist to win the Miss America title. A Phi Beta Kappa graduate of the University of Kansas, Debbie also will serve as mistress of ceremonies of

eight Miss America state pageants this year.

In addition to her Miss America assignments, Debbie is a lecturer on beauty aids. She is married to Rod Wilson, a lawyer.

For the golden anniversary colorcast, all living Miss America titleholders have been invited to participate in the two-hour program. The former Miss Americas will be introduced chronologically and will appear in a production number during the program.

Disaster in Peru on First Tuesday

The deadliest earthquake in the recorded history of Latin America—the temblor that shook Peru last June and took the lives of 70,000 persons, most of them within 10 minutes—is the subject of a dramatic film-report to be presented by NBC News' "First Tuesday" Oct. 6 (9-11 p.m. in color) on NBC.

Still photographs taken of the catastrophe by a group of Japanese mountain climbers figure prominently in the report. The actual sounds of the earthquake come from the tapes of a couple who were working with a recorder at the time of the disaster.

"We went to Peru because we felt there was a dramatic human story there—and there was," Tomizawa says. "Here was one of the greatest natural disasters in the history of man-

kind. Much aid was sent down. Yet the disaster was shut out of our minds almost completely, almost immediately. What does it take to make people aware of other people's suffering? We are not out to broadcast a message, but to make people aware of the occurrence of a natural disaster of a scope they never even imagined."

Persons who lived through the disaster recount their own experiences. Among them is Brother Hillary Henrisey, a Benedictine monk from Manteno, Ill., who was the first person to make contact with Lima with news of the havoc.

A Peace Corps worker, Kent Breesee of Buffalo, N.Y., describes the death of two fellow corpsmen in Huaras.

Viewers also will hear from Father Tom Samway of the Maryknoll Fathers, from Roch-

ester, N.Y., who speaks of the need for continuing aid. Brother Kevin Folsom, a Benedictine monk from Bakersfield, Calif., recalls the rescue of children.

"A memorable thing is that people told us their heartbreaking stories 2½ or 3 months after the event without an outward trace of emotion," Tomizawa says.

The report documents the presence in Peru of a large group of Russians lending assistance. "There is no peanut operation," Tomizawa says.

"They have 168 doctors, nurses and other technicians in hospitals and clinics in the stricken valley. Most of the report was filmed at an altitude of 10,000 feet, but the "First Tuesday" crew often worked high-

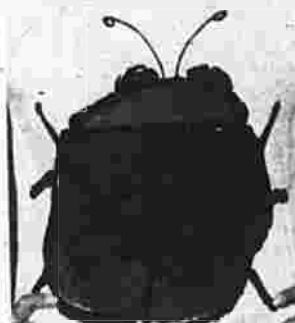

Marty Feldman, its resident comedian, a Britisher who specializes in physical humor and sight gags. Since the summer series did well in the ratings, there already is talk about its being a January replacement.
 CBS's most ambitious hot weather experiment, "Comedy Tonight," had some fine moments but even more valiant efforts that didn't quite come off. But the aim was high and there were some nice moments when the satire hit the mark. Robert Klein, the biggest name in the series, is bright, brash, often funny and needs a little more seasoning.
 NBC's summer "Music Hall Series," like the Dean Martin replacement was taped in England, and it introduced Des O'Connor to American audiences. He has a pleasant singing voice, an easy manner and gentle humor. But the series was so low-key it was an unsubstantial as a Chinese dinner.
 "Where's Huddles?" on CBS was one of those crudely drawn cartoon shows with characters that resembled "The Flintstones" and gags that apparently were cribbed from Stone-Age cave walls. The kids probably loved it—it drew surprisingly high ratings—but it will hardly be one of the adult viewers' cherished memories.
 The Smothers Brothers returned for a couple of months—on ABC—and made fewer ripples than are on a mill pond. The once controversial team seemed content to sing songs, wrangle a bit and keep their comedy light and their opinions on world-matters to themselves.
 ABC's most successful straw hat show was Johnny Cash's country music replacement, the Everly Brothers. The variety hour contained the standard Nashville sound, great if you like it.
