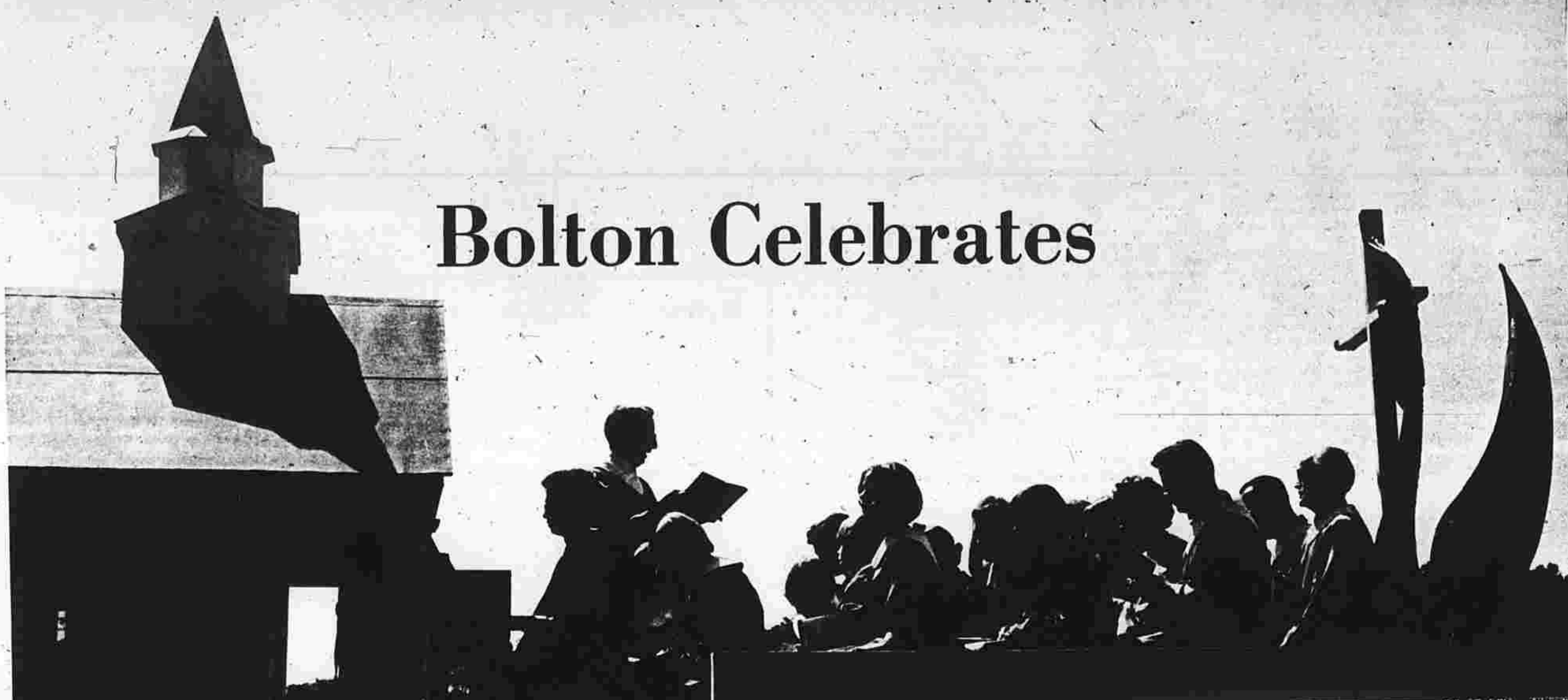

United Methodist float recalls importance of churches to town's development

The Puritan settlers' wrathful God positively learned this weekend as Bolton celebrated 250 years of townhood with the biggest parade that ever pipped its way up Bolton Center Rd. and the fanciest ball that ever graced the high school gym.

The weather began to hint at a bright blue weekend Friday as ladies and occasional gentlemen scurried from house to house on the tour of old homes sponsored by the Junior Woman's Club, but Saturday, September 13, dawned bright and clear.

For some, Saturday's events began with a morning Indian pow-wow at one of the Heritage Trail sites, off Howard Rd. The "Dancers of the Dakotas," a Hartford group specializing in Sioux lore, led by Chief Ron Gerrity, erected two tipis, set up their drum, and in full regalia, performed a variety of colorful dances around a smoky council fire.

After the exhibition, visitors walked down a woody trail to a spot by a huge ledge where Boy Scouts from troop 73 had made their own tipis. Five Indians once camped nearby.

For most, however, Saturday's events began with the parade starting at 10:30 a.m. at the side streets shortly after 1 p.m. and by 2 p.m. almost the entire route, from the I-84 underpass over Bolton Center Rd. to Herick Memorial Park on the other side of the Center, was lined with spectators. Friday and Sunday, with their warm September sun and cooling shade, exceeded all expectations.

Saturday visitors lingered after the parade to inspect old photographs, costumes and other mementoes in the Community Hall, to enjoy a short band concert on the Green, to look in at the art show at St. Maurice Parish Center, and to drive to the four corners of Bolton inspecting historical sites on the Heritage Trail.
