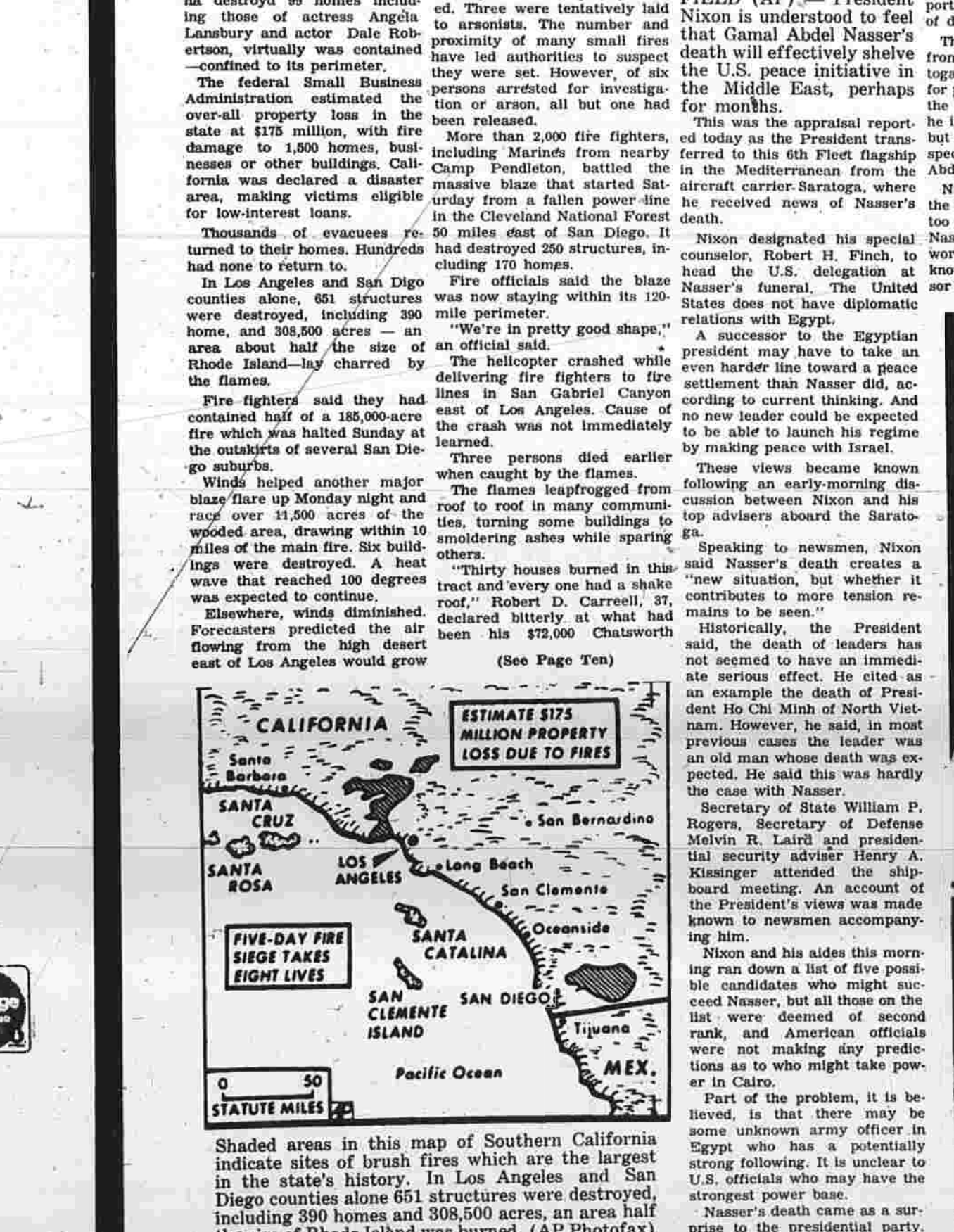

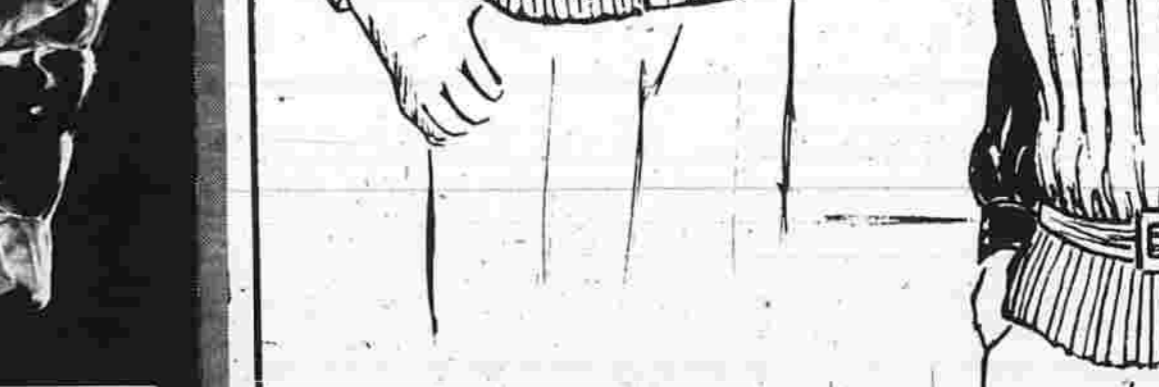

On Active Service . . . Red Cross

A typical day of Red Cross volunteer activity can best illustrate the invaluable role of Red Cross volunteers "On Active Service."

Dawn has not yet arrived and a Disaster Relief volunteer answers a call from Red Cross and carries to the scene of a fire where several families are awaiting help. Volunteers are ready to assist victims of local disasters by providing shelter, clothing and food for those who may lose these necessities in this tragic manner.

Still early in the morning the Red Cross station wagon begins to move on another busy day of transporting patients to doctors' offices, clinics and hospitals; donors and workers are taken to bloodmobile operations; and others are taken to destinations as requested by separate area agencies.

At the same time Red Cross Gray Ladies are beginning their duties at the Newington Veterans Administration Hospital bringing comfort and diversion to the hospitalized veterans, performing such services as planning entertainment, shopping for personal items, writing letters and just talking to help pass the long, lonely hours.

Later, a volunteer arrives at 257 E. Center St., the location of the Manchester Red Cross, where she will assist with office duties like typing, addressing mail, filing, etc.

It is midmorning, and trained volunteer caseworkers are busy occupied in Service to Mil-

The day is not yet over. The scarce blood is needed from telephone alerts a volunteer Red Cross headquarters in caseworker to a sudden emergency in the family of a serviceman. He is needed home immediately. The wheels are thrown into action, contacts with the Police Department and with the hospital are made; the information regarding the death of the serviceman's father in an automobile accident is obtained and sped to a distant country. A Red Cross field director covering the military installation to which the young man is attached receives and relays compassionately the news. Emergency funds are provided by the Red Cross, and the serviceman heads home to give much needed comfort to his mother during a difficult time.

The station wagon returns patients from their therapy. The office worker covers her typewriter and leaves. The scheduled activities for the day come to an end. The bloodmobile returns to Hartford with its precious gifts of life. And quiet descends for a while . . . until disaster relief is suddenly required, or a caseworker is needed to serve the serviceman, or a supply of

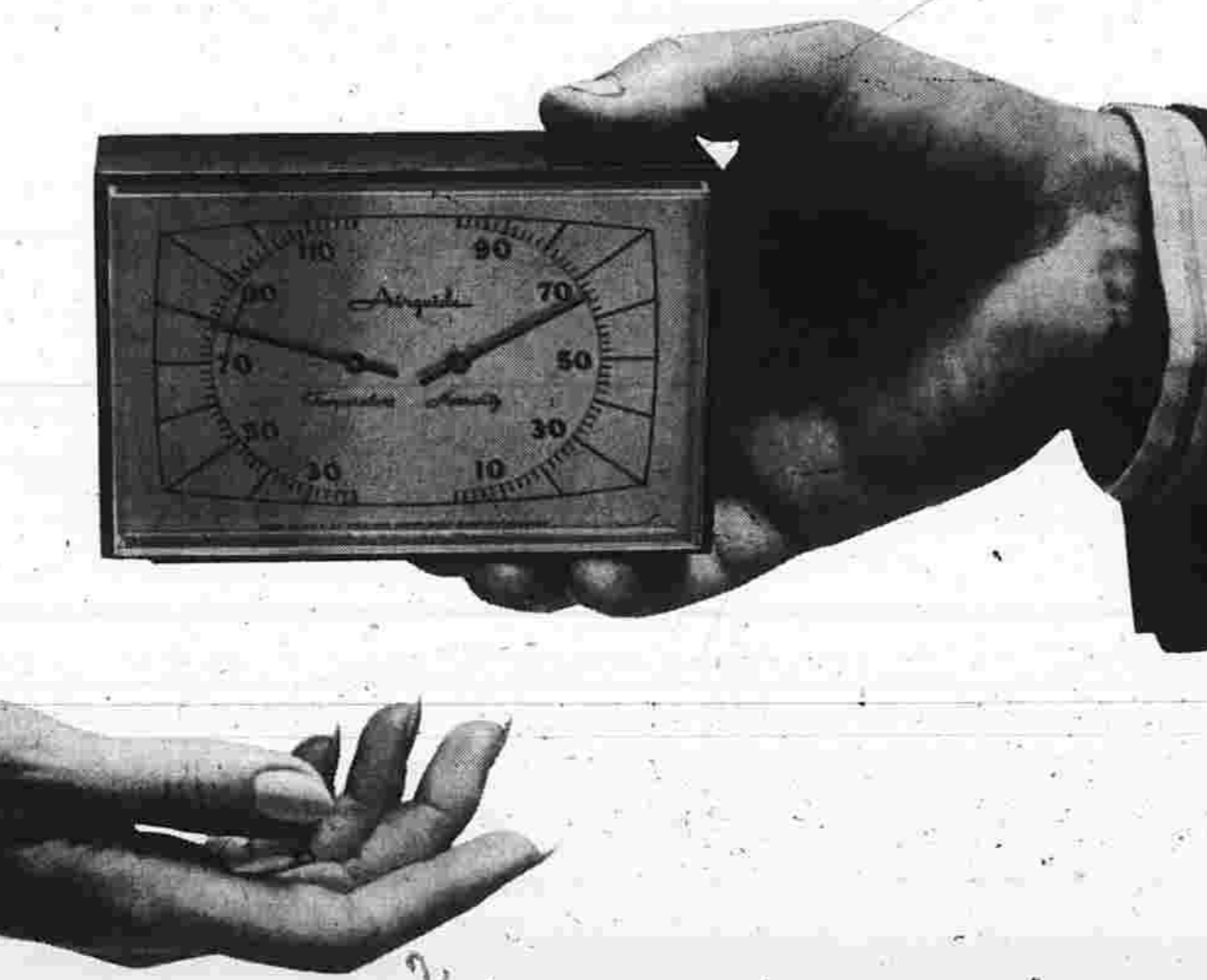

A Sobering Loss

As frequently happens with controversial figures, death has uncovered more respect for Gamal Abdel Nasser than was offered him during his life. Even his enemies, relieved at least of that bombast which was always so much fiercer than any actual blow he had in his power to deliver, can now concede that he was, relatively speaking, something of a moderate, safe factor in the Near East situation.

The Egyptian people, to whom he gave their first modern hope of self respect, their first real liberation from domestic and foreign enslavement, are going to feel less secure, now that this one man is no longer holding the position he himself made the most powerful position in the Arab world.

The modern Russian empire, which, following the blunders of United States diplomacy while it was under the stewardship of the late John Foster Dulles, had welcomed the opportunity to try to make Nasser into a cooperative agent with its age old dreams of a position of influence in the Mediterranean, now has to realize that it is suddenly without anybody responsible to deal with, which makes its meddling in the area twice as risky as it was before.

The world may surprise itself by making up for Nasser's loss, by tempering its conduct out of a new wariness of the potentially uncontrollable situation. President Nixon, on the other hand, ready to play those war games which were to warn Nasser and Russia about that American "presence" in the Mediterranean, has cancelled the display out of deference to the news from Cairo, and the knowledge that the general situation has now become even more explosive may stimulate others to more careful conduct.

Information Without Ugliness? Secretary of the Interior Walter Hickel is sharpening up his department's crusading against the existence of billboards on any federally owned land, and this will be hailed, by the admirers of America beautiful, as a logical continuation of the effective use of federal power to ban billboards completely from the great new roads of the federal system.

It is indeed pleasant to see the country, without having to try to peer behind billboards to see it. That is the great option of the times, and it would be heresy, we suppose, to

"Lifelike" White House "Flowers" As with those new uniforms for the White House special police, the main issue is one of taste, and a certain amount of damage has therefore already been done, it should be said.

But it could be that, just as some elements of the banana republic grandeur in the first appearance of the new White House cantabulary could be discarded, and henceforth withheld from the public view, something could be done to see that the great crop of artificial flowers now being prepared for the White House could be lost, permanently.

House already seems to realize that it has been caught doing something controversial. No one will acknowledge going to miss our solid point of reference and rally in time of crisis, and perhaps sink back toward its natural chaos and anarchy.

And it also has to be conceded that the firm which is making these artificial flowers for the White House has praiseworthy artistic standards.

"The worst kind of a flower arrangement," said one of the partners in the firm the other day, "is one in which all the flowers look too fresh. I manipulate the flowers to suggest a drop here, some setting there. There should be lifelike, never stiff. Another important thing to remember is never to use too many flowers. I don't believe in tight arrangements."

So, if it has to be artificial flowers, the White House seems in good hands. That couldn't the garden club of America strike some kind of blow for genuineness and for taste? Couldn't they arrange a daily supply of fresh flowers, if that is the White House problem? Or pay the salary of a special White House arranger and vase emptier if that is the trouble? Would it even be objectionable to have all the nation's taxpayers invited to share whatever extra financial burden might be involved in keeping the White House floral displays authentic representations of the beauty these 50 states produce?

SNETCO Union Urged To Back Rate Appeal

MANCHESTER, Conn. (AP)—A union president told his fellow union members at a convention Monday that they should support their employer — the Southern New England Telephone Company — in its efforts to secure a controversial rate hike.

He indicated that the rate hike would help the union in its bid for higher wages at contract negotiations later this year.

The request, made by W. Shaughnessy, president of the Connecticut Union of Telephone Workers, came at the start of a convention here. The union's three-year contract with SNETCO expires in 1971.

"There is no question that increased wages for our members are a factor in our consideration of the rate increase," said John W. Shaughnessy, the union leader, "because telephone workers should not be denied the right to make wages comparable with other Connecticut industries."

"There is no question in our minds that the request made by the company last year was necessary and reasonable," said Congressman Emilio Q. Daddario, the union's legislative director, who also spoke to the group.

The rate increase to which Shaughnessy referred has been opposed by the State Public Utilities Commission and has been caught in a tangle of legal tangles since the PUC turned it down.

The telephone company has been asking for nearly two years for a 9.8 per cent rate increase that would increase revenues \$24 million a year. The PUC granted SNETCO a rate boost about half that large in April, 1969, and SNETCO took the case to court.

An interim Superior Court ruling was handed down allowing SNETCO to implement the full rate increase until a final ruling could be given. The court's ruling was in part favorable to both sides, and sent parts of the case back to PUC for reconsideration.

In the latest development in the case, both sides have decided to appeal both sides of the decision which went against their wishes.

And the situation has become even more complicated by officials on the PUC, who have indicated that if the final ruling goes their way, they will press SNETCO for refunds to their customers based on their 1969 rates — not simply refunds of the difference between the interim rates they have been charging and whatever rates are finally allowed.

When negotiations for the 1971 contract start, Shaughnessy said "we have a job to do in negotiating wage increases that will first of all make up for what we have lost."

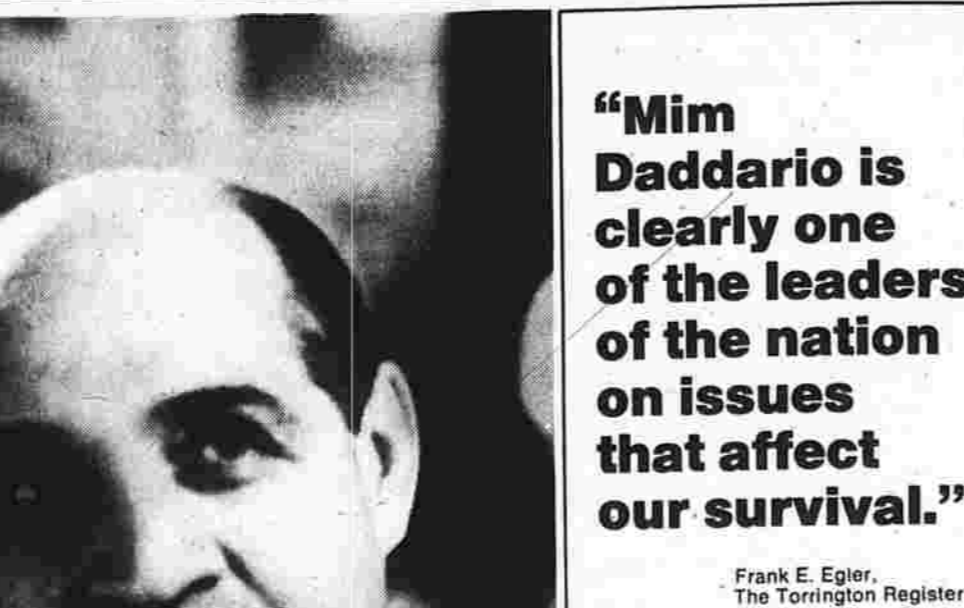

Squatrito and Odegard Debate Issues: They Find Room To Agree and Disagree

By BOB COHEN (Herald Reporter)

Manchester's two candidates for Fourth District state senator appear to agree on as many issues as they disagree on, it remarks last night before the Manchester Jaycees in any criterion.

Democrat Dominic Squatrito and Republican David Odegard spoke at a "Meet the Candidates" meeting, attended by about 100 persons. Sponsored by the Jaycees, it was in Iona Hall.

Each spoke for five minutes, outlining his basic program and then both answered questions from the audience. At the end of the questioning, each was given about two minutes to sum up. The Jaycees moderator was John Thiel.

Squatrito and Odegard agreed, for instance, that people at the grass roots should take themselves in governmental and environmental problems. And they agreed that public officials should lend a receptive ear to people's problems.

They agreed also that campus violence must be stopped and that the merit system should be brought to task.

Split On Voting Age They disagreed on lowering the voting age to 18. Squatrito is for it and Odegard against it. "One of the problems facing us today is the dissatisfaction of youth," Squatrito said last night. "Personally, I am for lowering the voting age, I don't see any tremendous difference between the ages of 18 and 21."

On Education Aid . . . Odegard said he is for continuation of the block-grant method of state aid for education. "However," he added, "I would be in favor of changing the per-pupil formula. Consideration should be given to the ability of towns and cities to assume their financial responsibilities. Fairfield, a wealthy town, should not need the same aid as Manchester, for instance."

Squatrito countered with "Rights are those things we all have and should have every day to take advantage of them. Because the 18 to 25 age group doesn't take their rights as seriously as we do, it is our duty to help them. We need a more personal administration handling the state, as opposed to new legislation."
