The decision to proceed with repairs to the sump pump and heating system was delayed by Johndro's recommendation until after the next meeting of the study committee when additional bids are expected to be received.

The Selectmen agreed to ask the Board of Finance to pay the bill for the manufacturing of pairs out of the town contingency fund.

Road Superintendent Dutras The responsibility for maintenance of the town roads is solely the responsibility of the superintendent of roads and bridges, according to a letter ruling submitted by Town Councilman Robert King.

The letter states the road superintendent is not answerable to anyone in town, other than during the preparation and submission of the budget which must be presented to the Board of Finance.

First Selectman Charles Thiffault emphasized these points during this week's meeting of the Board, after reading a letter of complaint regarding Walbridge Hill Rd. which had been sent to him.

King's ruling makes Road Superintendent William Sevek notably responsible for the maintenance and construction of local roads, and removes any of the responsibility for the roads from the shoulders of Thiffault.

Hostages Free, Ransom Paid

The innocent people who were seized as hostages by Palestinian commandos have now, all 400 of them, been released without injury.

In return, seven Palestinians who were guilty of illegal violence were set free by the governments of Britain, West Germany and Switzerland, and flown to Cairo.

At the end, in the final phases of the exchange, the commandos held only six hostages, all American citizens.

It was, in other words, our innocent citizens who were the ones rescued by the release of Palestinians guilty of criminal acts in England, Germany and Switzerland.

We received, for citizens of ours, the benefits of the deal.

But we did not have to participate in the surrender to hijacking violence which was the other part of the deal.

What would we have done, if the year had been put up to us—if we had happened to have possession of some of the Palestinians the hijackings were designed to rescue? Would we have risked the lives of six of our own citizens in order to call the commandos bluff?

Or would we, too, have yielded to what amounted to criminal blackmail?

The great, almost conclusive argument against yielding is that it concedes a reward to criminal action and to the process of taking innocent people prisoner for bargaining purposes, and thus invites repetition of the same tactics by other extremists in other cases.

But that argument doesn't have very much power when it is confronted by the knowledge that innocent lives are being held captive by forces which would not hesitate at execution.

The only happy solution is to prevent extremists from setting such hostages in the first place.

Once such a seizure has been allowed to happen, consideration for the safety of the innocent has to be given priority.

There are now some indications that an increased security alertness is being given, as well as the new program for increased stationing of professional guards on planes, has greatly increased the difficulties faced by potential hijackers. It is better to take additional measures for preparedness and prevention than to try to turn tough with the forces of innocence who have already been captured. There are times when soft humanitarianism has to be allowed to win over hard principle.

In Praise Of Mulcahy

In announcing the March 1 retirement of State Police Commissioner Leo Mulcahy, Governor Dempsey called him the "finest law officer the state has ever had."

Commissioner Mulcahy will not resent it, we are sure, if some of us with memories amend that statement to include the late Edward J. Hickey in it on equal terms.

These two greatest law officers in Connecticut history shared similar talents and instincts. Each had great pride in the morale and clean performance of his force. Each managed to combine the command of strength with the exercise of civility restraint. Each exhibited reverence into the eyes of the bully. Each refused to subordinate the police function to any passing hysteria.

But it has been Commissioner Mulcahy who has been serving through times of public troubles much more serious and varied than any his distinguished predecessor had to face.

His force, under his direction—and often under his immediate personal field

direction—handled critical scenes at the University of Connecticut, at the May Day weekend in New Haven, and at the Middletown rock festival in a manner which might well have been taken as the credible model for police forces all over the nation, and they did this during a period when the police operation almost everywhere else became highly controversial.

No one knows how many lives Commissioner Mulcahy saved last summer during that Middletown weekend when, with the stage set by court decisions and by the persistent inroads of thousands of festival-seekers for a confrontation which could hardly be ended without violence, Commissioner Mulcahy publicly proclaimed that the kids could stay there until Thanksgiving if they wanted to, and then settled his own forces down to watch and wait to help them when they did decide to go home, which was, under such circumstances, almost immediate.

In his handling of such situations, Commissioner Mulcahy illustrated how much more there is to being a great cop than there is in any technical manual, and illustrated, for all future manuals to try to explain, that precise mixture of power and restraint which prevents force or controls trouble instead of triggering it.

The praise he receives between now and March and afterwards will be deserved.

Gliding The Metroliners

The Federal Department of Transportation has announced a two-year experimental management of the Penn Central Metroliners running between New York and Washington.

Penn Central itself, which inaugurated the nation's fastest train service back on Jan. 15, 1969, has built the service up each day in each direction, with a complete and a speed which outclass plane service, and which now attract 100,000 passengers a month.

During the experimental period now open, the government will pay Penn Central some \$100,000 a month for operating the Metroliners while the Department of Transportation tests out various ideas for making the service even more attractive.

The Department of Transportation plans to initiate the air line by putting hostesses on the Metroliners and by making the meals served on board complimentary.

In addition, it plans to build a modern passenger lounge in Union Station at Washington, where the accommodations will be up to the level of cleanliness and attractiveness found on the train itself, and where passengers can get tickets without long lines or bewildering red tape.

Eventually, the government hopes to create a suitable special Metroliner lounge somewhere apart from the general vicinity of Pennsylvania Station.

Meanwhile, one basic requirement for a good railroad ride at Metroliner speeds has already been met. The roadbed between New York and Washington has been put in first class shape, with the smooth welded rail, similar to that which is standard on European main line routes, now extending almost all the way from New York to the capital.

The Metroliners have already proved that something can be done to improve passenger service on an American railroad, and that, when this is done, there is a happy patronage response from the public, so that the Metroliner line is now operating on a profitable basis. The approaching experimentation with further refinements and attractions will also be welcome. It has always seemed ridiculous to think that we Americans couldn't run a railroad. It develops that we can, if we really want to. We should calculate that our future is going to bring an increasing need, and increasing patronage for transportation of the Metroliner quality, on a nation-wide basis.

Now is the time when the carpetbaggers roam throughout the land exhibiting the voters to support the candidates of their persuasion.

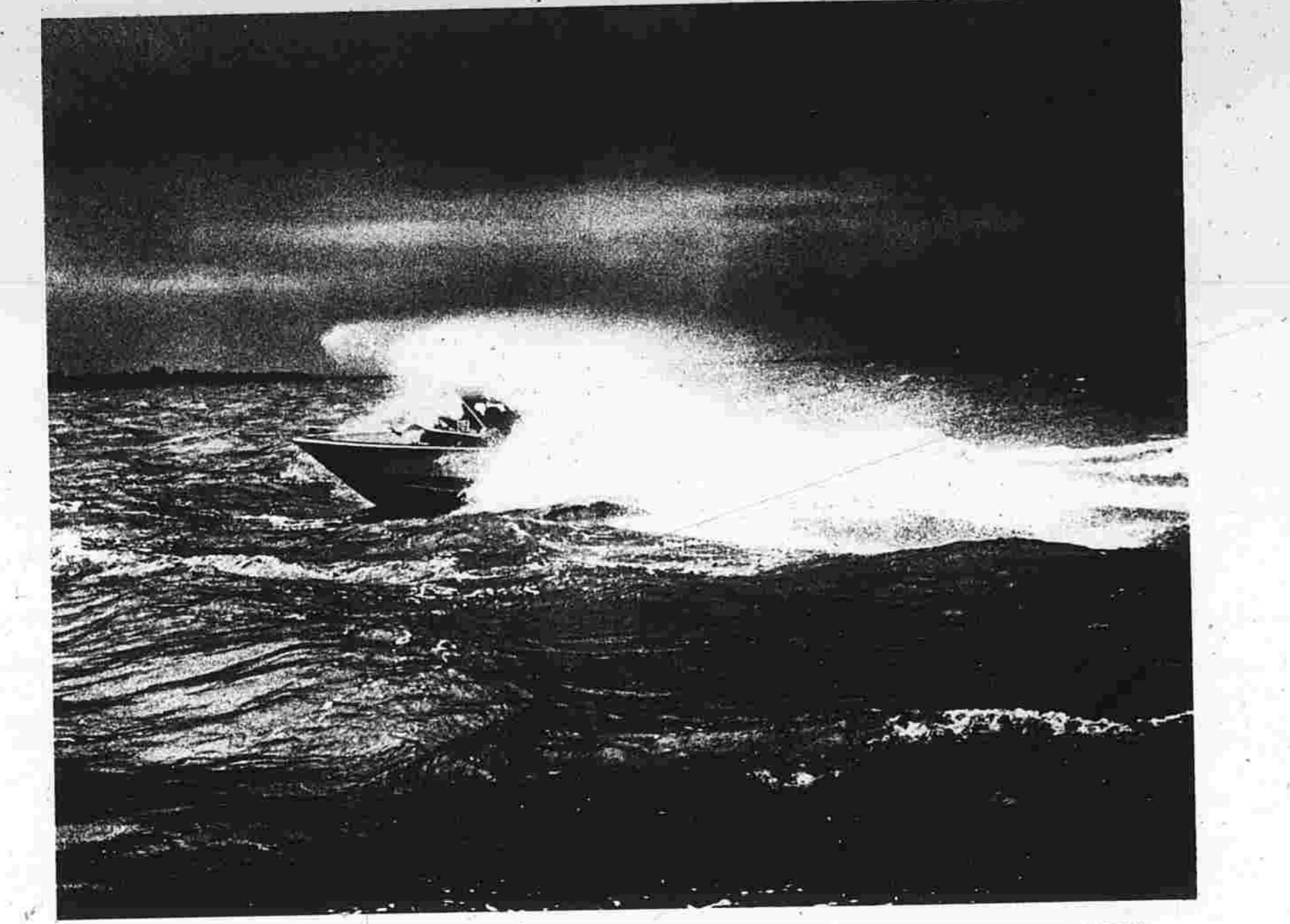

Democratic Bitter Fruit

LOS ANGELES—The vendetta germinating inside California's Democratic party the past decade are about to bloom in a dramatic re-election landslide for Gov. Ronald Reagan which will carry important national implications.

Whereas a few weeks ago Reagan was expected to defeat Democrat Jesse Unruh by 500,000 votes, politicians and polls agree his lead now is well beyond the 1,000,000 margin in 1966.

If the election were held today, Reagan would win by a stupendous 1,200,000-vote cushion. Anything close to that will assure victory for most of the state Republican ticket, perhaps even highly vulnerable Sen. George Murphy. Most important, a Reagan landslide will guarantee Republican control of the legislature, which will re-elect California's Congressional delegation—including five new seats—in 1971. Hebron ZBA Okays Application To Build Filling Station

The Zoning Board of Appeals has granted permission to Carl H. Jones to locate a two-bay gasoline filling station on the northeast corner of Rt. 66 and Rt. 216 in Hebron Center.

The board held a public hearing last week, after which it went into executive session to discuss Jones' application. However, it was unanimously voted to resume the executive session on Monday so that each member of the board could personally survey the property.

In granting the application, the board considered the proximity of the property to schools, churches, theatres or playhouses, and other places of public gathering. They also considered the effect of the highway and effect of public travel.

They concluded on the basis of the evidence presented that the use of the premises for a gasoline filling station will not imperil the safety of the public.

However, approval was given subject to the following conditions: The building shall be located not closer than seven feet from any boundary line.

An evergreen screening, not less than six feet in height, shall be set six feet from the northerly property line of 124 feet.

There shall be no outside storage above the ground and no outside repairs or storage of cars.

Also, the location of the well and septic system shall conform with the state health code with specific attention to the location of the septic tank and leaching field of the northerly adjoining property and the proximity of the brook flowing into the culvert on the eastern boundary.

Lighting shall be established so as not to create a nuisance or a traffic hazard.

And finally, maximum consideration should be given to the safety of the public.

Muskie Tops Fuel Oil Session Awaited

BOSTON (AP) — New England governors are awaiting a response from the White House for a requested meeting with President Nixon to discuss the region's fuel oil shortage.

All six governors signed a telegram sent to the President on Wednesday. It is the second time the governors have requested such a meeting in the last month.

"We still feel such a meeting is an essential first step toward a solution of our region's problems," the message said. "We are convinced that the recommended action on Sept. 29 will not meet the needs of our region."

Administration officials announced Sept. 29 that oil companies are being asked to increase supplies, and suggested the 40,000 barrel-a-day import quota be doubled during the winter.

"These proposals do not provide an answer to New England's need for residual oil, currently our most urgent problem, nor do they take into account New England's long-range fuel energy requirements," the telegram said.

New England members of congress and other officials have said that doing the import quota for winter months would only mean a worse shortage later in the year when the operating cost of winter months would have been exhausted.

Queen Elizabeth II Lunches with Nixon

CHEQUERS, England (AP) - President and Mrs. Nixon lunched today with Queen Elizabeth II at the country home of Britain's prime ministers - an interlude sandwiched between business conferences with Prime Minister Edward Heath.

It was the first time the sovereign had lunched at the estate, Chequers, and many Britons considered the precedent a special salute to the Nixon.

Several hundred persons stood outside the main entrance of the stone-framed entrance to the estate, 30 miles northwest of London, as the queen arrived in her clear-colored Rolls-Royce limousine eight minutes behind schedule.

Nixon and Heath had conferred for more than an hour privately before the queen arrived.

The prime minister told Nixon that under the terms of the agreement that made Chequers available to prime ministers 40 years ago the property is to be used only for rest and recreation.

College Football Stars Killed When Plane Hits Mountain

By CARL B. HILLARD Associated Press Writer (AP) - The cream of the Wichita State University football team, its top athletic officials and some of its most loyal fans were killed Friday when their game-bound plane crashed into a mountainside while trying to cross the Continental Divide.

Twenty-nine persons, 12 of them players, were killed. Eleven others, including nine players, a copilot and a team trainer survived.

The Colorado State Patrol said there was no chance of other survivors among the 40 persons listed as passengers and crew on the twin-engine Martin 404.

The aircraft, dubbed the "Gold Plane" by the team, was one of two taking the squad, its coaching staff and boosters to Coalinga, Utah, for a game today with the Utah State Utes.

The crash, a few minutes after leaving the camp at the 12,000-foot school in morning fog, was the second fatal plane crash in the school's history.

The list also included Marvin Brown, the team's second leading rusher; Gene Robinson, the team's star wide receiver; and Ray Coleman of Wichita, Kan., a senior who had been named to the All-American team.

On Oct. 29, 1960, 16 players on the California Poly team were among 22 persons who perished when their chartered plane went down in fog near Toledo, Ohio.
