Officer Dam Quits to Join Colo. Force

Officer Erik Dam of the Manchester police department has submitted his resignation to Chief James Reardon, effective this Saturday. Dam and his family will be moving to Lakewood, Colo., where he will assume a position in the police department.

In his letter of resignation, Dam, a police officer in Manchester for the past 4½ years, said, "I feel that I have reached the limit of available opportunities—that of a patrolman. A person must judge his ultimate limits in attaining a goal in his chosen profession and it appears now my limits were higher than what Manchester was able to afford."

Dam will be working in a new police department which has been recruiting members from all over the country. It is patterned after the recommendations found in the report of the Task Force on the Police of the President's Commission on Law Enforcement and Administration.

Dam graduated from Manchester Community College in 1960, in the first class in which associate degrees in law enforcement were awarded. He was the first Manchester patrolman to receive the degree.

Before his appointment to the Manchester Police Department Feb. 9, 1964, Dam served in the Coast Guard, and worked as a guard at the state prison when it was located in Westchester.

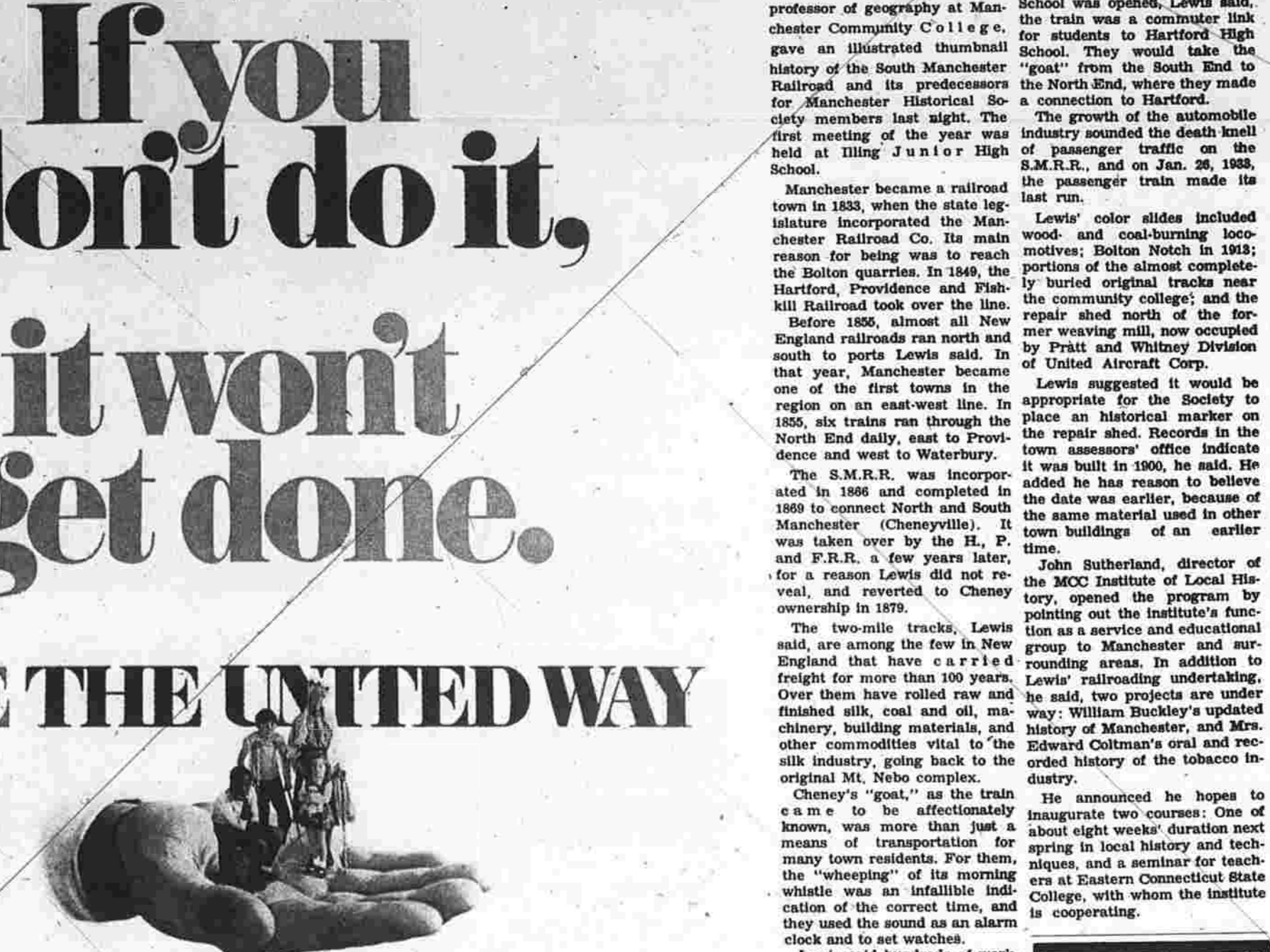

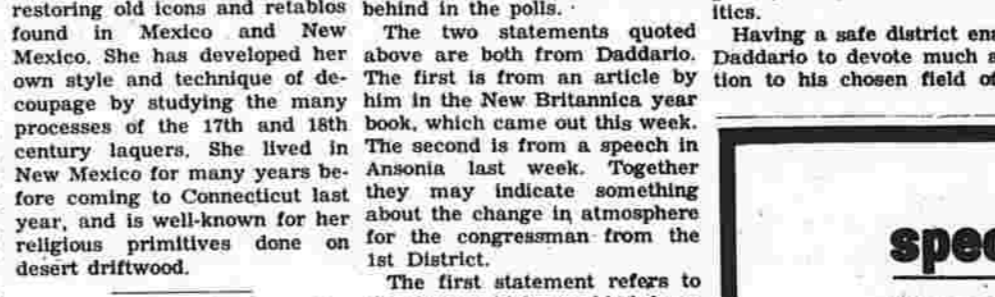

### Daddario Faces Challenge In Non-Scientific Battle

What is at stake is no less than the future of mankind. "When the duck-hunting season opens Saturday, Oct. 17th, I'll be out there at 4 a.m." Hartford, Conn. (AP) — It's a long way from Capitol Hill in Washington, D.C., to the state Capitol in Hartford, and Democratic Congressman Emilio Q. Daddario may occasionally be tempted to cast a long glance backward. In Washington, Daddario built a nationwide reputation among the scientific community during his six terms on the House Committee on Science and Astronautics. In Connecticut, as he campaigns for governor, Daddario is finding out that his credentials as a scientist are not as easily convertible into local political currency. He's running behind in the polls. Having a wife district enabled Daddario to devote much attention to his chosen field of sci-



ence and technology, and he became nationally known as a congressman with whom the scientists could communicate. But it was a mixed blessing. Some disappointed Democrats are now saying that the congressman forgot how to campaign. As a report quoted by Daddario in the Britannica Year Book said, "Few politicians are scientists and few scientists are politicians." If Daddario falls in his bid for the governorship, he will become an excellent example of a man who was unable to keep a foot in each field. One of Daddario's problems is that he has scarcely had to campaign for re-election every two years. His district is largely Democratic, and there is no reason why he could not have looked confidently forward to a lifetime career in Congress. Some of Daddario's friends have told him, in fact, that they couldn't understand why he would want to leave the security and prestige of his congressional seat and his committee work to take his chances in the grubby hurly-burly of state politics. The two statements quoted above are both from Daddario. The first is from an article by him in the New Britannica year book, which came out this week. The second is from a speech in Ansonia last week. Together they may indicate something about the change in atmosphere for the congressman from the last district. The first statement refers to the doom which mankind faces unless it finds a way to live with its environment. The second was an attempt to reassure the Connecticut sportsmen who regard Daddario's support of stronger gun controls as a threat to their constitutional right to bear arms. To a man who has been occupied with Olympian questions of the facts of mankind, debates over such matters as licensing of handguns and the advisability of state lotteries may seem secondary. But the battle for the governorship is not on Mount Olympus. It's down to earth, on the ground chosen by the election. 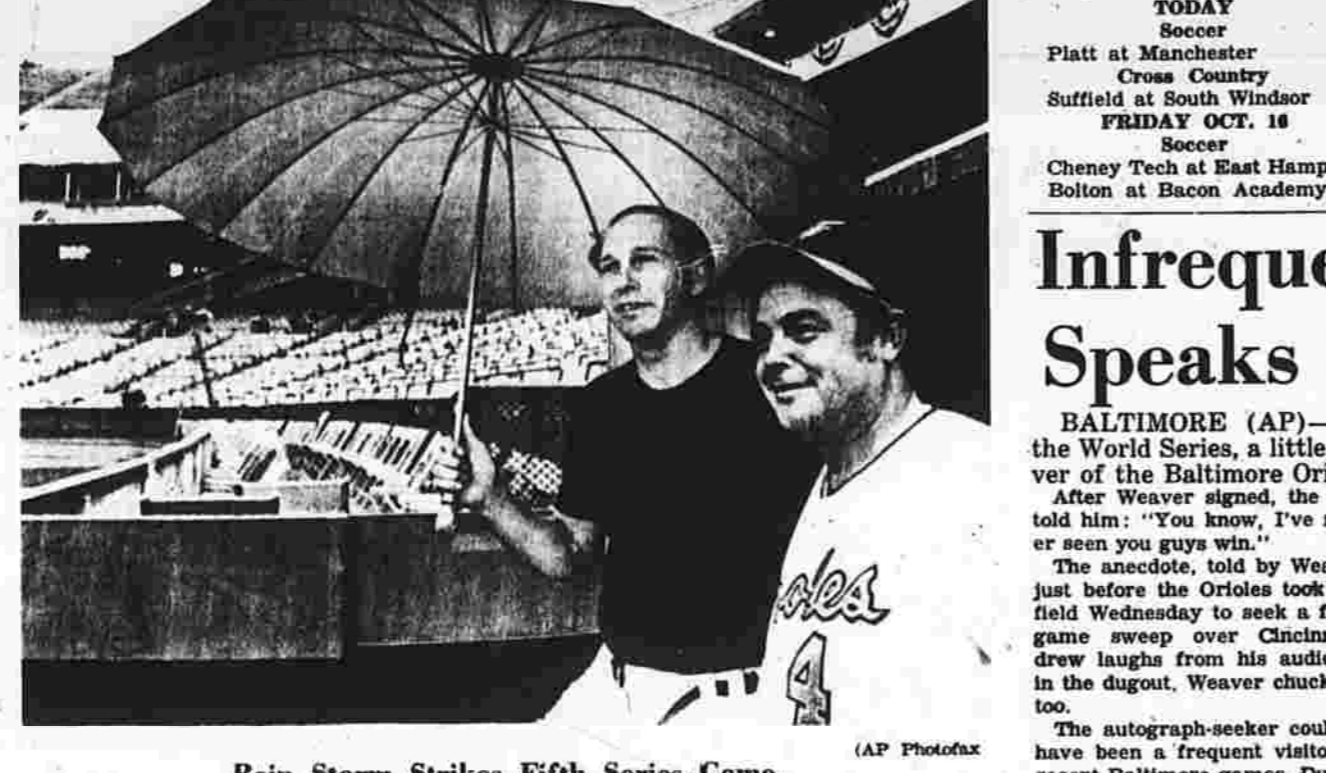
