1040 U.S. Individual Taxpayers Ask IRS

This column of questions and answers on federal tax matters is provided by the local office of the U.S. Internal Revenue Service and is published as a public service to taxpayers. The column answers questions most frequently asked by taxpayers.

Q I've taken a job after school. Can I fill out a form to stop tax withholding as I did on my summer job?
A Yes, if you still believe you will owe no tax this year. Anyone who owed no tax last year and expects to owe none this year, can have his employer stop withholding Federal income tax by completing Form W-4E, Withholding Exemption Certificate. Present tax law allows a person to earn up to \$1,725 before he has to pay any Federal income tax.

Q I was asked for identification when I went in to buy some shotgun shells. Haven't the federal laws on ammunition been changed?
A Yes, there was a change last year involving dealers. Records that did not affect the conditions under which ammunition may be sold. Federal law prohibits the sale of handgun ammunition to anyone under 21 and the sale of rifle and shotgun ammunition to anyone under 18. Dealers must still require purchasers to identify themselves. If there is doubt about age, the change involving dealers removes the requirement that

they keep records on the sale of ammunition suitable only for rifles or shotguns. Records must still be kept on sales of ammunition for handguns and for ammunition that can be used either in rifles or handguns.
Q Can I treat the money I made on the sale of some dairy cows as a capital gain?
A Yes, sales of livestock which have been held for breeding, dairy, draft or sporting purposes can qualify for capital gains treatment. Horses and cattle acquired after 1969 must be held two years to qualify. The holding period for other livestock is one year.

Answers are broken down into five different categories. Agree; strongly; inclined to agree; undecided; inclined to disagree; disagree strongly.
Samples of the 40 questions included in the survey include:
"When a child has learned reading, writing, spelling and arithmetic, and has mastered how to study, the task of the school is fulfilled."
"Students should be taught to get information on all sides of a controversial question before forming opinions."
"Pupils should be required to finish assignments or other work which they have started."

Just How Peaceful The Atom?

The increasing controversy about the safety of the use of atomic energy and its potential by-product, deadly radiation, will be the subject of the CBS New Special "How Peaceful the Atom?" to be broadcast Tuesday on CBS. Correspondent John Hart will be the reporter.

The CBS news special examines both sides of the issue: Does the peaceful atom promise, as proponents say, a future of unlimited technological advances and benefits? Or does it portend, as critics warn, a future of untold environmental and human hazards?

The potential dangers to the environment and to man caused by the release of radiation are explored through interviews with Dr. Edward Teller, nuclear pioneer; Dr. Theos Thompson, member of the Atomic Energy Commission, and Drs. Arthur Tamplin and John Gofman of the Lawrence Radiation Laboratory, Livermore, Calif.

"How Peaceful the Peaceful Atom?" looks at possible sources of radiation hazards, levels of radiation that can and cannot be tolerated safely, and what is being done to control these dangers.

Norman Glubok is producer of "How Peaceful the Peaceful Atom?" Philip Lewis is executive producer.

Merv Sticks To End

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — "There were times," admits Merv Griffin, "when I didn't think I could make it through the show. Midway through the first interview, I began thinking to myself, 'I wonder if anybody would really mind if I just got up and left.'"

Griffin didn't walk out on his late night CBS gabfest. He stuck it out, managed to wrest a transfer back to his native state, and now appears to be surviving the rating race.

Griffin recently transferred his base of operation from the Cort Theater in Manhattan to CBS's Television City here. The rating, he reports, has improved.

"It's now a two-way race," he said. The two leaders: Himself and long-time front-runner Johnny Carson on NBC. No longer a threat is ABC's Dick Cavett, although he remains the darling of the critics—and ABC, which recently gave him a year's renewal.

Griffin admittedly was doing poorly in ratings and morale a few months ago. That was when he lost his zest for the show and wished to be switched from New York to California.

When did he realize he had to make the move?

"When the phone stopped ringing," he said. "We used to be flooded with calls for guestings on the show. Then all of a sudden there were four talk shows originating in New York (Carson, Griffin, Cavett and the syndicated David Frost).

"It became a seller's market for guests. The same faces were turning up on every show; you could tune in any night and find Rodney Dangerfield on somebody's show.

"Once Jerry Lewis played my show and Johnny's on the same night! After 20 minutes, he told me, 'I'm sorry, I've got to leave.' He didn't tell me where he was going—to Carson's!"

Griffin said he would have left Manhattan sooner, but he was ashamed to leave the Cort Theater. He had insisted that CBS supply him with his own home base, and the network had renovated the old legitimate house for \$2 million.

A casualty of the Western move was Griffin's old sidekick, Arthur Treacher.

"I miss him terribly," Griffin remarked. "He was a great asset to the show. But Arthur is along in years—he's 76—and he just couldn't make the move from his home on Long Island. Besides, he's involved in a very profitable fish-and-chips franchise business with Bob Hope's brother."

With the move Griffin is going back to what initially made him succeed on the desk-and-couch circuit: his knack of drawing comedy and human interest from oddballs and offbeat characters.

He is now planning salutes to Hollywood institutions—Jack L. Warner is one subject.

"Since we're living here now, we want to pay our respects to the community," said California-born Griffin. "We don't want to be like Johnny and David and the other shows that come out here for a week, skim the cream of guests to soup up their ratings, then hurry back East again."
