# WARRING BANKERS GIVEN 6 PATHS TO CHECK PEACE

The committee, headed by State Sen. William F. Hickey Jr., D-Stamford, came up with the following options for consideration:

—Obtaining legislative permission for savings banks to convert to commercial banks under supervision of the State Banking Commissioner...

—Authorizing checking accounts in savings banks provided they maintain 100 percent reserve in other words keeping all monies in general accounts.

—Defer all action until a federal commission, looking into the same issue, files its report, expected by the end of 1971.

—Authorizing savings banks to act as third parties, like the credit card system. It could pay interest rates as commercial banks.

—Authorizing savings banks to regulate accounts for personal or industrial accounts.

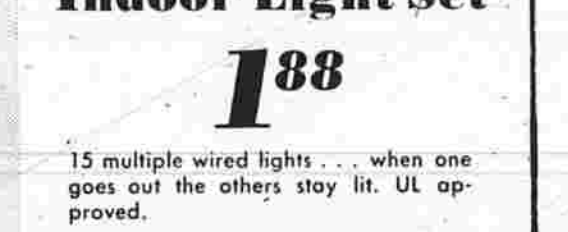

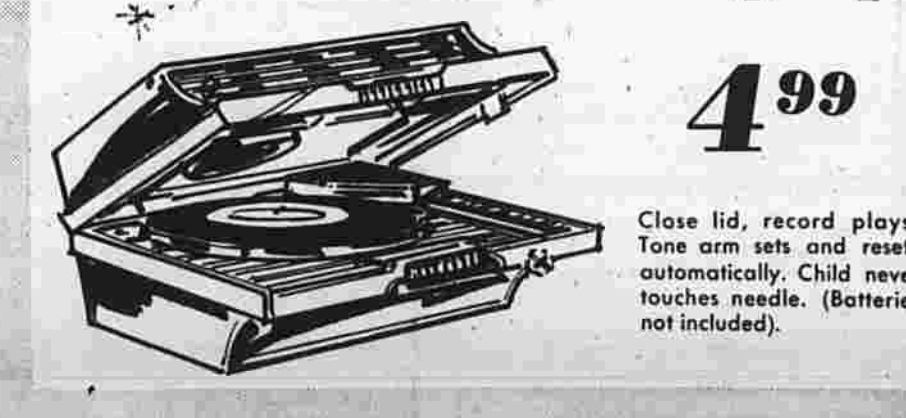

**Tolland Board of Education Issues Stringent New Bus Rules**

The Board of Education has adopted a revised policy for school busses, which applies to all local students from the elementary school level through high school and technical school passengers. The regulations place the bus driver in charge of bus and the public white en route to and from school.

Students must ride the assigned busses in assigned seats and load and depart at designated stops only. When leaving the busses the students are to cross in front of the bus only. Pupils must stand of the roadway while awaiting the bus and may not cross the street until signaled by the driver.

Parents of pupils will be held liable for any damage resulting from pupils defacing or causing destruction of school bus property. The students are prohibited from smoking, lighting matches or other devices; from standing or moving about except to get on or off the bus; or from extending any part of the anatomy out of the window.

A pupil may depart from the bus at a stop other than his own only with written permission from his parents and approval of the school principal.

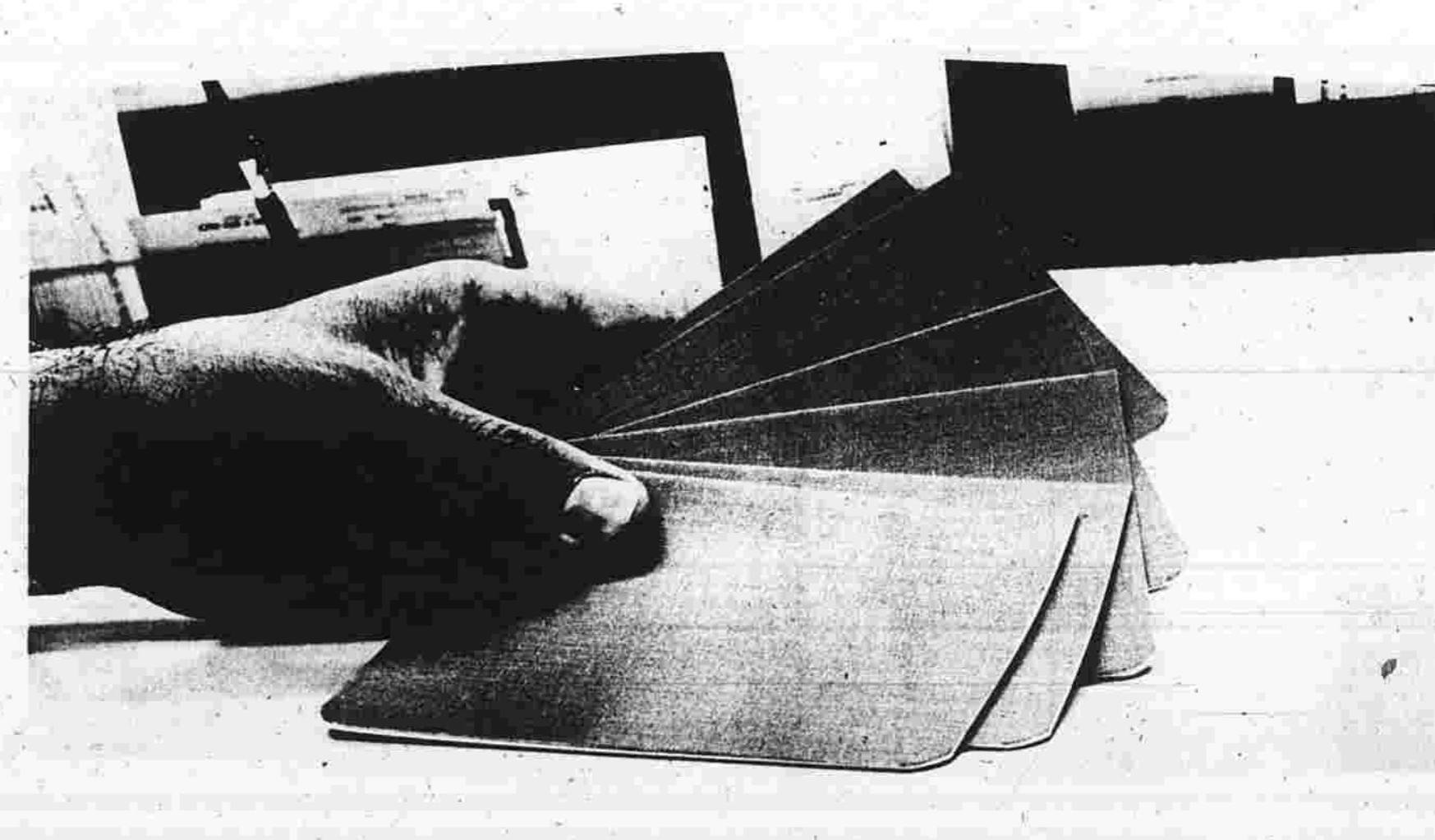

Sketch Wins Award For MHS Junior

Sixteen-year-old Scott Dickie, a Manchester High School junior, is one of 38 winners in the eighth annual creative arts contest conducted by Youth, a church publication. Each winner received a \$25 prize, and his entry is reproduced in the November issue of the magazine.

Scott's work, "Why?" is a pen and ink soldier's helmet along the butt of a rifle three times bayoneted in the ground. ### Democrats Pick Same State House Leaders

By DON MERLE, Associated Press Writer  
**HARTFORD (AP)**—A minor rebellion fomented by the Democratic town chairman of New Haven was squelched by the youthful leaders of the state House of Representatives Wednesday night as they persuaded a House caucus to keep them in power.

The two top House leaders remain Speaker William Ratchford of Danbury, who is breaking with tradition by succeeding himself, and Majority Leader Carl Ajello of Avon.

The caucus picked James Kennedy of Hartford as deputy speaker, thus putting down a minor uprising sparked by New Haven Town Chairman Arthur Barbieri.

Barbieri had tried to get Bruce Morris of New Haven in to the post of deputy speaker, threatening to help put a Republican into the Speaker's chair if Morris was defeated. Barbieri claimed to have 30 Democratic Assemblymen in his corner, but the power play fizzled when Morris withdrew his name from consideration.

The caucus then proceeded to pick John Papandrea of Meriden for deputy majority leader, and it approved Ratchford's state of assistant majority leaders—George Hanna of West Hartford, John Mahoney of Waterbury, John Prete of West Haven and William O'Neill of East Hampton. The Caucus then named Morris as a fifth assistant leader as a sort of consolation prize, making him the first Negro ever to hold a leadership position in the House.

Implausible as the Barbieri ploy seemed, it was nonetheless a real push. Before the caucus, Barbieri—and Waterbury Town Chairman Frank Santaguida—held a reception at a nearby hotel that lured some legislators. But Emilio Daddario, the defeated candidate for governor, was there to help neutralize the Barbieri operation.

The threatened revolt was taken seriously enough by Republican State Rep. Francis Collins of Brookfield, the leading contender for minority leader. For Collins to contact several Democratic legislators during the day, sounding them out on the possibility of his becoming Speaker.

But when the House Democrats came to the point of making their decision, the putative rebellion evaporated in fairly short order.

The result is being interpreted as a putdown for Barbieri and an oblique victory for State Chairman John Bailey, whom Barbieri would like to succeed. (It was no accident that Barbieri focused on the post of deputy speaker, which had been lined up for Kennedy, Bailey's son-in-law.)

The actual election of Ratchford as Speaker won't take place until Jan. 6, the first day of the 1971 session. All the members of the House vote on the speakership—which is why the post is vulnerable to a revolt by a few members of the majority party. It is customary, however, for the minority to vote along with the majority and make the vote unanimous.

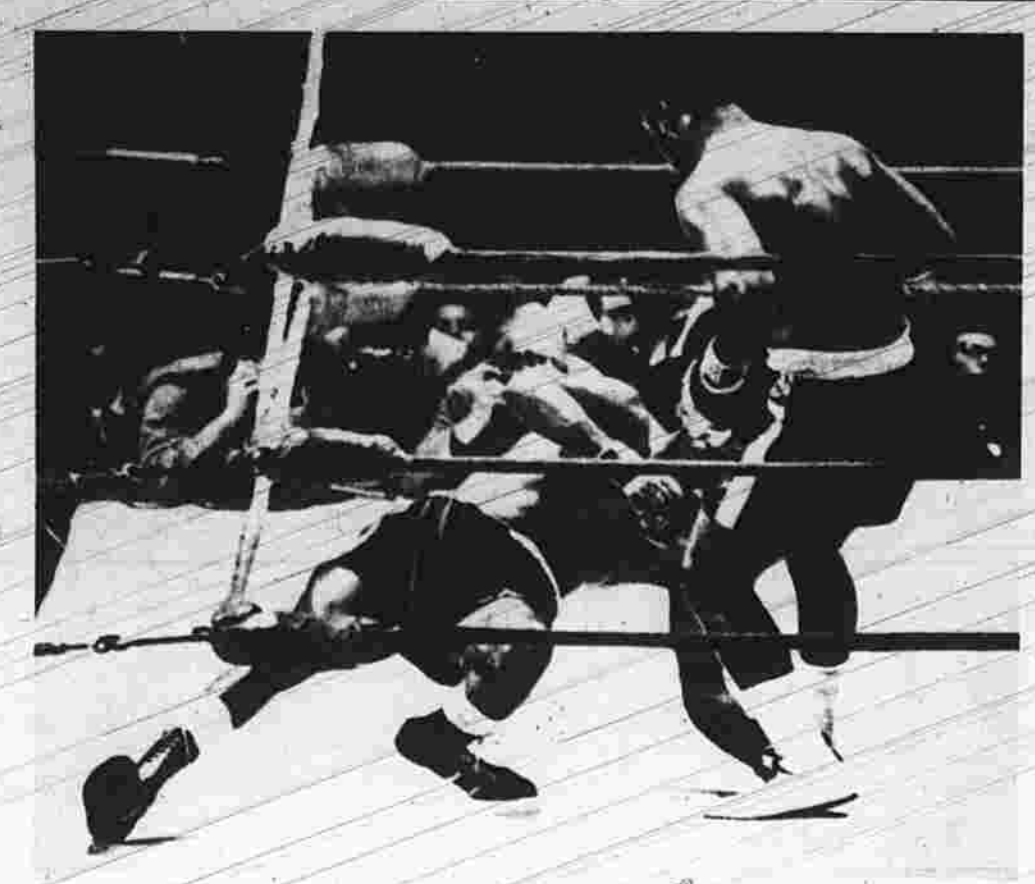
