John D. LaBelle, state's attorney for Hartford County, is the top policy maker for procedure in criminal law for all police and prosecutors in the county.

Designed to refresh and update education of officers on the beat, the course is repeated each week for 14 weeks, to a new group of 10 to 15 policemen.

LaBelle's presentation covers search methods with a warrant or incident to an arrest, as well as methods of line-ups, frisk procedures, and motor vehicle search.

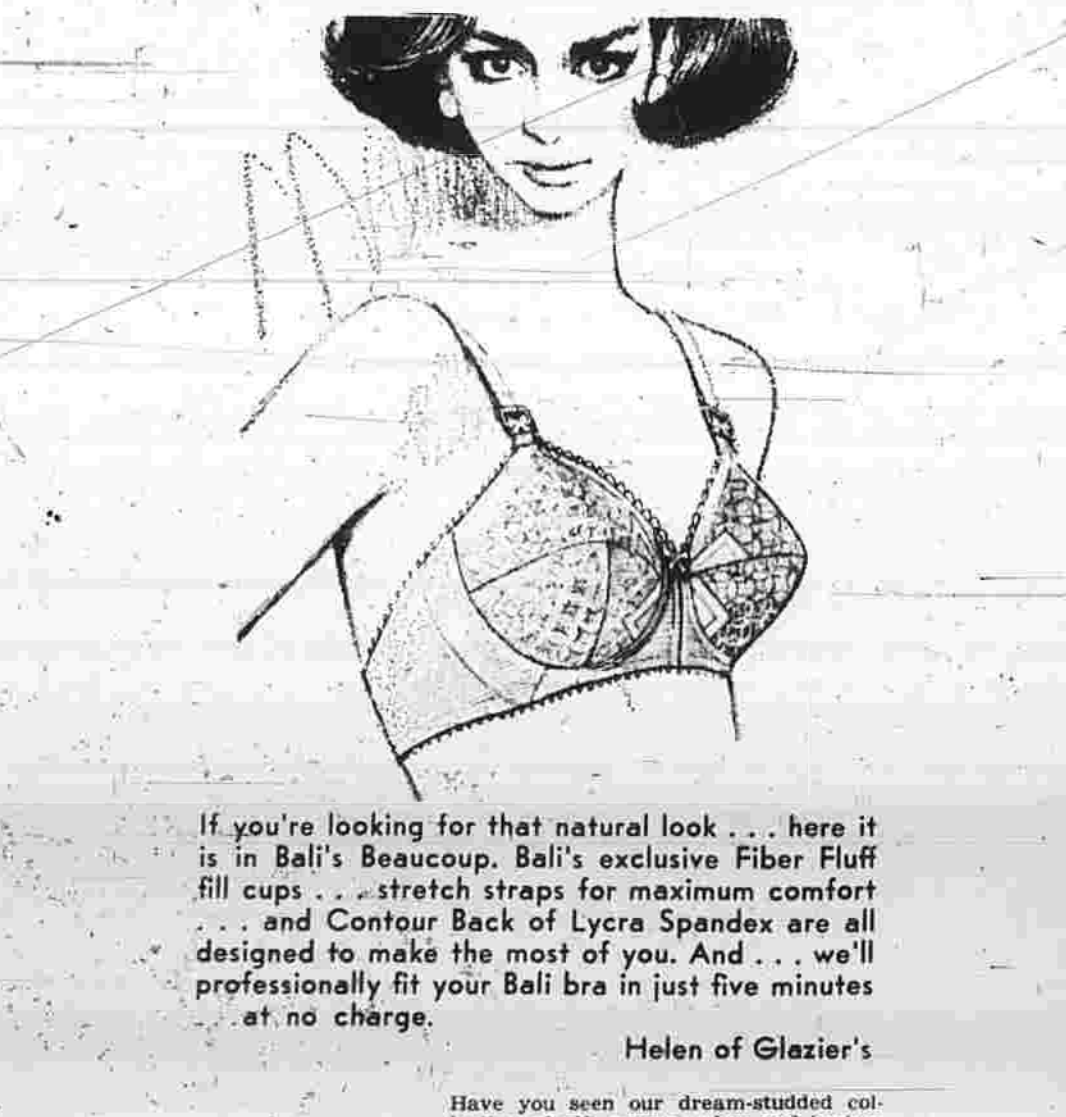
Gets \$100,000 Grant Wins Contract

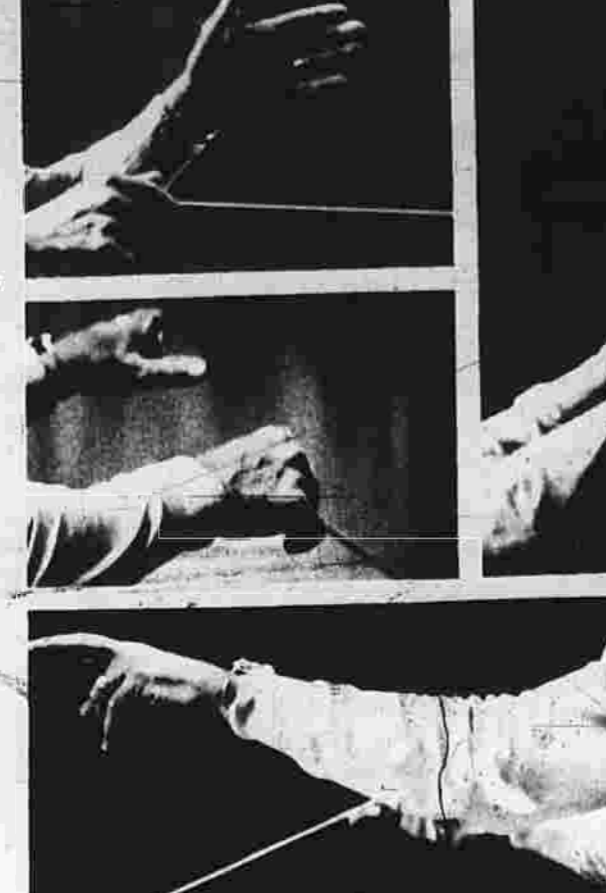

Singapore Mart Moves Every Night

SINGAPORE (AP) — Singapore's biggest supermarket moves every night. It has 66 locations and each is invisible by day.

But that's hardly strange in a city where your car is likely to change into a dining room table if you leave it too long in a parking lot.

The reason for these curious characteristics is Singapore's corps of hawkers—street vendors who sell everything from stolen dentures to fried noodles in the streets, and other specialties of this crowded city.

One elite corps of 3,000 runs the "Pasar Malam (Night Markets)," a rambling department store that is permitted to set up in several of 66 locations each night. On good nights in prime locations, it is a half-mile long.

Merchandise is varied, from a better mousetrap to piles of "Darky Toothpaste," or lingerie.

Best of all is Wednesday when the Night Market can operate near Orchard Road, the golden strip of tourists and rich foreigners. It's an automatic three-income bonus in cases like this.

Hawker: "That is \$9 (meaning Singapore dollars, or \$4 U.S. currency)."

Tourist: "You can U.S. dollars?"

Hawker: "Er... um, sure."

Office Funds Curfew Clamp In Guatemala Real Strangler

WASHINGTON (AP) — The House Rules Committee says retiring Speaker of the House John W. McCormack will be reimbursed for operation of his Boston office for the first two years of his retirement.

A resolution passed Tuesday also gave McCormack two staff employees whose salaries would be paid from House funds. The total pay of \$38,000 for the two was expected to be reduced by McCormack to \$27,000 or less.

With 42 years of House service McCormack qualifies for an annual pension of about \$50,000.

GUATEMALA (AP) — The curfew in Guatemala is so strict that doctors making emergency calls after 11 p.m. must have special permission and a military escort. Even firemen cannot be dispatched without the army's approval.

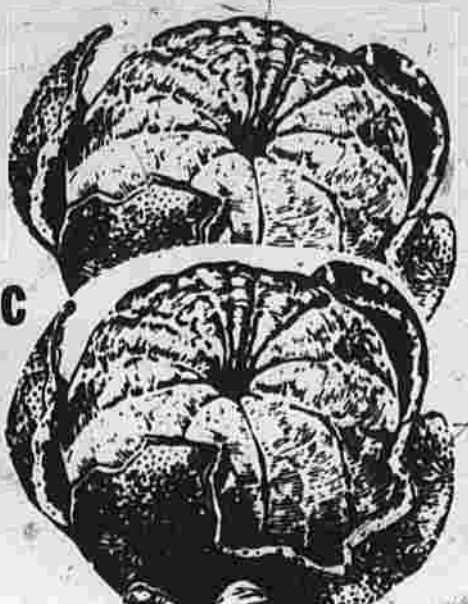

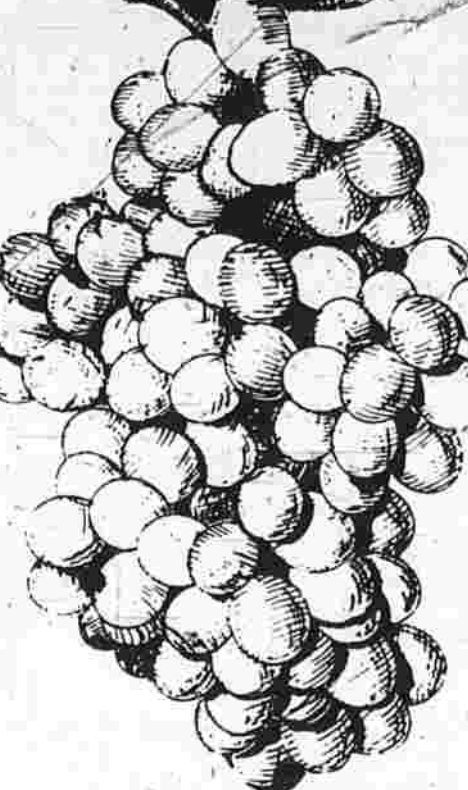

Compensation For Freight?

Truck driver Fred, on a downhill slope, suddenly discovered that his brakes had failed. To his consternation, the truck began to pick up speed. Finally Fred managed to bring it to a halt against a hillside.

A short time later, however, he suffered a stroke. Could he collect workmen's compensation for his disability?

In a court test, the company argued that he could not. "There was no physical injury at the time of the accident," said the company. "He just got very frightened. Workmen's compensation was never intended to protect a workman against mere fright."

But the court granted Fred's claim, since the "mere fright" had led directly to serious physical harm.

In most cases, compensation is indeed payable for fright that is followed by clear physical consequences. This is true even if the consequences are not immediately as in Fred's case. Take this situation:

Rumors of possible rioting began to swirl around an American agency in a foreign capital. The rioting never did break out, but several days of nervous tension finally brought one government employee down with a heart attack.

He too claimed workmen's compensation. And a court ruled that he was entitled to it. The court attached no great importance to the fact that his heart attack followed a prolonged period of "nervous tension" rather than a single scare.

Still, there at least must be a causal connection between the job and the disability. In another case, a workman with heart trouble suffered an attack after a mild disagreement with his foreman. Under these circumstances, a court decided that the man was not entitled to workmen's compensation.

The court said he had not been subjected to anything worse than "the common irritations to which all workers are occasionally subjected without untoward results." Therefore, said the court, his heart attack could not fairly be considered a product of his work.

Tate Trial Is Delayed To Monday

LOS ANGELES (AP) — The six-month-old Sharon Tate murder trial has been delayed again, until Monday when a new attorney in the case says he'll make a mistrial motion in behalf of defendant Leslie Van Houten.

"If the mistrial is denied, we will go forward with final arguments," said the lawyer, Maxwell Keith, whose 11th hour entry in the trial came with the disappearance of defense attorney Ronald Hughes.

Subbing for Hughes, Keith had to catch up on 15,000 pages of transcript in the complex trial, and he said Tuesday he hasn't finished his meeting with attorneys and prosecutors in the judge's chambers.

"I've read only things which pertain to Miss Van Houten," said Keith. He refused to state the grounds for the mistrial motion.

The veteran criminal attorney ruled out the possibility he would reopen Miss Van Houten's defense and call witnesses. "I don't intend to reopen unless Miss Van Houten suddenly decides she wants to," said Keith. "I don't know what her state of mind will be on Monday."

Miss Van Houten, 21, a long-haired brunette, is on trial with Charles Manson, 36, and two other women members of his hippie-like "family." Attorneys for the four rested their case without calling any witnesses.

Then Hughes vanished while on a Thanksgiving weekend trip to rugged Sequoia National Park in Ventura County north of Los Angeles, stalling the trial. Meanwhile, a grand jury hearing related to the Tate trial enters its third day today.

The state is seeking murder indictments against Manson and at least two members of his family for the alleged killing of Donald J. "Shorty" Shea, a ranchhand and a stuntman who vanished in August 1969. Police did extensive digging at the Spain Ranch where Shea lived at the same time the Manson family occupied it. No body was uncovered.

At Tuesday's session, ranch owner George Spain and several young former family members testified. Six long-haired girls — still loyal to Manson and regularly stationed themselves outside the hall of justice where the trial is held — waited outside the grand jury hearing room all day.

One blonde flashed a hand-lettered sign at arriving witnesses. It said: "Judith Day — A Snitch in Nine."

Democratic Contenders

McGovern Will Be First To Declare for Presidency

Editor's Note: Sometime next month Sen. George McGovern will declare his candidacy for the 1972 Democratic presidential nomination...

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. George McGovern, impelled by what he calls the frustration of powerlessness in the Senate...

But there may be political frustration ahead as McGovern begins an open campaign to overcome the lead he conceded Sen. Edmund S. Muskie holds over a crowded field of Democratic prospects...

But McGovern says, once he declares for the nomination a nationwide cadre will rally to him. "What I'm told is that I'm serious about running. They'll be serious about supporting me."

McGovern says the Vietnam war remains "the transcendent issue in American politics today." It is an issue he has pushed, particularly as a chief sponsor of legislation to compel U.S. withdrawal by the end of next year.

The Hatfield-McGovern Amendment was defeated. But McGovern campaigned for it on national television and helped fund \$100,000 to promote it. He was a key man, too, in a 1970 campaign-drive that raised over \$1 million for liberal Senate candidates.

And he still has the mailing lists of donors to those causes, a valuable commodity for a man vying for the presidency.

Small Recognition: And, because of his small recognition factor, the presidential primaries seem particularly important to McGovern. He needs a strong showing to prove he would win and to attract support from the professional Democrats, now lining up with Muskie.

"I'm going into a number of primaries, but I haven't decided which ones," McGovern says. "If you can't do well in a number of primaries, you can't do well in the fall."

The first primary is in New Hampshire—solid Muskie territory. McGovern does not rule out a New Hampshire race, but says he would not expect to win there.

There is political peril in that, for McGovern enters, Muskie would have someone to run against, and almost certainly someone to defeat. And that would make New Hampshire a far more valuable prize.

With all of these factors a high wall against his chances why does he bother?

Divorce Rate Growing Among Couples Over 45

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP) — The seven-year itch, traditionally a metaphor for the frustration of a marriage, may be a new cliché—the 20-year slump. In 1969, nearly one-fourth of all persons filing for divorce in the United States had been married 15 years or more.

And although current local figures aren't available, experts here seem to agree that the number of divorces among people over the age of 45 is growing.

Why, after enduring 15 or 20 or 25 years, does a marriage dissolve in divorce court? In most cases, experts say, because that marriage has been dissatisfying for years.

"Even physical divorce between husband and wife without a court declaration is not uncommon," said Jefferson Circuit Judge Marvin J. Sternberg. "They live separate and apart, sometimes even in the same house, sometimes even in the same bedroom, but their emotions and attitudes are such that they are separate and distinct."

For those and other reasons, marriages failing under the weight of years of accumulated conflict and frustration.

The age 45 often represents a natural breaking point, a last chance to arrive at a blow for free.
