By LYNN OLSON SALT LAKE CITY, Utah — Little Karyn Prestwich will open her Christmas presents Friday in a hospital bed, maimed in critical condition for almost a month with badly damaged kidneys.

The doctors who treated her said the little girl made an extraordinarily determined fight for life.

"It's taken quite a while for her to bounce back," said her mother, "and it will be at least another month before she can be released."

"She's getting terribly bored here," Mrs. Prestwich said. "The man didn't mean to shoot me," Mrs. Prestwich said. "He was waiting for her school bus when she was struck in the stomach by a rifle bullet.

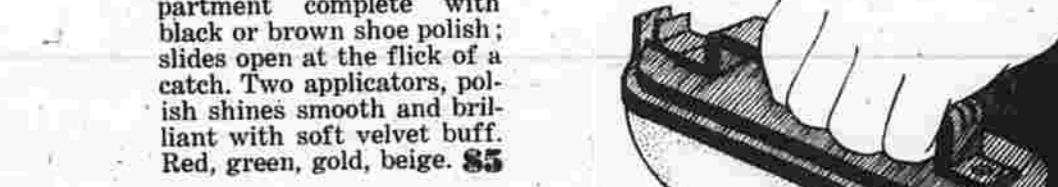

Miami Police-Black Split Given a \$171,000 Study

MIAMI (AP) — The federal government is betting \$171,000 that the "tarnished relationship between Miami policemen and blacks, caused by suspicion and hostile attitudes, can be brightened. In an experiment that is being watched nationally as a potential model for other cities, representatives from both sides now meet in face-to-face confrontations to unload their hang-ups. They spend eight hours a day arguing, criticizing each other, joking and saying things they would normally suppress. "I expect some attitudes will be changed, said Joseph Edwards, a 42-year-old Negro who directed the Police-Community Interaction Project. "Behavior may also be changed, both on the parts of the residents and the police," said Edwards. "Some people are going to leave this program without their attitudes or behavior being changed at all—but at least they may be more aware." The federally financed project will bring together 500 policemen and 500 residents of Miami's black Liberty City area in a series of two week "workshops" at the New Covenant Presbyterian Church.

New Filibuster Forecast Over Fate of Filibuster

WASHINGTON (AP) — Senate Republican Leader Hugh Scott of Pennsylvania predicted today the 92nd Congress may begin as the 91st Congress is likely to end—with a filibuster. He said this one may well be a filibuster over an attempt to end or drastically curtail the filibuster itself as a parliamentary delaying device. School Desegregation Seen Failure in Dixie

WASHINGTON (AP) — Six religious, civil rights and legal groups warned today that President Nixon's southern school desegregation program is in "imminent danger of failure" if new federal legislation is not passed. The American Friends Service Committee, the Delta Ministry and the National Council of American-Soviet Friendship also urged Congress to act. The groups reported that the program is "a wide variety of unequal, segregated classrooms and treatment," and the destruction of "all symbols of black identity schools officially designated as black pride." The report, it said, also said the closing of "black schools in the 1960s has caused the black neighborhoods had caused and dehumanizing as the white school system, the firing or demotion of black teachers and principals, and a "disproportionate burden on the school children and parents."

'Bugbear' Brings Statement On Publications by Students

The recent appearance of "The Bugbear" on the high school scene has prompted the Board of Education to issue a policy statement on student publications. The statement stresses student rights and the importance of the press.

"The Bugbear", an independently published student newspaper, is the work of five students, three of whom were former members of the school's regular school paper. It was sold on school grounds at 10 cents per issue.

The school board's statement makes a positive approach, stressing the importance of protecting the student's right to freedom of speech, particularly noting that a student should be free to investigate and present to others all facets and opinions on any issue presented in the course of the educational process.

This right, it continues, is not absolute, and ceases at that point where it infringes on the rights of another.

"The mature exercise of the rights and privileges of free speech and press by the student demands the exercise of the concomitant responsibility to respect the rights of others to respect legally constituted authority," the board said.

The board set down a more definite policy on school publications, saying that any extracurricular activities for promoting and opening channels of communication between students, faculty and administration are encouraged.

These activities may take the form of newspapers, sensitivity groups, discussion groups, or any other media mutually acceptable to students, faculty and administration. They must be under the direction of a faculty advisor unless otherwise directed by the principal.

No cost will be charged for the yearbook, which is specially funded, all other school-sponsored publications are to be available at no charge to the entire student body and faculty.

Although the statement stresses that the opportunity to express varying viewpoints in school publications should be encouraged, it acknowledges that students have the right, individually or collectively, to publish material outside the school.

"It is considered appropriate," the report said, "that such publication and distribution should normally take place outside of the school environment, including transportation to and from school."

The report concludes with a list of conditions under which student publications produced outside of school, may be distributed on school property:

1. They must bear the names of editors and staff responsible for content.
2. They may not be sold on school property, nor may collection or donations for such publications be accepted on school property or on school buses.
3. A time and place for distribution must be established in cooperation with the principal.

4. A copy of the paper must be reviewed by the principal at least seven days prior to the planned distribution date. If in the opinion of the principal, the publication contains libelous or obscene language, advocates illegal actions, or is tantamount to any group or individual, direct or by inference, the paper forum may not be distributed.

5. The sponsor of the publication shall have the right to appeal to the superintendent of schools, and ultimately, the Board of Education, to consider those parts ruled objectionable by the principal.

6. Any attempt to circumvent items 1 through 6 above shall subject the student to disciplinary action, including suspension.

Effect on "Bugbear"

The effect that this policy will have on future issues of "The Bugbear" is questionable. It is apparently hoped that the talents and efforts which went into its creation will be channeled into a school-sponsored activity.

Since, in its present form, "The Bugbear" does not conform to the standards set down by the board, its continued existence will depend on the strength of student communication outside the school environment.

No one seems to question the necessity of a place for students to express and explore controversial subjects. The questioning is determining the proper forum.

In researching this matter with many parents and other interested citizens, a surprising large number applaud the existence of an independent student publication and consider it a valuable part of the educational experience.

However, these same persons, without exception, felt that such a paper to be effective, material must be presented tastefully.

Admittedly, definitions of "good taste" will vary with each individual, but, as our parents expressed it, "There is an innate sense of morality and sensitivity in each of us that should enter into its creation will be channeled into a school-sponsored activity."

"As members of the Greater Rockville Area Clergy Council we have become aware of the increasing number of planned activities which impinge upon the long established tradition of Sunday being a day set aside for the Churches and for the family," the statement said.

Pointing to their responsibility for the spiritual well-being of the community, council members said, "We intend herein to seek the continued well being of all."

Commenting those "who by their high motivation and generous efforts — parents, teachers and all others who seek to benefit both our youth and our adults by such programs," Council members cautioned that they feel the situation may increasingly pose a problem.

The concern of the council was perhaps prompted by the fact that some of the schools are having their Christmas parties on Sundays and that during the year many sports activities and banquets are held on Sundays.

Commenting that their work concerns working closely with juvenile authorities and their families and relations.
