The men who would be President
-Bayh: 'I am fed up and frustrated'

EDITOR'S NOTE: Candidates for the presidential nomination of their parties, and other political leaders, were invited by Newspaper Enterprise Association to contribute articles concerning presidential character. What sort of person should be elected president on Nov. 2, 1976, and why? Following is one of these contributions.

Political prognostication is always risky. But I am confident that in November of 1976 the American people will elect a Democrat to the presidency who has the vision to see what must be done to set us on the right course once more and the will and determination to do it.



Sen. Birch Evans Bayh was born near Terre Haute, Ind., on Jan. 23, 1928. Bayh, who owns and operates a family farm, received an agricultural degree from Purdue University in 1951, and a law degree from Indiana University in 1960. He served in the Indiana House of Representatives from 1956 to 1964. He served in the U.S. Senate from 1965 to 1974. Bayh helped secure passage of the 26th Amendment to the Constitution, on presidential succession; the 26th Amendment, on the 18-year term for Senators; and the pending 17th Equal Rights Amendment. Bayh led the fight against confirmation of Nixon Supreme Court nominees Carwell and Haynsworth. He also sponsored the Jeanine Justice Bill. Bayh serves on the Senate Judiciary and Appropriations Committees. An Army veteran, he is married and has one child.

Indirect subsidies total \$88 billion

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Indirect subsidies paid through the tax system will cost the government \$88 billion this year — a nearly as much as the defense budget and a \$4 billion increase over 1975.
These subsidies, 77 in number, are called "tax expenditures" — taxes the government chooses not to impose on income which is put to purposes it wants to encourage or reward.

Carter's Iowa showing impressive

WASHINGTON — If I am Jimmy Carter, I am not drafting my acceptance speech as Democratic nominee for President, but I am feeling better than those other candidates who ran in Iowa's precinct caucuses.
To reporters, I would contain my modesty and remind them that I ran first by better than two to one over my closest rival, Indiana's Sen. Birch Bayh, and I would ask why Bayh and the four other candidates lost. But I am feeling better than those other candidates who ran in Iowa's precinct caucuses.
In fact, Carter's showing was impressive, even given the fact he was favored, because a lot of politicians and pundits had expected Bayh to cut into the former Georgia governor's early lead. This didn't happen, despite a last-minute Bayh blitz. Carter's lead over Bayh — 27.53 per cent of the vote to Bayh's 13.16 per cent — was landslide stuff.
As for the other candidates, they wound up running for exercise. Former Sen. Frank P. Harris of Oklahoma was third with a puny 9.93 per cent, followed by Rep. Morris Udall of Arizona with 5.37 per cent. Sargent Shriver with 3.30 per cent, and Sen. Henry Jackson of Washington with 1.76 per cent.
