TRENTON, N.J. (UPI) — Rubin "Hurricane" Carter, sent to prison nine years ago for the murder of three persons in a Paterson store, probably will be a free man next Wednesday. A bail hearing is scheduled in Paterson on that day, and Passaic County Prosecutor Barrell Ives Humphreys says he will not oppose the request provided the amount of bail is substantial.

State income tax too risky to adopt in election year

HARTFORD (UPI) — The annual hearing on the touchy political issue of an income tax found agreement on only one point — it's too hot for lawmakers to risk in an election year. About 150 persons, almost equally split for and against the controversial tax proposal, gathered in Representatives Thursday night for a Finance Committee hearing on a raft of tax proposals. An income tax was legislated in 1971, but repealed because it could take effect because of a public outcry. Since then, it has been considered a sacred cow in Connecticut politics and many lawmakers were elected in 1974 on a pledge to oppose the levy. Gov. Ella T. Grasso is adamantly opposed to it.

Marijuana rulings are contradictory

VERNON (UPI) — Tolland County Superior Court Judge Jay E. Rubinow has ruled that Connecticut's law against possession of marijuana with intent to sell is unconstitutional. That ruling Thursday contradicts a Feb. 24 decision in New Haven Superior Court that struck down the marijuana law. Rubinow said he could not find the law unconstitutional when there is dispute and no conclusive evidence about the effects of marijuana on users. Rubinow's decision came as he denied a public defender's motion to dismiss three charges relating to marijuana against a 21-year-old Ellington man. "There is sufficient dispute concerning the consequences of marijuana to preclude the court from drawing any conclusions of fact with respect to its effect on persons who use it," Rubinow said. Public Defender Lawrence C. Klaczak asked Rubinow to take judicial notice of Judge Robert L. Berdon's ruling in New Haven Superior Court. Berdon had declared the 1974 state statute unconstitutional because it classifies marijuana in the same category with what he called two "far more dangerous drugs," barbiturates and amphetamines. Berdon said persons convicted of intent to sell marijuana, amphetamines or barbiturates face the same maximum penalty and that violates the equal protection clause of the state and federal constitutions. Berdon's decision is being appealed by the state to the state Supreme Court.

Suspicious home fire under investigation

Rivosa said the fire, extinguished by a neighbor, caused slight damage to a staircase where the package had been placed. Authorities suspect the fire was set deliberately. Rivosa said the blaze could have been severe if not for early detection of the flames. Firefighters were not called to the scene at the 7:50 a.m. incident but were notified later in the day.
