Youths learn auto mechanics and get paid for it, too

Spending hours underneath an automobile may not be your idea of the best way to spend a warm August morning, but for ten Manchester Home, 65 Elm St., is in charge of youths, the opportunity to repair cars is educational and financially rewar-

The ten youths are enrolled in an memorial gifts may be made to Em- auto mechanics course taught by manuel Lutheran Church, 311 Capitol Adrian Groot, who teaches automotives at Manchester High School. The students learn about repairing ears and get paid for it. too.

Sounds like an ideal situation, doesn't it? The ten students are among the 119 Manchester youths who are employed this summer through the federally sponsored Comprehensive Youth Work

The program places the youngsters in part-time jobs with nonprofit businesses. They work 25 hours a week and are paid \$2.31 an hour. The ten who are enrolled in the

auto course get an extra-special deal. They work 17 hours a week and spend an additional eight taking the course with Groot. They are paid for a full 25-hour work week

The course meets four mornings a week from 8 a.m. to noon. The class is broken up into two sections, so each student attends two four-hour sessions per week.

The classes, which are held in the auto garage at Manchester High School, started on June 28 and will continue until Aug. 20. So far this summer, the two groups of mechanics have repaired 40 cars, Groot said.

And the work hasn't just been checking the oil and washing the windows. They've rebuilt engines, repaired clutches, and fixed brakes. Cars in need of repair are supplied by friends or even the students themselves.

"There's a feeling of accomplishment for them," Groot said. It's real to them when they are working on their own car."

of the garage that is having its pistons replaced. There are eight pistons in an

engine. If you've got 20 kids in a class, it's tough," he said. Groot also likes the length of each daily session.

During the school year, kids are in here for 50 minutes a class. It takes about that long to take an & engine apart. That means the morning class will take the engine apart, and the afternoon group will put it together. With four hours, there's

enough time to do it all," he said. Groot called the summer auto program "exceptional. His students also had words of

praise for the program. Cord Bridgeman said, "It's great. You get right into the car and start doing something. It isn't like you're just sitting behind a desk.'
