## Socialist Workers Party to pursue suit against FBI

WASHINGTON (UPI) - Socialist Workers Party leaders Wednesday said they will push their \$39 million damage suit charging government harassment despite the Justice Department decision to end the FBI's long investigation of the party. The department disclosed Tuesday that Attorney General Edward H. Levi had ordered the investigation ended in accordance with new guidelines he has established for FBI domestic security investigations.

Assistant U.S. Attorney William S. Brandt told U.S. District Judge Thomas P. Griesa in New York in a Sept. 13 letter now made public that Levi's decision "will have a significant im-But Peter Camejo, SWP presidential candidate, told a
