The Melody brothers from East Hartford

The four Melody brothers of East Hartford tried to explain their personal lives and in a total of 144 years of working at Pratt & Whitney Aircraft, a division of United Technologies.

Only Capt. Melody did not return from service. His plane was destroyed in 1944. Back home, David, Walter and Joseph moved steadily up through the ranks holding jobs of more and more responsibility.

They are all proud of Pratt & Whitney's world leadership in the area through their school days. A highlight of their working years there came in the 1950s, recalled Robert.

Pratt & Whitney made fine engines for fighting aircraft well into the 1950s but was not called upon by the government to make jet engines. The new field was left to other industries and to Rolls Royce in Great Britain.

'Messiah' soloists include a countertenor

Soloists for Handel's "Messiah" being performed on Dec. 5 by the Manchester Civic Orchestra and Chorale, Dr. Jack Heller director, will include a countertenor.

Singing the solos usually sung by a contralto is Kenneth W. Fitch of West Willington.

A graduate of the University of Connecticut with a bachelor's degree in applied voice, Fitch spent four years with the University Chamber Singers and the Concert Choir, three of which he was featured soloist. He completed two European tours and one Puerto Rican tour as a soloist, and also served two years as a vocal lab teacher at UConn while he was an undergraduate.

He studied at the Summer Institute for Baroque Performance at Oberlin Conservatory of Music, Oberlin, Ohio, with Russell Oberlin, countertenor. He was also featured soloist with the Dartmouth College Choral Society, Simmons College Concert Choir and Union College Concert Choir.

Fitch is currently soloist with the Christ Church Cathedral Choir of men and boys in Hartford where he has been for four years. He was a special vocal teacher at Rham High School last year, and also lectured in voice at UConn last spring.

Marilee Gordon Plaks of Simsbury, is the soprano soloist. Mrs. Plaks studied clarinet at Ithaca College of Music, Ithaca, N.Y., and combined the study of voice and clarinet at Potsdam State Teachers College, Potsdam, N.Y. She toured New York State schools as clarinet soloist and vocalist in a trio.

She served three years as principal clarinetist with the Binghamton Symphony Orchestra in Binghamton, N.Y., and as soprano soloist with the Oratoria Chorale.

Mrs. Plaks has been soloist at the South Congregational Church in Hartford, with the Hartford Chamber Choir and the Simsbury Light Opera Company. She is currently soloist at the Unitarian Church and Temple Beth Israel, both in West Hartford.

She was soprano soloist several times with the Hartford Chorale and Orchestra, three of which were in performances of the "Messiah."

Marshall Cooper of Hartford will sing the tenor arias in the "Messiah."

He graduated from the Hartt College of Music, University of Hartford, in June 1976. A voice student of Cantor Arthur Koret in Hartford, he has appeared in many musicals, light operas and operas. He has appeared with the Connecticut Opera Association in "Don Carlo," and will appear as Canio in "Pagliacci" for Hartt next spring. He sang the tenor solos for a choral group which traveled to Italy and performed for the Pope at the Vatican.

The sea: defensive barrier or invasion path?

The oceans of the world can play many roles in warfare. Mastery of trade routes can be used to blockade an opponent or terrorize his shipping, and water can protect one's homeland or provide a means of invading enemy territory.

The profound impact of the oceans on an individual nation can clearly be seen in the case of England. Englishmen traditionally have been aware that their rights as "Englishmen" and the existence of such English institutions as a limited parliamentary government have depended upon the protection of the British Navy rather than on a large standing army.

The success of the British Empire in the 18th Century resulted largely from her skillful commercial and military use of the sea. It was far easier for the British to move goods by sea between England and even such distant points as India than for such rivals as the French to use the primitive roads of Europe.

Mahan believed that the proper role of a navy is to shield the passage of friendly shipping and limit enemies to furtive raids and occasional use of the nautical highway.

Although his theory stood up fairly well in the light of the First World War, the important role of the submarine had to be recognized. These new underwater forces had the enormous advantage over more conventional naval forces of offering vast disruption for a modest investment in personnel and capital.

Japan's primary aim was to gain control of the resources of Southeast Asia, which had to be transported to the home islands by sea. To protect this empire, Japan seized a string of islands within which she expected her navy to exercise command of the sea.

At the end of the war, Japan had only one million tons left. It is impossible to say which of the two interdependent off-

shoots - the seizure of the Empire by naval forces or the submarine war - was decisive, but certainly the Japanese were strangled by sea power.

Ocean lifelines

Nevertheless, the naval war in the Atlantic after 1939 was reminiscent of World War I. The Allies used their sea power to attack the coast of Europe.

Matters were more complex in the Pacific. There, both the American and Japanese navies were led by exponents of Mahan. In addition, the U.S. Navy had a large and effective submarine force.

Japan, an island empire, was totally dependent upon imports; indeed, it was estimated that she required six million tons of shipping (she had seven million in 1941) to carry on her war effort.

In addition, today's aircraft have great range, offensive power, and presumably accurate targeting information. Air power thus makes not only the water contiguous to land extremely dangerous, but the open sea as well.

Because the only kind of energy which moves easily through the depths of the sea is sonic, submarine detection has been dependent on sonar, a kind of radar using sound in place of radio waves.

waves in the sea are subject to erratic behavior due to temperature gradients, schools of fish, and even differences in salinity. Hence any attempt to find submarines on a large scale requires a subtle understanding of the structure of the sea - perhaps combined with some radically new means of detection.

Should either superpower achieve a means of finding the other's missile submarines with certainty, it might - at least in theory - attack them and thus be able to carry out a first strike.

These invulnerable submarine fleets have missiles which can, at least in principle, penetrate the heartland of the enemy and attack it directly without worrying about landing troops at beachheads or supplying an existing logistic network.

Limited war

But it would be premature to assume that even these technological wonders have completely outmoded the classical principles of naval warfare, particularly those of Mahan. If anything is characteristic of the late 20th century, it is "limited war."

One can easily imagine a "war at sea" today in which both sides used different kinds of weapons (which may or may not include nuclear weapons) more or less freely, but severely restricted the interaction of the naval war with the land forces, where certain kinds of military operations were pursued very aggressively and others were not.

Such possibilities are, in my view, substantially larger than much naive if reasonable-sounding discussion would indicate. On the other hand we need to know more about these possibilities before we can reach definite conclusions.
