The use of bisects in the old days must have been a convenience. One cover in the group required 71/2 pence (back in 1856). The sender used a couple of threes, and then snipped another one in hall. This car's ting was done dagonally, balia indicates that a bisect can rum in any directions as long as the value is clear
There is a third cut-up in the collection that is a little cheaper-a mere ten thousand or so. It is half of a sixpense stamp showing Prince Albert (consort of Queen Victoria). It had been stuck with evident abandon on a letter sheet, almost missing the upper edge, as if there was a hasty snip-lap-stick-and-away. The destination was Montreal, in 1858. This stamp, Scott No. 10, when used (but entire) is listed at only $\$ 1.000$ - bad enough! - but half of one on a cover goes up out of sight.
