Miner awaits rescue

TOWER CITY, Pa. (UPI)—Ronald Alley, trapped deep in the blackness of a coal mine for a third night, called for more food and a cup of coffee Thursday while rescue workers doggedly chipped away at a 50-foot wall of coal to free him.

While efforts continued to free Alley, hope waned for the survival of the other seven. State and federal officials, in an attempt to locate the others, placed a seismic device on a hillside over the general area of the accident.

Shutack said much of the water that inundated the mine has drained away and rescuers have encountered depths of only about four feet.

Tokyo police fear new attacks

TOKYO (UPI)—Police said today they fear an ultra-rightist raid on a leading business organization Thursday may signal the start of a new series of extremist attacks.

A police spokesman said there are about 50 ultraright organizations in Japan with 7,000 members. Police had not considered them dangerous and surveillance has been loose.

Officers said they fear the attack may usher in an era of violence from both left and right-wing extremists.

The latest increase in coffee prices already running high came from Hills Bros. Coffee, Inc., which announced an immediate boost to \$3.68 a pound.

Chicago grocer Paul Butera urged Consumer Sales Commissioner Jany Byrne to push a one-day-a-week boycott among consumers, restaurant owners and supermarkets in a bid to check the runaway market.

He said a universal one-day boycott in Chicago would cut the city's consumption by 15 to 20 per cent.

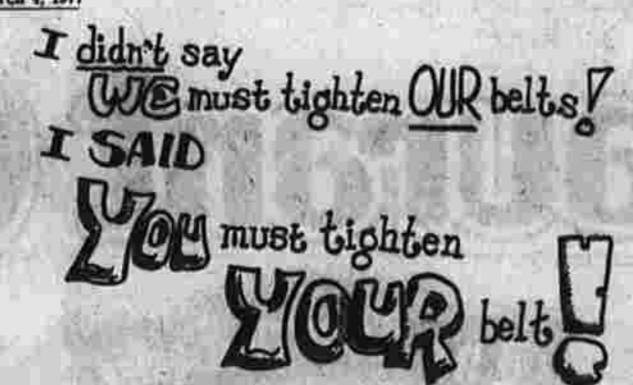
