Another benefit of exercise is its sedative effect on nervous tension,he

To get any benefit from exercise. basevich said one has to breathe hard. Athletes have demonstrated from 120 to 130 heartbeats a minute. he said. Conversely, an inactive person demonstrates about 100 to 120 heartbeats a minute. The longer it takes for your heartbeat to return to normal, the less physically fit you are, he said.

Students at Martin School were the first school children in the state to see and state their reactions to a new film Manchester Police Department, said he hopes the vandalism that was shown Wednesday by the Manchester Board of Police.

fanchester Board of Realtors. The local board has purchased the 11 minute film, called, "Vandalism, Why?" to use in the community and schools as part of its "Make America Better" program to

The local effort is part of a statewide effort against vandalism by the Connecticut Association of Realtors, Inc. Marlene A. Clark from the state "Make America Better" committee was on hand for the first showing o the film, which the board has made available. Manchester board is the first to take an initiative on the program, Mrs. Clark said.

Mrs. Norma Marshall, co-chairman of the local board's committee, was present for the program with Mrs. Shirley McCray, chairman of the Manchester Chamber of Commerce Motion committee and Scott Garman, nember of the youth task force of Motion. Garman served as discussion leader with the children

after the film was shown. The Realtors hope to use young persons in all the presentations at the schools. The film focuses on the wide extent of vandalism and he problems it causes for communities, schools and the dividuals involved.

The children's comments on Garman's first question, "Why do people vandalize?" included the following: "They like to do it; it's a way to express anger; they think it's fun; they think it's grown-up; it makes them seem tough; because they don't have anything constructive to do and it's easier to destroy than

Garman told the children that any type of vandalism i Ned Lomersona student in the Manchester Community College art pick-up litter and encourage others to do so. Some of the children's suggestions on what could be done with money communities spend annually on vandalism repairs included "build recreation places, buy

make more room in the schools." Garman said that \$50,000 a year is spent in Mancheste to repair vandalism in the schools every year. That is only part of a larger figure of \$136,850 spent by a total of seven town departments to repair or replace property damaged by vandalism in the 1975-76 fiscal year. The other departents that spend large amounts on vandalism repairs in are the park, highway, police, water and sewer, recreation and cemetery, according to statistics

compiled by the town. School vandalism in the entire country has been given a conservative estimate of one-half billion dollars per year. The film also noted the problems of peer pressure among youth to vandalize. Garman asked the children what they would do if dared to vandalize. The students suggested more severe punishments to

curb vandals and group efforts to clean-up the destruction.
The state Realtors board surveyed 25 police chiefs and law enforcement officers in the state and found that 15 of the towns are experiencing an increase in vandalism, with the 10 to 15-year-old age group responsible for most



John and Jane Doe sit cross-legged on the family room faculty members and administrators about providing better choices about their education." Glossy booklets from colleges surround the high school Elaine H. El-Khawas, the report's author and a staffer becomes standard, high school students like John and graduates are among good persons to question. juniors starting their college-shopping early.

Puzzlement engulfs them for a simple reason: much of the sales promotion material from the colleges is sprinkled with promises sounding too good to be true. Some of the promises are.

Not all candid A lot of student recruitment - sales promotion material put out by colleges may contain less than candid reports of what a student might expect, a National Task Force on Better Information for Student Choice says. John and Jane are on the right track if they refuse to believe all they read - or "hear." Colleges often send

records to prospective students. The Task Force, coordinated by the Education Commission of the States, urges all colleges to develop more straightforward statements of what they can offer to Better facts needed

Students, said the Task Force, need better facts on costs and financial aid, on the academic and social environment they will be exposed to in college, on what they may expect to gain by signing up at a particular college.

As college enrollments decline — an expected happening - competition for students will build up. Some schools might lose credibility if they don't write candidly about themselves, the Task Force warns.

If they don't do so voluntarily, authorities say, the government might force the schools to practice more "truth in recruitment materials" - and school catalogues, as well. Persons from 11 colleges were on the Task Force,

financed by a grant from the Fund for the Improvement of Postsecondary Education. Students polled The 11 schools polled their students about areas where more and better information would be helpful.


