MOGADISHU, Somalia (UPI) — Somalia warned Friday that relations with the Soviet Union and Cuba are in "great jeopardy" because the two Communist countries are stepping up military aid to its arch-enemy Ethiopia.

President Mohammed Siad Barre, in a speech to the nation marking the eighth anniversary of the revolution that brought him to power, denounced Moscow's "frantic one-sided support" for the Addis Ababa government.

HARTFORD (UPI) — Recommendations have been made to end Connecticut's system of parole, but a recent study indicates ex-convicts tend to be rearrested more often when they are unsupervised by a parole officer.

A Department of Correction study of 173 men released from prison in 1974 shows 66 percent of the 115 released without supervision were convicted of new crimes within a year of their release.

WORCESTER, Mass. (UPI) — A Worcester Superior Court jury Friday found Robert Wilson, 28, of Keene, N.H., guilty of murdering a Greenfield auto body shop owner and his accountant in March 1976 after a \$118 robbery.

Wilson was sentenced to two consecutive life terms at Walpole State Prison by Judge John Moriarty, one for each second-degree murder count.

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The former head of the Korean CIA Friday traced Korea's Washington payoff operation to a 1968 meeting among himself, Tongsun Park and then Rep. Richard Hanna, D-Calif., saying Hanna agreed to "distribute money among U.S. congressmen."

SACRAMENTO, Calif. (UPI) — A federal judge has overturned two Nixon administration food stamp regulations in a move that could affect up to three million needy persons nationally.

District Court Judge Thomas J. MacBride declared void the two regulations because they were imposed in violation of two federal laws. The rules governed the way food stamps could be issued on an emergency basis.

Berkowitz to be tried

NEW YORK (UPI) — David Berkowitz was found mentally competent Friday to stand trial for the last of the six "Son of Sam" murders, and his lawyer said he would raise a defense of innocent by reason of insanity.

"Everyone agrees he understands the charges against him," Brooklyn Supreme Court Justice John Starkey ruled after a day and a half of hearings.

"Is he oriented in time and place? The answer is yes. Has he established a working relationship with his attorney. Again, yes. Therefore I find we are able to proceed."

Starkey issued the decision after hearing expert testimony from Dr. Daniel Schwartz, the court-appointed psychiatrist who said Berkowitz was not competent to assist in his own defense, and Dr. David Abrahamson, who was appointed by the prosecution and who found Berkowitz fit for trial.

Starkey asked prosecuting and defense attorneys to appear in court Nov. 2 for motions, but did not set an official trial date. He ordered Berkowitz moved from the psychiatric ward at Kings County Hospital to a regular jail.

After the hearing, defense attorney Ira Jultak said he was convinced the ruling was "an eminently fair decision" and said Berkowitz was "perfectly satisfied" with the ruling.

Jultak raised the possibility that despite Berkowitz' wishes to be put away, he would plead his client innocent by reason of insanity. "There's a point at which you must consider the defendant's wishes, and then there's a point when you must override them," Jultak said.

The hearings had many sensational moments, including several pleas by Berkowitz that the judge "lock me up and throw away the key" so he could not kill again, and the playing of a 70-minute tape recording in which the defendant said he was driven to the murders "by howling demons."

Starkey's decision overruled Schwartz, who had concluded the 24-year-old postal worker was "paranoid" and mentally unfit to stand trial or participate in his own defense.

"Looking at him and observing him, it was the only conclusion I could come to," Starkey said after the hearing. "The possibility entered my mind that his actions were caused by rejection by girls. That if he can't have them, he'll do something else."

Asked if he believed Berkowitz' claims that he was driven to murder by demons, Starkey said, "I don't know if it's delusion, hallucination, or if it's contrived in his mind."

Rhyme used to make point in diplomacy

BELGRADE, Yugoslavia (UPI) — "Sticks and stones may break your bones," Arthur Goldberg told the Russians Friday. "But names will never hurt you."

Goldberg, former Supreme Court justice and chief U.S. delegate to the Belgrade conference, resorted to the nursery rhyme to explain to delegates why Western criticism of Soviet human rights policies is not meddling in Soviet internal affairs.

Goldberg was responding to Soviet-bloc protests against Western charges that the Communist bloc countries are violating the 1975 Helsinki agreement. The Belgrade conference is reviewing compliance of the accord.

Carter says energy plan is medicine nation needs

DES MOINES, Iowa (UPI) — President Carter defended his energy program Friday night as "bitter medicine" that must be taken to avoid letting the nation's economic strength slip away.

In remarks prepared for a Democratic Jefferson-Jackson Day dinner in Des Moines, Carter called on Americans "to recognize a harsh reality, the reality that the age of cheap and unlimited gas is over."

"In this sense, the plan is bitter medicine," he said.

Carter made two stops — at Detroit and Des Moines — on the first day of a three-day tour of the Mideast and West devoted to taking his problems

to the people and listening to theirs. He planned to spend the night as a guest in an Iowa farm home outside Des Moines.

In Detroit, the president fielded questions on urban problems. He was challenged to act as "the hope of the poor people" and responded "the nation will feel the benefits of what we've done in the next few months."

But Carter's round-table discussion on urban living problems with 13 persons from midwestern states was not altogether a success.

Rep. John Conyers, a black Democratic congressman from Detroit who has criticized Carter on

racial issues, said the meeting had almost no value.

Romelia M. Carter, a Youngstown, Ohio, youth agency director, complained that when she asked the President what programs he was planning "all he said was he was planning something."

Gunther says Grasso pressured Leonard

HARTFORD (UPI) — Gov. Ella T. Grasso apparently pressured State Police Commissioner Edward P. Leonard to reverse his position in the Peter Reilly case, a gubernatorial hopeful said Friday.

Sen. George Gunther, a Republican from Leonard's hometown of Stratford, said he did not know the basic facts of the celebrated Reilly case, but nevertheless he rebuked Mrs. Grasso for appearing to have interfered with the state police.

"It would certainly appear on the surface of the whole affair that Ella Grasso has put the crunch to the chief of our state police and I don't think that's something any executive should do," he said.

Mrs. Grasso was unavailable for comment Friday, but her spokesman, Larry deBear, said, "The fact is she did not pressure the commissioner into the statement he issued."

DeBear said the statement "was on the basis of the commissioner's discussions with Paul McQuillan," McQuillan, a New Britain attorney and former special prosecutor in the Reilly case, was asked by Mrs. Grasso to review the case again.

Gunther said, "I don't know the ins and outs of the case, but I've known Ed Leonard for many many years and I think that man usually knows what he's talking about."

The case has been the topic of two books and a segment on the CBS program "60 Minutes." It has received national news coverage, and constant attention in the Connecticut press and broadcast media.

Town asked to consider Forest Hills rec field

Manchester has been asked to consider establishing a recreation facility in the Forest Hills Development in the northeast section of town.

The request came from Jerome Baskin of 38 Kennedy Rd. who spoke to the Advisory Recreation and Park Commission at a meeting Thursday.

Baskin told the commission there is an 11-acre area of the development near Kennedy Rd. which is owned by the town. "The land is vacant and fairly level and would lend itself for a baseball diamond," he said.

There are 256 single family homes in Forest Hills, and children are now using the Buckley School and Salters recreation areas, and these areas are becoming overtaxed, he said.

Physical accidents are occurring in the Forest Hills area because of the lack of a recreational area.

"Kids in the street are even being hit by cars," he said.

Baskin suggested that if the town would grade and seed the site, Manchester service organizations may help with the project by contributing either equipment or manpower.

Mel Siebold, director of the Recreation Department, said that federal grants are available which will pay up to one-third of the cost for the development of properties for some sort of outdoor recreation.

The commission felt that if they agreed to establish this facility, they would be setting a precedent.

Presently, the Redwood Farms development in the southwest section of town has a 12-acre town-owned site which could be converted into a recreation facility, and the new 375-home development under construction on Keeney St., would also need recreation facilities.

Joel Janenda, commission chairman, said the town should have a long range plan for areas where recreation is needed.

The commission said it would inspect the proposed recreational site at Forest Hills and asked Baskin to draft and circulate a petition among his neighbors.

During the meeting, Janenda said, as he did last year, that the town has to open up some of its forests so that local residents may cut wood to help heat their homes this winter.

"We didn't do it last year because of problems," he said. This year, he suggested the town open up its wooded areas under the permit procedure used by the state in state forests.

According to Janenda, Ernest Turek, park superintendent, said that the project under proper guidelines would make the forests a good energy saver and a great source of fuel for the community.

The commission also paid tribute to this summer's junior soccer program and to Doug Pearson and the teen-age and adult volunteers who made it a "resounding success."

The soccer program, which started five years ago with 160 boys, grew to 1,185 kids this year, Janenda said. The commission agreed that it was one of the town's most rewarding recreation programs.

Head of NOW unit sees work ahead

“NOW (National Organization for Women) is sort of a bridge,” said the new president of the Hartford NOW chapter, Mrs. Jane Mendenhall Echelson of 41 Richard Rd., East Hartford.

“Things are not right with a woman’s profession or her home — with her world as a woman,” she said. “At this point, they come into NOW with questions.”

“Once they get in, they start to define their areas of concern.”

NOW has three main areas of concern now. They are equality, human rights and economic rights.

Mrs. Echelson said her chapter is taking a new tack in its work this year. They will be as visible a group as they have been in the past.

“We will stop trying to re-invent the wheel every time we want to work on something,” she said.

NOW members will be working with other groups already pushing for changes, she said.

Mrs. Echelson was born in Ohio and moved to Torrington, Conn., at age 16. After graduating from Torrington High School in 1948, she studied music at the Boston Conservatory, graduating in 1951.

She then married Robert Echelson. They have one child, Roberta Echelson, who is active in East Hartford politics, the Citizens Action Group, and the YWCA in Hartford.

Mrs. Echelson worked with her husband, helping with his business, Interstate Press of Hartford. He sold it several years ago and she then decided to get her master’s degree in education from the University of Massachusetts. She was graduated in 1973.

Mrs. Echelson retired from business to become a writer for Variety, a national entertainment magazine.

Mrs. Echelson has become a certified trainer in human relations. She said she is a part of one of the smallest minorities in the world. Men make up 99.2 per cent of the certified trainers, she said.

“We will plan programs for groups or businesses which will allow their members to fully develop their potentials,” she said. The release of energy benefits both the member and the group or business.

Her clients include school systems, colleges, industries and social service agencies.

“We make the organization more effective in its use of its people,” she said.

The root cause of a poorly working organization is communication, she said.

“No one tells people what the goals are. She does a lot of work with women. They can do much more than they are allowed to or expect they can do.”

“Abilities don’t know what sex you are,” she said.

The same applies to marriage also, she said. The joys of washing the dishes or changing a car tire don’t care about the sex of the worker.

The Hartford NOW was one of the first chapters formed in the country. It now has more than 16 active task forces and five ad hoc committees.

“We are working to change things for the better,” she said.

She and her friend, Mrs. Frank Keller of 245 Mountain Rd., Manchester, have been working this month on her plans to keep Hartford’s NOW active. She expects another good year for NOW.

The PZC holds public workshops the third Monday of each month at 7 p.m. in the planning office. The first topic under study for the new master plan is commercial and industrial areas.

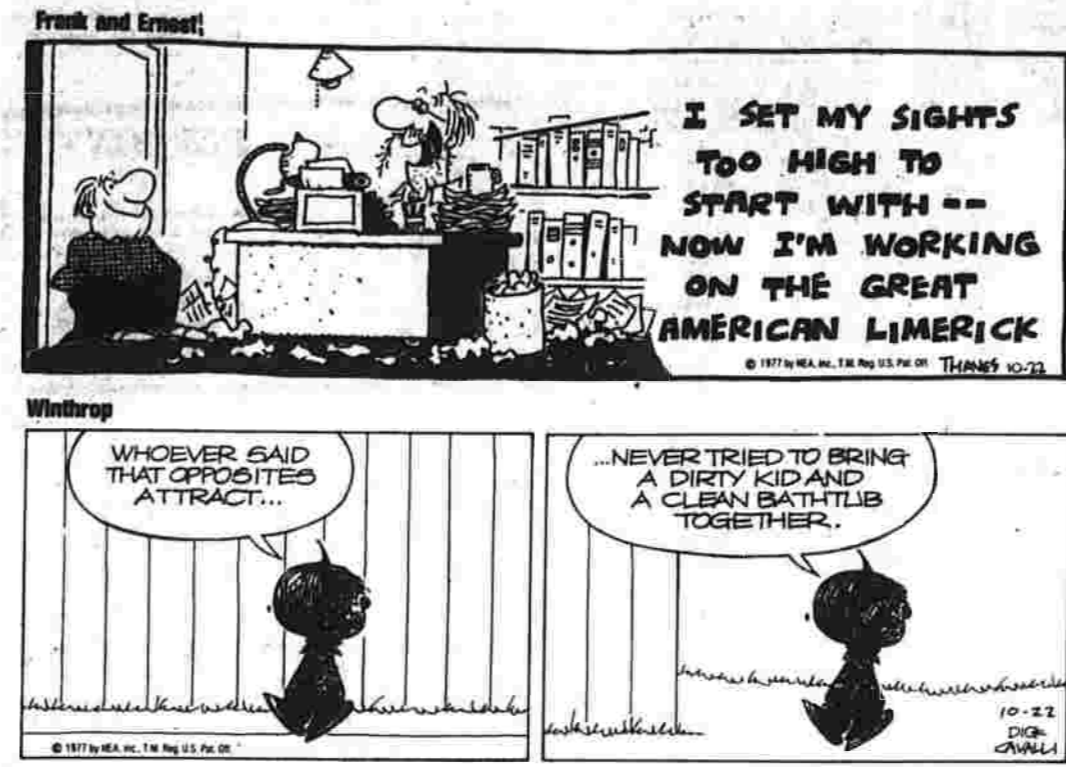
