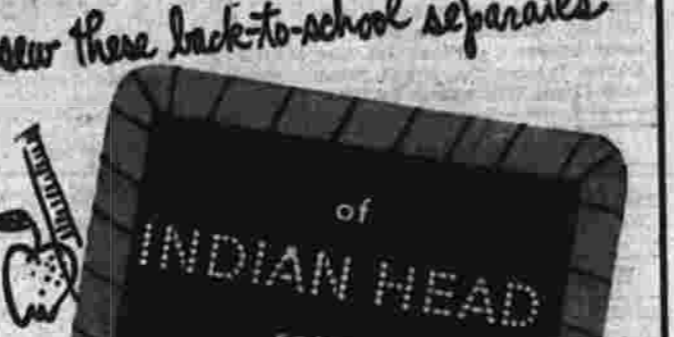

The big break with one basic design, which has come to dominate the appearance of cars, is the minor changes which have been worked into this design, as a "companion" design, for the introduction of a little yearly variety into their own product—most of these changes have been in the direction of making cars more comfortable from whatever grade and eye appeal may have been in the original basic design.
