Washington, Sept. 8 (AP)—A government fallout expert said today the cloud of radioactive debris from the first of four recent Russian nuclear tests is expected to cross the northern United States by this weekend.
Dr. Lester Wachs of the U.S. Weather Bureau said he could not estimate when debris from the three later tests would reach the country. But that debris, together with some more from the first test, may pass over the entire country, he said.
Machla said some fallout will reach the Earth wherever the radioactive cloud passes over—and will continue to do so the clouds keep circling the Earth.
But he offered a qualified view that the amount of fallout deposited about 7 degrees above normal will be greater than the first four Russian tests which the United States has reported made in Central Asia. The tests breached the East-West moratorium on such experiments.
Speaking earlier at the meeting in the Kremlin, Khrushchev called on the great powers who held the key to war and peace to remove the threat of war and lead the world to peace.



