out the vote" exhorters always like to remind everybody is possible—and the kind which can also prove a nightmare to people who shrink from exposing the democratic process to too much hairsplitting strain—this kind of result came up in the verdict of the Board of Elections down in Nassau County, L. I., the other day.

It proclaimed one Julius R. Lippman, Democrat, elected judge of the Third District Court, at a salary of \$25,000 a year, by a margin of one vote out of 106.741 cast.

This one-vote victory for Lippman, over his Republican opponents, Frank X. Altimari, came on the third counting of the votes involved. First there was the election night count, which the Republican won by 48 votes. Next an unofficial recount by the Democrats reduced the Republican's margin to 11 votes. Now the official Elections Board recount switched the result, declaring the Democrat elected, 53,371 to 53,370. So there it is, all right, the devastating importance of the single vote. That, unfortunately, is not likely to

he the end of the story. When democracy is forced to put its whole weight on one single vote out of 106,000, that puts everything under a remorseless and microscopic spotlight. The losing candidate has challenges ready for several hundred of the ab-Some of them he would have thrown out because they were marked in red, green or brown ink, instead of the blue or black ink or pencil prescribed by law. If the one-vote loser gets as many as one of these thrown out for some technical reason, his opponent will surely have some challenges of his own. And, if they find themselves stymied in their quest for victory among the absentee ballots, the two contestants, each doing no more than protecting his own democratic rights, may feel forced into a reexamination of all the voting list records of the day. Surely there must have been some irregularities in the machine voting that day, too. And when it gets down to an election which may be determined by one single vote out of 106,-

000, every single possible irregularity becomes important. At the end of such a long and bitter trail there might lie a disillusioning kind of discovery-the discovery that we have no system which is mistakeproof for deciding elections that get as close as a single vote. In the end, the only thing that can rescue democracy from such a crisis might be good sportsmanship—the kind which is even willing to lose an election in order to refrain from destroying the popular faith in the workability of the democratic process.

### What Kills Coal

The obvious decline of the coal industry in this country has invited frequent speculation as to whether John L. Lewis and his union triumphs may not have contributed their great share in pricing coal out of the marketplace.

When Lewis led the miners toward a decent wage, and then "toward some rather handsome additional benefits, he was not only remedying a longstanding social and economic injustice; he was also adding to the cost of mining coal. So when, as at the present time, his miners are no longer drawing those decent wages or enjoying those fringe benefits, but are instead living in new poverty and need because their very jobs have disappeared, the question keeps suggesting itself: did success for the unions kill the indus-Most of the contributions to such a

debate are likely to be inspired and shaped by what one happens to think of unions in the first place.

But what may be a contribution of fact, rather than feeling or opinion, comes from West Germany and seems to have some legitimate place in the de-

Over there, the hard coal industry has fust announced plans to shut down 36 nines which represent about one quarter of that country's production sepacity. And, in West Germany, no one has accused the coal industry of paying its miners too highly, or letting the

unions price coal out of the market. Rather, in West Germany, the big credit or blame is being assigned directly to coal's competitors in the heat and energy field. Conceivably, the greater efficiency of production and distribution possible for such other fuels, aside from wages paid human beings, has had something to do with coal's loss of

In one respect. Germany's situation differs from ours. The decline of the coal industry is causing no immediate unemployment hardship, because new German industry going into new lines and new expansion of old lines is eager for manpower. That circumstance may indicate that the Germans are smarter economists and businessmen than we are, or it may merely prove there is no formula for a good 20 year boom than getting your industries and cities destroyed in a losing war.
