**Separated Now****Twins Forget Past, Look Only Forward**

GARDONE, Italy (AP) — Two 7-year-old girls who never talked about their past look forward happily to their future in an exciting new world of normal life.

They are Giuseppina and Giuseppina Foglia, Siamese twin sisters born and joined at the spine. They were separated in a four-hour operation May 10, 1965.

Since then they have learned to walk separately, even ride bicycles. They are not the only ones who have learned to forget their six years in aTurkish clinic. They refer to that part of their life as "prime."

"They are extraordinarily vital and lively. There is no visible difference to be seen when they play with their schoolmates," says Mrs. Maria Tumminelli.

She is owner and director of the Tumminelli Boarding School in this Lake Garda resort where the twins now stay.

After the first operation by a team of 22 specialists headed by Prof. Luigi Sotero, the two girls were kept under close medical observation during months of physical therapy and readjustment. They had to re-educate their limbs and acquire a new sense of balance.

They still wear corrective casts at the school here.

After the period of readjustment at the clinic the two girls settled in the house of their parents at Gramano Badoglio.

**Solberg Indicted**  
**Another Chapter Unfolds In Strange Murder Case**

LITCHFIELD (AP) — Another chapter in the strange case of the slaying of Mrs. Dorothy Thompson was written when a grand jury indicted 20-year-old Harry A. Solberg for first degree murder.

After the indictment was returned late Tuesday night, Solberg pleaded innocent in Superior Court, and his attorney, Mr. Edward J. O'Neil, said he would not be taken back to jail, where he had been held since his arrest March 15.

Mrs. Thompson, 39-year-old housewife, was found dead by her husband, Arvin, when he returned home from work last June 15, one year ago today.

Arvin, 39, was indicted on an

assault charge on July 17, but received

no sentence without finding.

On Oct. 26, Gideon held the victim's mother-in-law responsible for the killing and recommended that she be held for trial.

On the next day a warrant was issued for her arrest. But the warrant was not served until March 12.

## South Windsor

## School Board Feels Hartford Has Met Busing Plan Criteria

The board of education last night generally agreed that the 14 conditions it cited as essential before it agrees to a proposed contract for busing students from Hartford have been met in a contract proposal received from the Hartford school board last week.

The proposed contract, called a "Basis for Contractual Relationships," was Hartford's answer after a series of meetings over the past few weeks between representatives of the State Board of Education and the four towns which have agreed to consider participation in the plan.

The points of agreement cover the conditions for acceptance of the plan by all four towns. Besides South Windsor, the towns are Manchester, West Hartford and Hartford.

The next step toward implementation of the plan in South Windsor is for the Hartford board to draw a written contract for regional transportation within the limits of the current budget.

The board will meet again on the request of the State Board of Education to consider the proposed contract. Each town in the Capitol Region will be asked to participate in the plan, and a periodic check will also be eligible.

## Other Business

The primary purpose of the council is to encourage the exchange of information and programs affecting public school education and to assist the various school systems within the state to improve the quality of education.

In addition, the council may consider and give assistance on any other educational matters within the region.

Ten towns are the minimum to form the council. To date, Mrs. Robert C. Cavanaugh, one of the authors of the plan, with a copy to the president of the board, has received confirmation that as many as six staff members from South Windsor will be able to participate in the "council of education," with reimbursement from some source outside South Windsor.

The letter will also request an addition to the contract proposal that notice of the town's intention to withdraw from the plan be given to the Hartford board at least four months in advance of now calls for notices to be given 30 days before withdrawal to the State Department of Education.

Mrs. Romeyn read a letter received from Stock expressing appreciation for the board's decision to withdraw from the plan as a member is appointed to represent the town in subsequent joint meetings.

Mrs. Romeyn was appointed to the State Board of Education and will be formed by members of towns participating in the plan along with members of the Negro community in Hartford and other citizens.

One of the conditions set by the board was that the Hartford board "select its prime objectives to serve the needs of the Negro for disadvantaged children," and, as an example of its good faith, that it has a like number of children to enter the schools of the Negro community in the Fisher School, or show that this has already been accomplished.

Mrs. Romeyn read a communication from Stock noting that more than 100 pupils are being bussed to the Amistad Fisher School to the northeast of the school.

Dr. Robert Lauri, a board member, commented that the information is worthy of note because it was one of the conditions set by Stock. No reference is made to this point in the formal contract proposal.

Superintendent of Schools

Regional Council





### Two Architects Considered For New Elementary School

The public building commission (PBC) has not yet had time to decide on which architect to hire to draw up preliminary plans for a second town elementary school.

Architect Douglas Gagnon said this morning that the commission, meeting in executive session, has narrowed the field down to two, and both will be asked to meet with the commission. A member of one firm may meet with the PBC at its regular meeting Monday night.

Architect Arnold Lawrence, who is doing the preliminary plan for the high school, has turned down the commission's request to do the job. He has completed sketches of three possible designs requested by the board of education and PBC. They are to be submitted to the board of education at a meeting tomorrow night.

Cheney said he hopes to get two or three firms to submit plans to cover the sketches, which show three different floor elevations for the area — flat, terraced, and a flat cafeteria with small sloping auditoriums.

#### School Board

The school board will convene its adjourned meeting tomorrow at 6 p.m. in the high school library. One of the items to be taken up, under the discussion of the 1966-67 budget, will be the availability of second kindergarten next year (about 70 children, to date) listing three sessions of kindergarten, and arranging the children to be in school in the morning, mid-day, or afternoon session. Each session would be two-and-a-half hours long, one beginning at 8:30 a.m. and one at 11, and one at 1:45 p.m.

This year there have been three sessions, each held in two at the same time in the morning, and one in the afternoon.

Board Chairman Walter Wardell said yesterday that this proposal is just one of four being considered by the board to solve the space problem.
