#### Labor As The Hawk

The executive council of the American Federation of Labor and Congress of Industrial Organization held an all day discussion of foreign policy the other day, and wound up voting unanimous approval of all the foreign policy positions it has taken in the past few years under the direction and leadership of George Meany, president of the great national labor organization.

This vote was unanimous, but not complete. There was one absentee. He was Walter Reuther, president, of the United Automobile Workers Union, He was too busy attending another meeting of his own union.

But if he had been present he would have been defeated, as he has been defeated on every issue of foreign policy with Mr. Meany. The foreign policy position that

American labor thus officially takes under the leadership of Mr. Meany, to the displeasure of Mr. Reuther, must be regarded as pretty much the personal reponsibility of Mr. Meany. It is to be bted, very much, that American labor would have found its way into the front ranks of the hawks, the believers in inevitable war, had it not been for Mr. Meany personally. It can be suspected that, even now, were there a real showdown on foreign policy issues union member by union member across the country, Mr. Reuther and his views -a belief in the necessity of coexistence,

For the moment all we have is the report of the generalities with which he prefaced and closed his discussion. He began by asking himself the folowing questions:

"If intellectuals do take part in public affairs, are they to be permitted by their fellows any role save that of intransigent opposition?

#### No Payoff For No Effort The danger of letting legislative or

other seats go by default to a candidate-of either party, incumbent or not -was clearly underscored by the outcome of Tuesday's election in Massachusetts. Warnings are sounded in every campaign-in these columns and elsewhere-against taking defeat for granted because of an opposition majority in voter registration. The Republican Party's failure to make a fight of it in many representative districts

this year was never more regrettable.

The case for making the challenge was strong enough before the election, and the outcome of the top statewide contests confirms now what was argued roughly 2 to 1 Democratic to Republican, with the independents' total some where in between those of the two parties. Yet Gov. Volpe and Atty. Gen. Brooke each polled more than 60 per cent of the vote cast in their contests. The outcome was less spectacular in the lieutenant governor and attorney general contests, but decisive for the GOP candidates. Democratic strongholds like Holyoke and Springfield reflected the

Republican candidates, while scoring a net gain of one seat in the House, defeated three Democratic incumbents in the process while no GOP incumwere defeated. House Minority Leader Curtiss said it was the first time that not a single Republican in-Senate had not been defeated. One incumbent Democratic senator, James J. Long of Woburn, was defeated by a Republican this year to account for the

But the gains might well have been more substantial if the opportunity had been taken to compete for more seats. In Hampden County alone, incumbent Democratic representatives were unopposed in 11 of the 18 districts, and a 12th, a nonincumbent, also was un-

GOP gain of one seat in the upper

Perhaps it is unfair to say from hindsight that the time was ripe for the GOP to make significant gains in the Legislature. But there will never be an ironclad assurance of victory for any candidate. And it was not difficult to see that Gov. Volpe was a strong and appealing leader of a ticket of unusual calibre. The chances of success certainappeared better than they would be r another four years, with a presidential year intervening. But many of the chances were sadly neglected. - SPRINGFIELD UNION
