

Bogota Face Lifting Won't Brighten Sky

BOGOTA, Colombia (AP) — Bogota can't stay. All it needs is a bit of makeup.

With that thought in mind and an eye out for the approaching visit of Pope Paul VI, city fathers are pushing a multimillion-dollar face-lifting that has given this gray, chilly, 8,000-foot-high capital a sparkle it probably has never known in its 450 years.

Caught up in the spirit of things, homeowners are painting their houses fresh, trimming lawns and trees. Businessmen are tidying up their establishments. The grime of years is being removed from the aging fronts of the National Cathedral and the Municipal Palace and the Capitol.

But, before my wife and I shell out a couple of hundred or more dollars for a new guitar, we've got to, forever, live down the memory of my daughter and her accident.

We started her on a lesson, paying toward the eventual purchase of her own instrument. And that eventual time came, when the accordion teacher held his annual recital. He laid down the rule that all of his pupils must play their own accords at the recital.

So, we kicked in about \$300 to buy her an accordion. It was a beautiful one, with a few good, some fair, most poor, and many bad keys.

And you must remember the doing parents, with their flesh and blood, taking pictures of their talented offspring.

On the night of my daughter's recital, she was placed near the end of the program and "O Solo Mio" and "Stars and Stripes Forever."

We stuck it out, and then came my daughter, with an accordion almost as big as she was. She played, and someone took a picture. We still have it, and the expression on her face depicts her playing—not good, not fair, and somewhere in between the two remaining categories.

As Convention Nears Chicago Drivers' Strikes Moving Toward Showdown

CHICAGO (AP) — Two labor disputes involving a major share of the city's public transportation moved closer to a showdown today as preparations for the Democratic National Convention entered their final days.

Drivers of the 8,000 taxis operated by the Yellow and Checker cab companies threatened to strike at midnight tonight unless agreement on a new contract is reached by then.

While none of the smaller independent taxi companies would be affected by a cab strike, they have only a few more than 800 cabs among them.

Negotiators for the cab drivers and Yellow and Checker were to meet at 10:30 a.m. today for a final effort to reach an agreement.

Radicals Spend Summer Planning Hot Paris Autumn

PARIS — In a cellar room near the Sorbonne last weekend a "revolutionary action group" proudly displayed their latest pamphlet. One of the cyclostyled sections was underlined in red:

"Stripped between government repression and the apathy of the masses and their consumer society, we are driven inevitably to accept one priority — violence must be the next step."

But hadn't violence been the last step? There was surely enough around in May for anyone's taste. Did they really feel driven to emulate Amstutz's homicide rash?

"The October revolution will be real, not a charade. We don't want to kill anyone (except the police," someone chipped in) but the government leaves us no choice."

It intends to give them no choice. Beneath the August torpor both sides are feverishly maneuvering, preparing their positions, and when they appeal for battle, the Communists are busy trying not to see Bourgeois France has gone on holiday, hoping to stave off the specter of Autumn in a French by exception and traffic jams.

Meanwhile the government, the Ministry of the Interior, and the police work overtime. So do the October revolutionaries. They are in deadly earnest, yet it requires an act of will to take them quite seriously. They are mainly because of their mind-killing jargon, the half-chewed gobble of Mao, or more often Guevara, and the flow of pamphlets and manifestos, as dull as an anthology of Frantz Fanon.

All the same it is probably wrong to be too skeptical. In Paris they claim 100 revolutionary action cells.

Certainly the authorities are determined not to make the same mistake twice. "We thought they were just a set of crackpot kids last spring," said an official connected with the Ministry of the Interior. "There were so few. The biggest Trotskyist group didn't have more than 2,000 members. We couldn't believe that each one might have 10 friends he could get into the streets to help build a barricade."

Government policy was defined clearly at Couve de Murville's first cabinet meeting on July 15. After a brief exhortatory address, General De Gaulle bleakly remarked that in the future there would be no reports of disorders in the streets. The events of July 14, Bastille night, indicated what Parisians could expect for the rest of the summer and probably indefinitely.

Before the party began the Latin Quarter and the Place de la Bastille were crisscrossed with "CRS." They were armed with rifles, nightsticks, and teargas grenades. They were helmeted and goggled, and carried newly-issued transparent shields, designed to protect them from stones, without preventing them seeing where they were coming from. Their orders were to break up any crowds: But keeping crowds down on Bastille night is like insisting Trafalgar Square be empty on New Year's Eve. Over the weekend 800 people were arrested. And since then these incidents have, on a minor scale, become commonplace of Paris life.

But the police tactics have been successful, within the limits of their philosophy. Certainly, the three main leaders of the May revolt are now effectively neutralized.

Cohn-Bendit neutralized himself. Though he still has a number of aficionados attracted by his theatrical style, the widely-publicized information that he is busy writing his memoirs (presumably for vulgar profit) has alienated the most serious, and dedicated extremists.

Jacques Sauvaget, vice-president of the French National Students' Union (UNEF) is also hardly the force he was. A fortnight ago he was summoned to a draft board in Dijon and told that his application for deferment had arrived 34 hours late. He would probably be drafted to Dijon, an area thought conveniently distant from the Sorbonne. When Sauvaget explained his deferment appeal was late because of the events in May, a member of the board replied: "That's exactly!"

Many activists, suspicious of Cohn-Bendit and Sauvaget, have put their hopes on Alan Krivine, a 27-year-old radical, who may well have been applying his considerable intellectual powers to the future of "the movement" whilst the Latin Quarter was in uproar. Krivine, born of Russian and Jewish parents, left the Communist Party during the presidential elections because he disapproved of the deal between the Communists and Francois Mitterrand's federation of the left.

In three years he built up his own revolutionary Communist Youth Movement (K J C R) to around 2,000 members. It was named, along with various other extremist groups, by special decree in June. Krivine was arrested on a charge of reactivating it, on July 16. He is still in jail. A Paris court rejected his appeal for bail and Krivine, to the fury of the activists, will remain in the Bastille Prison until the government decides what action to take.

The police also have another important figure among the Paris student leaders and show no willingness to let him out. He is Pierre Rousset, a geophysicist, aged 21, the son of a left-wing Communist Deputy. Like Krivine, Rousset was detained last Friday. A group of students picked up last weekend in the Latin Quarter have, however, been freed. The magnitude of the police who arrested them were Jean and polo-necked jerseys, and were the defendants claimed, "just the same." "This gives a clue to a new police tactic which has been rumored for some time. The police, in fact, are playing the same sort of game. The successors to Krivine in the future will be no more barricade in October, if we are bound to win." Instead the doctrine of "permanent revolution" will be advanced by activists penetrating other students' and workers' groups. In the factories they say, they will be carefully planned acts of industrial sabotage; in the streets there will be organized violence—"trained strong-arm men will carry out pinpoint operations with Molotov cocktails and plastic bombs."

To give the police any well ahead of the game, assisted by the government and certain industrial concerns. They have made arrests as far apart as Bonnaville and Bordeaux, Marseille and Strasbourg. Over 200 foreigners have been expelled for allegedly illegal activities. The purge of radio and television journalists has received a lot of publicity but, according to trade unions, a good many accounts have also been settled in industry, and both Renault and Citroen have taken advantage of the summer holidays to dismember them, while workers who were a nuisance last spring.

Edouard Fraux, the new Minister of Education, has been in disquieting that the iron-glove policy will only bring the extremists still more and ruin his chances of university reform. The Minister of the Interior, Raymond Marcellin, claims that it is possible to guarantee public order without having an authoritarian government.



Stalinist Ways Emerge Kremlin's Mood Somber Following Czech Talks

Stalinist habits, evidently durable among Soviet leaders, are emerging once again after the Soviet-Czechoslovak showdown. For Soviet citizens there is a chill in the air, reminiscent of cold war.

The palpable defeat of a Soviet effort to make reform-minded Czechoslovakia bend to Kremlin will seem to have provoked Communist party worries about its internal impact.

The Kremlin's somber mood and its fright at what Czechoslovakia might mean in the future come through in the latest issue of Kommunist, the Soviet theoretical journal, to reach this country. An article, apparently written for the editors of the Soviet Communist themselves rather than for anybody abroad, said it violated the "Weapen Against the Intrigues of Imperialism." It pictures Soviet cities in danger from spies and provocateurs lurking everywhere, ready to pounce on the unwary and use them to undermine the system.

Soviet spy activities have been featured through the cold war years. Each "vigilance" campaign has reflected Politburo worries on the home front. Clearly the current campaign is linked with Czechoslovakia, the article said in "underscored the necessity of strengthening by all means the unity of parties and peoples" to protect the ramparts of Marxism-Leninism.

The article warned "against 'Marxist' saboteurs" who were said to manœuvre as

Czechoslovak example, which could spread notions of rebellion and other specialists taking part in scientific international congresses, symposia, expeditions or conferences.

Today, the article instructed, the party must consider as one of its most important tasks a campaign against "ideological saboteurs," because "in the sphere of ideology there cannot be any compromise." The article said that in 1953-54, just before Georgi M. Malenkov was fired as premier of the Soviet Union, Khrushchev denounced the Stalin legend. Again it was in evidence in 1967, before Khrushchev was ousted, when he was accused of "revisionism."

State Agency Tightens Policy On 'Poor' Funds

HARTFORD (AP)—The Connecticut Bond Commission, headed by Gov. John Dempsey, has adopted a policy to tighten control over money spent to fight Connecticut's war on poverty.

The new procedure requires, as in the past, that hump sums be authorized for projects recommended by the Department of Community Affairs. But it also requires the commission to clear each project with a community or with a community-action group.

The adoption of the stipulation Thursday came in the wake of a recent recommendation for some \$15,000 to support a Negro voter registration drive in Waterbury. The commission killed the project after the state attorney general, Robert K. Killip, said it violated state anti-discrimination laws.

The Community Affairs Department had recommended the program.

The new policy appeared on the commission agenda several times Thursday as the several hundred \$18 million in borrowing for housing and development projects throughout the state.

It also was included with authorization for \$5 million for human resource development programs.

In other action, the commission authorized:

- \$200,000 for the purchase and renovation of Old Westgate Prison in East Green.
- \$70 for the purchase of six acres of tidal marsh land fronting on the Connecticut River in Haddam. (The appraisal for the acres came to \$5,000.)
- \$50,000 to the Historical Commission to purchase and improve historical monument markers.
- \$25,000 to the Veterans Home and Hospital at Rocky Hill for the conversion of its power plant to oil and emergency electrical generation.
- \$84,860 to improve athletic field facilities at Vidal Regional Technical School in Middletown.
- \$82,500 for a new boy's dormitory at the American School for the Deaf and Blind in Waterbury.
- \$50,000 for improvements to the men's gymnasium at the University of Connecticut.
- \$74,700 for new exhibit cases at the state library.
- \$200,000 for temporary classroom structures at Middlesex Community College in Middletown.
- \$27,400 for the acquisition of property on which to build court house facilities in Willimantic.
- \$19,972 as part of an assistance agreement with Manchester for its urban renewal project.



Housewife's Film Wins Venice Festival Prize

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—When a housewife becomes a director and a housewife turns film producer, what can the end result be? The answer is "C. Soutine."

In the case of "C. Soutine," it's an art film with an artistic, and it has won the top prize of this year's Venice Film Festival's Grand Golden Lion for best documentary.

"C. Soutine" chronicles with stunning impact the life, work and thought of Chaim Soutine, a Russian-born painter who influenced the Paris school of Impressionists and post-Impressionists.

The movie was the brainchild of Rita Morrison, a Los Angeles housewife who studied film at UCLA.

"I had always wanted to make a film," she recalled. "Finally I just said, 'Today in the day.'"

For her subject she chose Soutine, a painter whose reputation lagged behind his contemporaries. He was the "painter's painter."

But now, 25 years after Soutine's death, there was to be an exhibition of his work at the Los Angeles County Museum of Art. Soutine's friends had set out for Paris to ferret out Soutine's work hidden in attics and cellars of the artist's friends. With him went Rita Morrison.

In Paris they found one of Soutine's mistresses, Mrs. Morrison quickly hired a camera crew and filmed and interviewed with the petite Mrs. Ganda who spoke no English but said softly for the camera: "I adore Soutine."

They visited Mrs. Madeline Outing, an early supporter of the artist. She supposed to have a number of Soutine's stored away that she won't show anybody, says Mrs. Morrison.

She showed us one of Soutine's portraits. She complained that it was dirty, and she called a maid and had her scrub the face with soap and water. It was horrible.

Back in Los Angeles with her film, Mrs. Morrison recruited Jack H. Lieberman, 28, a one-time painter and lecturer in the humanities. As a film director he had several documentaries to his credit. Also, he had studied at the Barnes Foundation which holds the largest American collection of Soutine's work.

Lieberman brought in Ken Plotkin, young innovative cinematographer; and Fred Flans, screenwriter who had worked on the film "Olympic."

Edward G. Robinson, a Soutine admirer and art collector, agreed to narrate.

"In researching Soutine's life," says Lieberman, "I found that he had been hit by a child hood experience. As a boy, he witnessed the Jewish ritual slaughter of a chicken."

Examination of Soutine canvases further revealed tortured visions of dying animals—bleeding chickens, hulks of butchered calves.

"It was a visceral painter," says Lieberman. "And the film was visceral."

The film opens in a slaughter-


