TO WIDEN BIRCH STREET. An effort is being made to have Birch street widened from John Wright's place to Spruce street. From Main to the Wright property the street is 23 feet wide, and from the Wright property to Spruce street it is 24 feet wide. WORTHY OF NOTE. The power of granger, licenses to saloon keepers is no longer vested in the county commissioners as under this new law, that function devolves upon the judges of the superior court.

It is therefore very evident that any person coming before that body as an applicant for a license hereafter, will need have a clear record on the blotter of the court, for should such applicant stand convicted of having kept a place where liquors were sold, unlawfully, the chances are very strongly in favor of the rejection of such application as occurred in the Michaels case at Bristol, where Judge Shumway refused to grant a license to Michaels or even to one Berg, a relative.

CHILDREN'S COLUMN.

A Giant Stride. Boys, did you ever make a "giant stride"? My brother Frank and I were many happy hours in boyhood exercising upon this exercise.

Drive an iron pin half to three-quarters of an inch in diameter and 10 inches long into the center of the top of the pole. Set the pole up securely in the ground in a space where you can have from swing of 12 feet from the pole on every side.

Take an oak or hickory bar 4 1/2 inches wide, 4 inches thick and 2 feet long and bore a hole in the center of such size as to permit the bar to turn freely on the pin in the top of the pole.

Secure to each end of the bar, by passing it through the small hole and firmly tying a good piece of rope, with a loop of an inch or two in diameter, and over each end of the rope, two loops of rope, one suspended from the cross-bar, they must touch the ground or clear it by only a few inches at the bottom of the pole.

When the body is in a short, proud piece of wood to form a hand grip. Make a "saddle" by placing in each loop a piece of rope or twine. Your "giant stride" is now ready for use.

Two of you must put your right legs through the saddle, so as to bring the body on the outside of the loop, away from the pole. Grasp the hand piece and run in a circle as fast as you can, the pole is revolved. As you gain momentum you will find yourself supported solely in the saddle and will be enabled to swing entirely around the pole, often making the circuit several times without touching the ground with the feet. If you wish to reverse the movement, place the left leg, instead of the right, through the loop—You're Champion.
