HAVANA, Cuba (By Cable) .- It is anounced in most positive terms by the anish authorities that Antonio Macco, the great insurgent leader and the heart and soul of the Cuban cause, has been killed in Havana Province, after having effected the passage of the Western trocha near Mariel at its northern extremity. With the Cuban leader died the youth Francisco Gomez, son of Maximo Gomes, who accompanied the mulatto general on his passage of the trocha.

Most explicit details of the finding of the corpecs of the fallen Cubans and of the facts relied upon for their identification are at hand through the report of the Spanish commander, Major Cirujeda, who lately contest-ed the passage of the trocha unsuccessfully with Maceo, and who sustained another conwith the forces under the insurgen
