A bill was passed by both houses of the legislature last week which provides that boards of relief before proceeding to increase the list of persons or to add to the assessment list the name of any person omitted, shall mail to him, one week before making such increase or addition, a written or printed notice, to appear before said board and show cause why the same should not be made.

A message providing that saloonkeepers must not allow men to whom the sale of liquor has been forbidden, to loiter around saloons, has been passed by the legislature, and will apply to persons receiving town aid, whom saloonkeepers are ordered to not sell liquor as well as the case here last fall. It will also apply to cases where men neglect their families and their wives order saloonkeepers to not sell them any liquor. This will tend to protect them from the temptation of the saloon.
