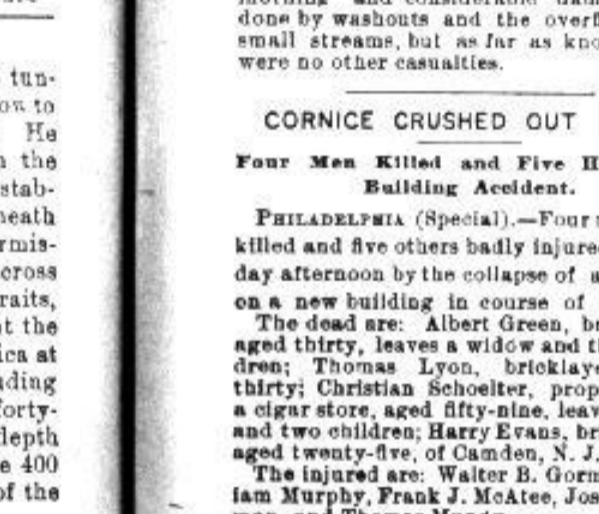

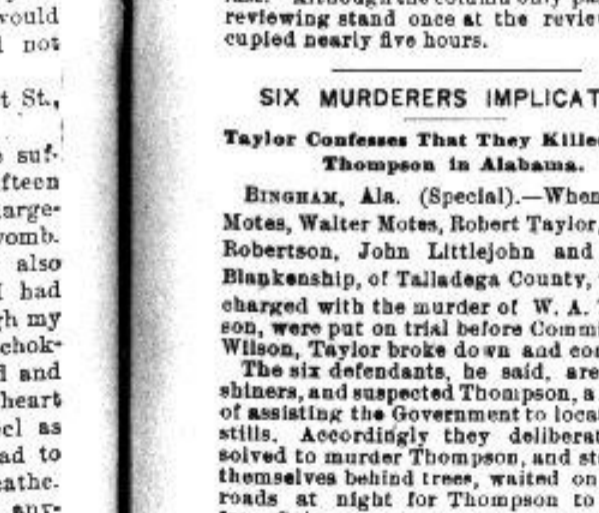
HAWAIIAN EXECUTIVE BUILDING IN HONOLULU ON WHICH THE STAR SPANGLING BANNER WAS RAISED.



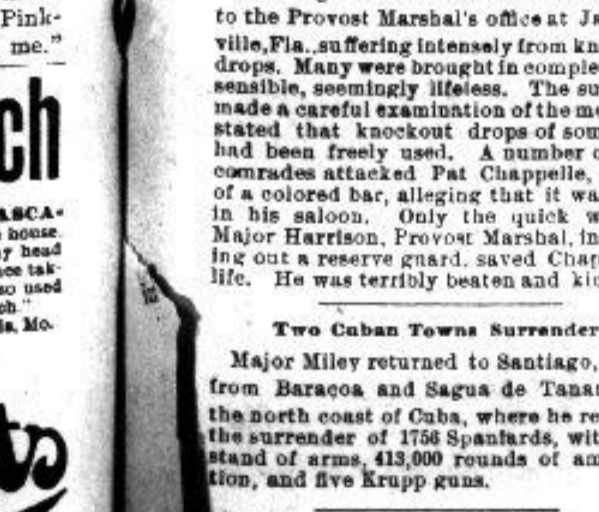

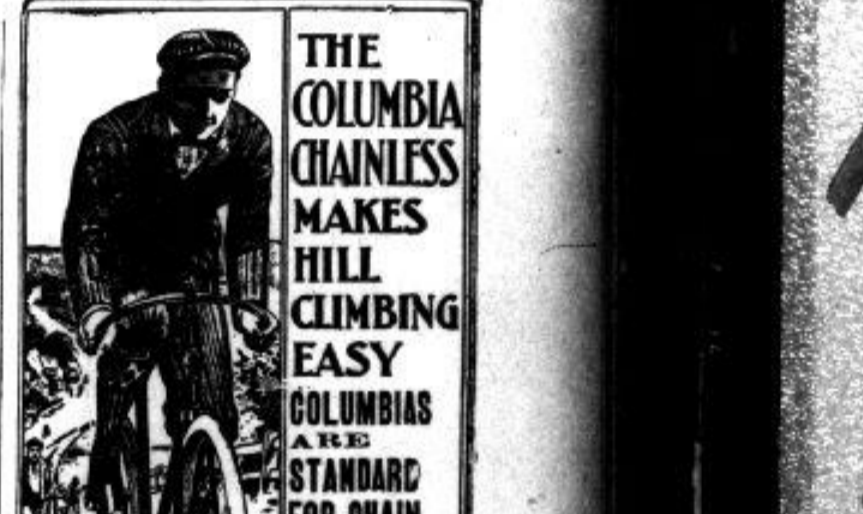

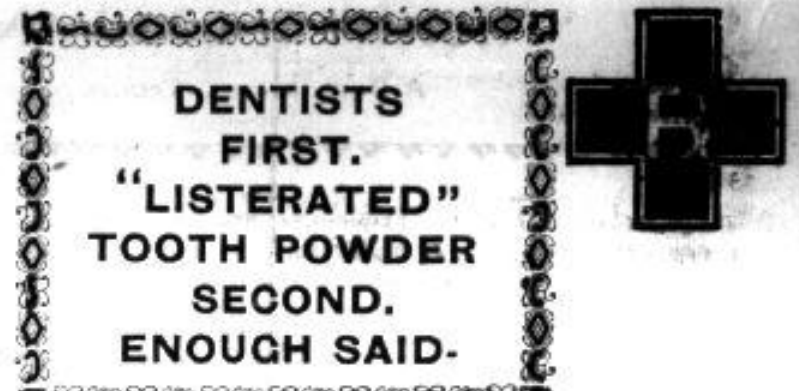
