> FITTING UP TROOPSHIPS. Important Preparations Now Under Was

The fitting up of troopships is one

the most important preparations

under way in the navy department, The unexpected call to send subhers to Santiago found the government with no suitable transports for troops and to this fact was largely due the horrors of the returning ships loaded with sick and wounded. The maintenance of garrisons in distant islands makes it necessary for the government in the future to have regularly equipped troopships instead of hastily picking up merchantmen and cattle freight boats, as early in the war. The plans already made indicate that the troopships will have every reasonable provision for the health and comfort of soldiers at sea. The Mobile, for example, will be lighted with electricity atus to furnish pure water. There will be ample refrigerator room to keep meat and vegetables fresh. The messroom of the men will be so ar ranged that the tables can be folded against the walls and the room used as a gymnasium, for which puri

there will be proper apparatus.

The bunks will be supplied with mattresses as well as blankets and may be folded against the sides of the ship, affording a roomy promenade. These quarters will be provided with bathrooms. The ship will be fitted with a hospital having seventy-six cots. The hospital will have a complete dispensary, an operating room and at least two bathrooms. There will be an open-air promenade for the men and awnings to protect invalids while taking an airing. There will be accommodations for eighty form officers and a bathroom for about every twenty of them. Among the vessels to undergo this transformation are the Michigan, Mississippi, Manitoba, Massachusetts and Minnewaska. The steamship Mohegan lies in ten fathons of water off the Manacies, not far from he Lizard. Only her funnel and her fore nast can be seen.

A rigid inquiry will be made by the Board of Trade to fix the reponsibility for the disaster. The Mohegan, formerly the Cleopatra, is a steel hulled vessel of 4070 gross and 3351 et tons. She is 376.6 feet long, has a beam of 44.9 feet and a depth of hold of 0.2 feet. She is a single screw vessel with triple expansion engines of 772 nominal horse power. The Mohegan has most elaborate interior arrangements. She was built for comfort rather than speed. The vessel was fitted for a limited number of voyagers, as she was intended more as heavy freight carrier than as a passen-
