TRUCK MEN BLOWN DOWN
Twelve Laborers Killed Just Outside of Jersey City.

FOG AND SMOKE RESPONSIBLE.
A Pennsylvania Railroad Express Dashed into a Gang of Laborers—The Men Did Not See the Train and Their Lives Were Crushed Out Without Warning—A Terrible Scene.

Jersey City, N.J., (Special).—In the heavy fog which settled over the Hackensack meadows Friday morning the Milwaukee express train on the Pennsylvania Railroad moved down a gang of track laborers near the meadow shops, killing nine men outright, mortally injuring three, and slightly wounding three. The men all lived in Jersey City.

The list of killed and wounded is as follows: Killed—Frank Bostick, Thomas Dougherty, Joseph Kornitsky, Michael Lawrence, N. Lucio, F. Lukasi, A. Paris, Frank Radinski, Frank Stimanaki, Frank Swanson, Joseph Tolmie, unidentified man. Wounded—Lawrence Hoffman, Michael Miller, head cut, and one man unable to go home. The accident occurred about 8 o'clock. The men were in charge of Section Foreman William Quirk, and were making repairs on track No. 4. There were twenty men on the job. Fog and smoke hid the train from the men. The train was moving at a fast rate when it struck the men. The men were crushed and killed. The train was stopped and the men were taken to the hospital. The scene was a terrible one.

NEW YORK FOR PORTAGE STAMPS.
