BISSELL BUILDING BURNED.
ANOTHER BUSINESS BLOCK WITH ITS CONTENTS DESTROYED.
Fire Started by an Oil Stove—Good Work by Firemen—South End Aid Men Gave Prompt Aid—The Loss and Insurance.

YALE'S NEW PRESIDENT.
Shall Dr. Dwight's Successor Be a Minister?
The Succession of a Layman Who is a Man of Affairs Favored by Many Undergraduates and Graduates. Changed Purpose of the Institution Since It Was Founded Two Hundred Years Ago.

It had been known for some time that he would wait until the coming bi-centennial of the university to take that step. His resignation, therefore, was a surprise to many of the graduates and friends of the university and to the corporation itself.
