

WASHINGTON, D. C. (Special) .- Adjutant-General Corbin has issued the preliminary orders providing for the muster-out of fifty housand volunteers within a month. This action marks the final passing of the volunteer army, called into existence for the war with Spain, as it will terminate the existence of practically all of those regiments furnished by the States which are now distributed among the Southern camps, as seats in the House was adopted. The decision to dispense with all the remaining volunteers except about 22,000, temporarily required beyond the boundaries of the United States, was definitely

Adjutant-General Corbin is confident that the muster-out of fifty volunteer regiments will be accomplished by the end January, the promptness being due to the fact that the mustering-out organization is now thoroughly experienced, and can proceed with great rapidity.
