The Spanish flag was raised over St. Joe's log fort, some guns were fired in honor of "his most catholic majesty" and then Don Engenio and his band, loaded with fars and skins, hurried southward, to give no further thought to their "conquest." But two years later the Spaniards of Madrid bethought themselves of the incident and warmly
