The World's Population Increasing. Even in uncivilized parts of the world there is conclusive evidence that population is increasing. The black races of Africa are the most prolific of human beings. A district may be wasted and most of its inhabitants killed, but in ten or fifteen years the devastated region is as thickly populated as ever. Some of the most de structive native wars in this century have been waged in the region behind Lagos, on the Upper Guinea coast, but this district, as large as New York State, is now more densely peopled than any other part of Africa except the lower Nile Valley. The Chinese have demonstrated how vast a population, mainly agricultural, may be supported in a comparatively small area; and in China, as in some other densely peopled regions, the population has nereased with perhaps peculiar rapidity, because of its enjoyment of comparative immunity from epidemics of lisease. - New York Sun.


