SOAP AND PAINT MINES.

Valuable Deposits of Both Commodities in the Ground of the Northwest. A natural soop mine and a paint mine are two of the latest mineral discoveries in the Northwest. Several soda lakes bave been found in the footbills near Ashcroft, B. C. Their bottoms and shores are incrusted with a natural washing compound, containing borax and soda. No two analyses agree exactly as to the composition of the material. A New York analysis gives 26 per cent, borax, while a Montreal chemist, from the same sample gives 16 per cent, borax. An Ottawa analysis showed only a trace of borax. Tests prove the substance to be equal to the washing powders in common 45% use for cleansing purposes.
