How to Preserve Gooseherries, A delicious preparation of gooseberries is made by gathering them before they are quite ripe on a sunny, dry day. Put into dry bottles that have been scalded, cork loosely and place in a pau of cold water. Put the pau on the fire and allow it to heat slowly. but not boil. As soon as the berries look white take the pan from the fire, but leave the bottles to cool in the water. When cold, fasten hermetically and put away in a cool, dry place.

A Way of Testing Eggs. The old method of testing eggs by a candle is a relic of the days of the tallow dip, but a similar process of discovering their condition is still employed. If when held before the light the contents of the shell are clear, the egg is fresh; if opaque, it is stale, and if a black speck is visible it is unfit

The best way to cook an egg is to put it into cold water and stand on a hot stove. Just before the water boils the egg is "soft boiled," and the white and yoke will be found to be evenly cooked. 
