ABOUT 700 LOOMS Idle Today and 300 Weavers Are Out. A Slight Hitch in the Program Which May Be Overcome.

FOR SOME TIME past there has been trouble brewing among the white silk weavers in the Cheney mills here, owing to the fact that the looms have been speeded up considerably.

After getting all the looms in the 'Garden' up to the proper speed the method was applied to the looms in charge of John Wright, in what is known as the 'Middle Mill'.

On starting up this morning it was found that the men and women who are employed as white silk weavers in the north mill, familiarly known as 'Castle Garden,' and in charge of Wm. Wright refused to go to work.
