CAPT. HICKEY HEARD FROM. EXTRACTS FROM A PRIVATE LETTER TO HIS FAMILY HERE THROW SOME LIGHT UPON HOW OUR SOLDIER BOYS ARE 'ROUGHING IT' IN THE PHILIPPINES.

In Spite of His Enforced Mode of Life Captain Hickey Writes That He Never Felt Better in His Life. The Letter Was Written On Thanksgiving Day and Reached Here Last Week.

"We have just returned to Jaro, after a march of twenty-one days. We left Jaro on the night of November 8 and have been on the road ever since."

In our long march we covered about one hundred and eighteen miles. We were practically shut out from the rest of the world, no mail or papers, nothing, simply tramp, tramp. This means that instead of selling cotton to the West for eight cents a pound the South is selling it, as a manufactured product, at from 18 to 30 cents a pound.
