MILITARY AND NAVAL FUNERAL.

The funeral of Frank A. Bjorkland will take place from the Street-B Lithuanian church next Sunday afternoon at 3 o'clock, providing that the remains of Private Popple do not reach here from New York before that time. Company G, C. N. G. will act as escort to the body, as will also a squad of nine or ten men from the Naval Reserves of the State of Connecticut. Gunner's Mate Bjorkland will thus be buried with both military and naval honors. Interment will be in the East cemetery.

In the event of the arrival of Private Popple's remains before the time named above, the Bjorkland funeral will take place at 10 a. m., instead of at 3 p. m. This is owing to the fact that Company G voted to act as escort at the Popple funeral, before Bjorkland died. The cause of the uncertainty about the arrival of Private Popple's remains, is that there was yellow fever on board the ship that brought the Popple remains from Cuba, and the vessel is held at quarantine in New York lower bay.

BODY OF LIEUTENANT WARD CHENEY.

The body of Lieutenant Ward Cheney of the Fourth Infantry, who was killed at Imau, Island of Luzon, in the Philippines, is expected to arrive at San Francisco in about a week on the transport Sherman. Lieutenant flatted Dorey, also of the Fourth Infantry, is a passenger on the Sherman, coming home on sick leave. He was a classmate of Lieutenant Shermanwood Cheney, who is now in the Philippines, and was a personal friend of Ward Cheney. Lieutenant Dorey will come to South Manchester with the funeral party before going to his own home. Captain John Davenport Cheney of South Manchester, brother of Lieutenant Ward Cheney, started for San Francisco on Wednesday, accompanied by Mr. Norman Hope of Hartford, in order to be there on the arrival of the transport Sherman.

The new 40-foot trolley car was placed in service on the cross town line yesterday afternoon and an experienced man from the factory where the car was made was in charge of the front end, teaching Humphrey Shurtleff how to manage the new devices by which the brakes are applied. 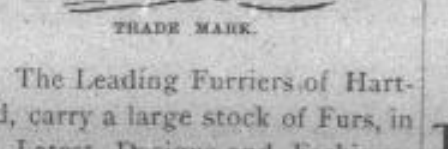

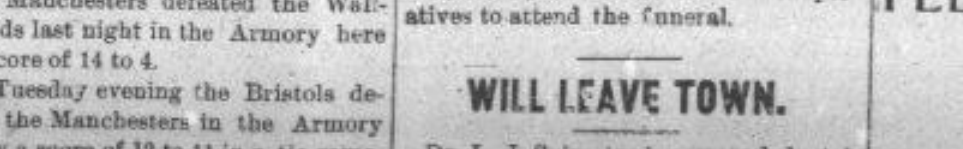
